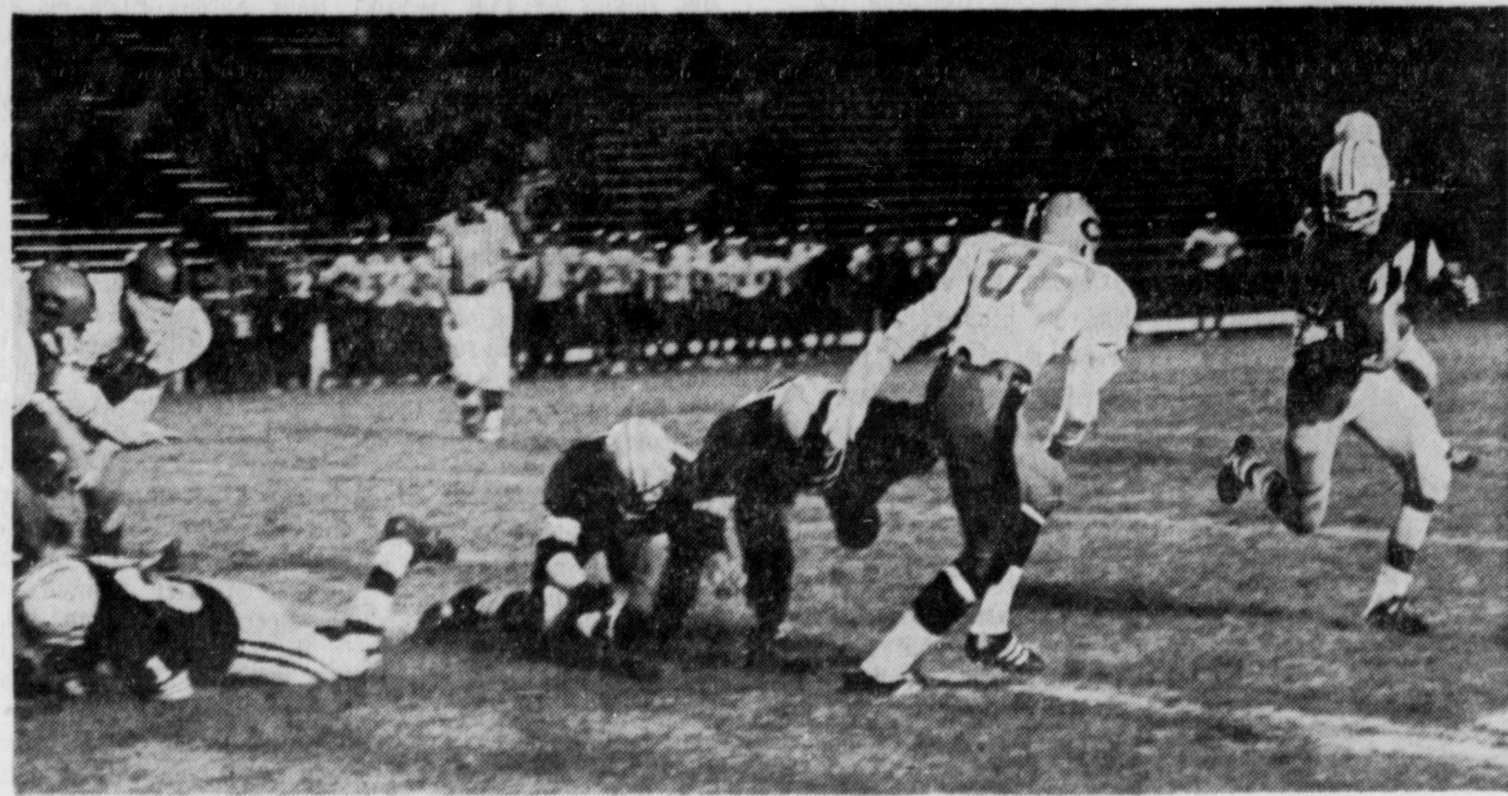
Kennedy high school completely dominated the last nine minutes Friday night at Kingston stadium to score a 14-6 football victory over Clinton and claim a share of the early lead in the Mississippi Valley conference race.

"Any win is a good one," explained Coach Dale Tryon "but there were several things about this one that really pleased me.

"First, we established a running game in the last quarter and, second, we did a fine job in the secondary on pass defense. Clinton is a good passing team and we limited them to two completions in 16 attempts."

Tryon was also pleased with the return of Mark Votrubaek, who hadn't played since the opening loss to Prairie.

Votrubaek started out alternating with Kent Switzer,

The criss-cross never worked better for the Prairie Hawks Friday night as they rolled past Benton Community 37-2 in an ECI conference game at Prairie.

Three times the state's 14th ranked prep squad used the criss-cross play, which Coach Red Leidigh called "just a basic play", to score touchdowns and run away from Benton for their fourth straight win of the year.

"We looked sharp in the first quarter," said Leidigh, "but after that we were real spotty until the reserves got into the game."

Leidigh isn't exactly what you would call wrong about the first quarter either. Prairie took the opening kickoff and on the first scrimmage play Dennis Lytle ran 29 yards to the Benton 40.

On the second play quarterback Jeff Leidigh gave the ball to Lytle again but this time Lytle handed off to halfback Jon Brase who raced 40 yards off Benton's right tackle for the first Prairie score.

After recovering a fumble to stop a Benton drive on their own 12 the Hawks moved to the Benton 49 where Leidigh called the criss-cross again. This time Brase took the first handoff and Lytle sprinted 49 yards around the left side of the Benton line.

After three straight shutouts losses the Lions played even with Iowa City the first quarter as they tied 0-0 and scored for the first time this year in the third quarter when Phil Polzin tossed to Randy Northway for a 70 yard touchdown.

Linn-Mar added a second touchdown in the third quarter when Polzin scored from the three after Jim Westcott had picked off a Regina pass and returned it to the seven.

Regina's 35 points in the second quarter, however, were too much for Linn-Mar. Steve Condon dashed off tackle for a 21-yard score, Pat Lynch ran 10 for another, Mike Kennedy scored on an intercepted pass from the 36, Chuck Jensen caught a 74-yard pass for a touchdown, and John Eckermann returned an intercepted pass for 20 yards.

Wayne Frantz scored from the three and Condon went for 15 yards for another. Regina quarterback Kennedy went over from the one to round out the winner's scoring.

Linn-Mar was forced to punt 10 times and could muster only two first downs while gaining 154 total yards to Regina's 405.
