DUBUQUE—Dubuque Hempstead, rated near the bottom of the Mississippi Valley conference and without a Valley win in its three years of existence, upset Cedar Rapids Washington, the Valley's pre-season top-rated team, 25-12 here Friday night.

Led by sophomore quarterback Tom McLaughlin, the upstart Hempstead squad built a 19-0 lead before the Warriors could get on the scoreboard late in the third period on a 61-yard run by Greg Witwer.

McLaughlin, who alternated with junior Mike Matz, plunged for two touchdowns and hit Jeff Pape on passes of two and 60 yards for the other two Hempstead scores.

McLaughlin and Matz directed a six-play scoring sequence in the first quarter after a 33-yard punt and a 15-yard penalty against the Warriors gave Hempstead the ball on Wash's 27 yard line.

The two quarterbacks took turns hitting Mike Weber on passes of eight and seven yards before McLaughlin went over from the one.

On the following kickoff Wash's Jim Conkling fumbled, Hempstead recovered and used 12 plays to up its lead to 13-0. A nine-yard run by McLaughlin and a Matz to Mike Schetgen pass of 24 yards helped set up a two-yard scoring pass from McLaughlin to Pape.

In the third period Hempstead stopped a Warrior drive at the 29, taking over on downs. McLaughlin ran 11 yards to the 40 on the first play and then hit Pape with a 60-yard bomb for a 19-0 margin.

On the next series Witwer broke loose and scampered 61 yards to put Wash in the scoring column for the first time.

Hempstead moved out to a 25-6 edge with 11:33 to go in the final quarter when McLaughlin capped another 12-play drive with a one-yard plunge for the score.

Wash's James Bassett, who was a doubtful player because of a sprained ankle, ran 10 yards for the final score with a punt return gave Wash the ball on the Dubuque 10.

The two Hempstead quarterbacks, McLaughlin and Matz, combined to complete 14 of 21 passes for 153 yards. Wash's QBs managed to complete just eight of 20 for 63 yards.

Hempstead joined the Valley last year and went winless in its first grid season in the conference. The school has won just one other game in its three-year history.

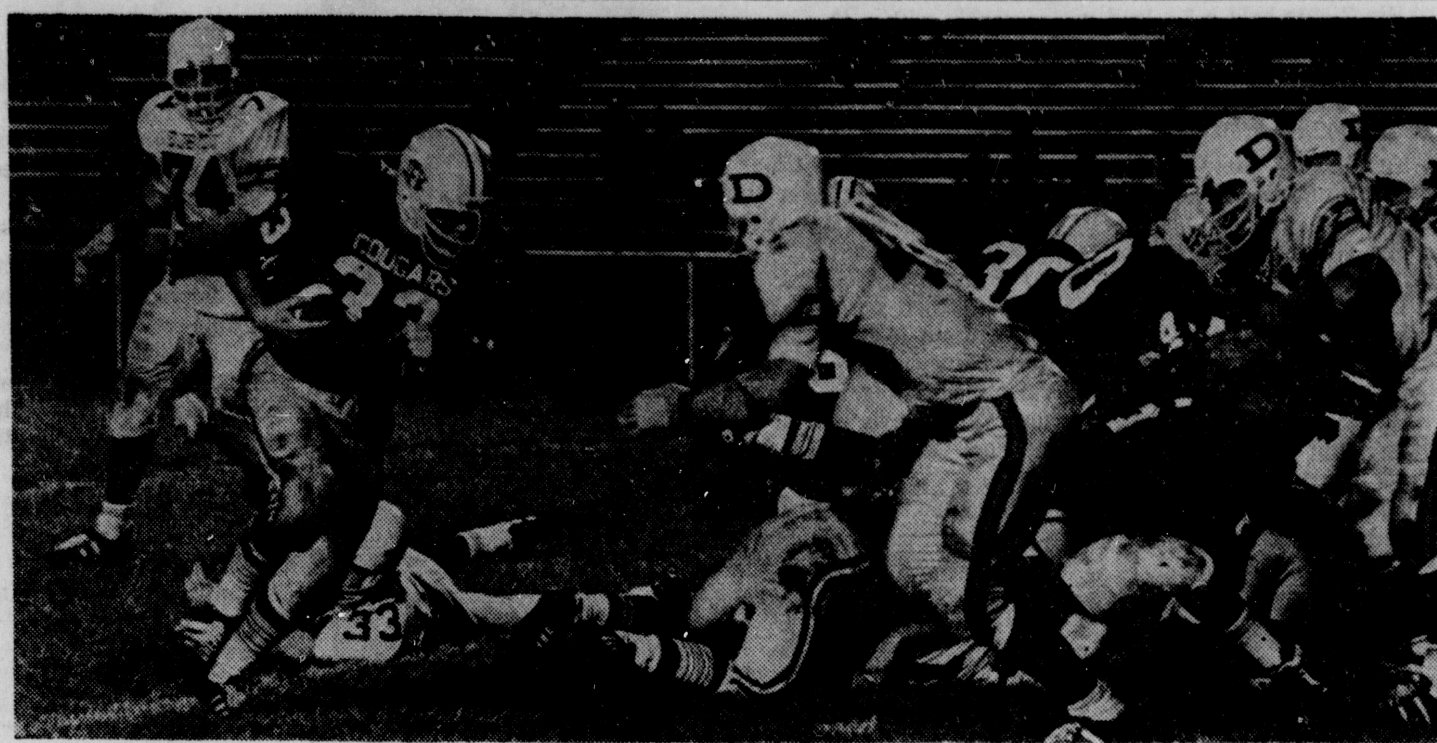
