

Warriors Throttle Clinton 13-6

"For of all sad words of tongue or pen, the saddest are these: It might have been."

The words of John Greenleaf Whittier might have been in the mind of Coach Wally Sheets

after his Washington high football team closed out the 1971 season with a 13-6 win over Clinton Friday night at Kingston stadium.

It was the fifth straight Mississippi Valley conference win

for the Warriors, who were the pre-season pick to walk off with the championship.

A dismal start, in which Wash dropped its first two league games before tying another, squelched that possibility. Nevertheless, the Warriors rebounded to finish the campaign in fourth place with a 5-2-1 mark. The only loss in the final six games was in a non-conference meeting with Cedar Rapids Regis.

Wash's defense shut off Clinton's ground game in the second half to pave the way for Friday's victory. After picking up 70 yards rushing in the first half, the River Kings managed only a net of six after intermission.

"We didn't make any changes—we just hit better in the second half," said Sheets. "We may have used a stacked defense more, but I think it was just a matter of our players doing a better job the second half."

Wash logged 134 yards on the ground with senior fullback James Bassett doing most of the toting.

The 5-11, 198-pounder blasted his way for 127 yards in 25 carries and scored the clinching touchdown on a one-yard smash with 3:04 left in the third quarter.

Bassett's longest run was a 45-yarder to move the ball to the Clinton eight at the close of the third quarter. However, the Warriors mustered only three yards in four plays and Clinton took over on downs at the five.

Senior end Craig Collins

also sparked for the Warriors. Collins, the league's premier receiver, latched on to four aeriels for 73 yards. Craig's biggest gainer was a 45-yarder from quarterback Matt Fletcher which produced a 6-6 tie at the 5:25 mark in the second quarter.

Dave Diehl broke the tie with a kick that split the uprights.

Diehl, a 205-pound defensive tackle, also came up with a big

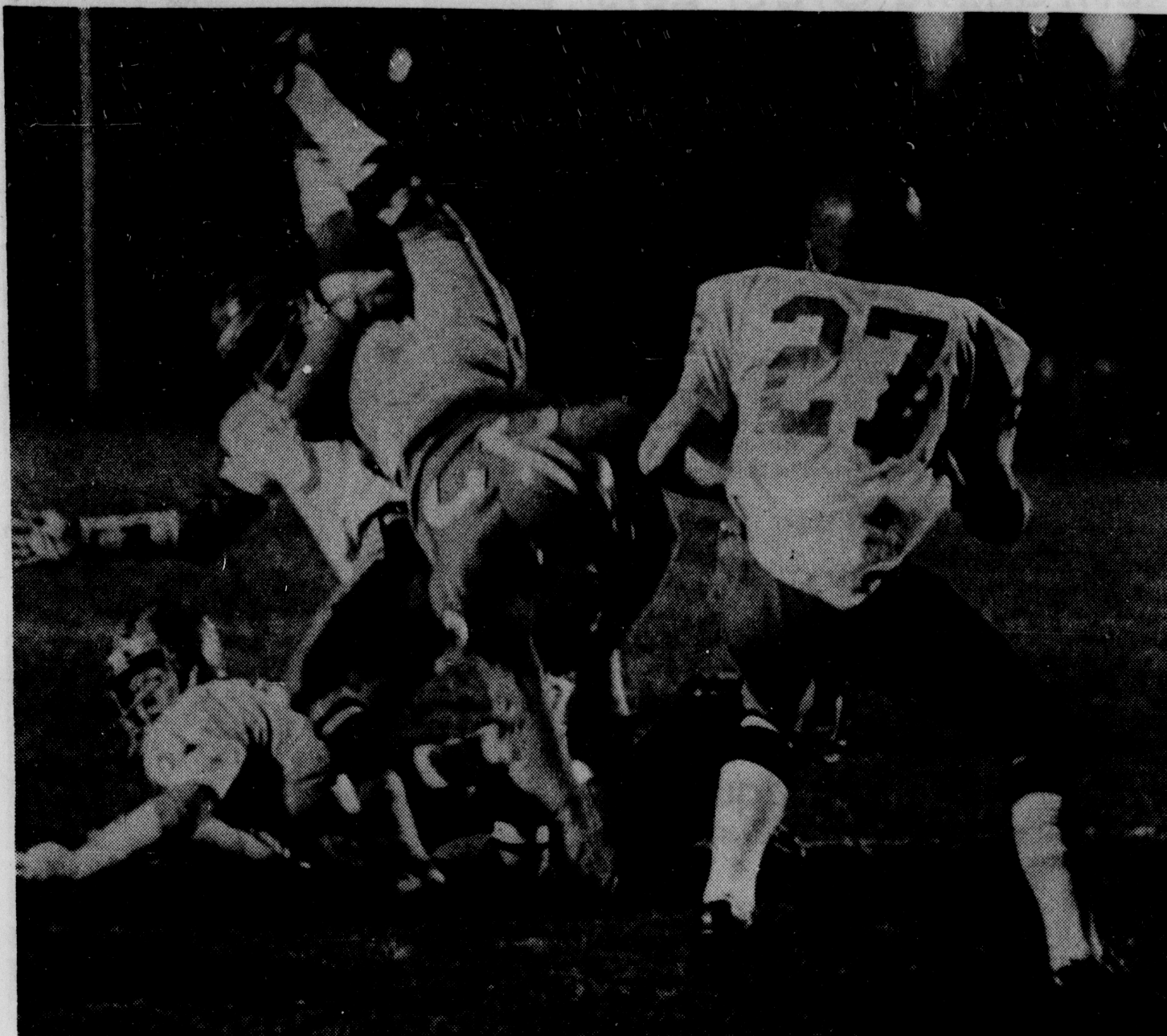

Bettendorf got briefly back into the game with a 60-yard touchdown pass from Guffey to Randy Blake, but the Cougars then marched 73 yards in 17 plays with Larry Covington going over from the one for the first of his three touchdowns.

Baranowski carried on 11 of those plays.

Tony stole the limelight from Bettendorf's outstanding runner, David Schick. Schick, the Valley's leading rusher, did manage 103 yards, but much of it came late in the final Bettendorf TD drive.

Schick came into the game as the all-time one year rushing leader in the Quad Cities with 1,359 yards.

He upped that total to 1,462. Friday, Schick was dumped for losses on two occasions and held without gain four other times.

There was plenty to smile about for the Cedar Rapids Cougars when Friday, but Coach Mauren seemed most pleased with Murdock's fine touchdown punt return.

"We've worked on that all year," he confided, "but this is the first time we've made it go."

No. 3 Heelan Stuns No. 2 Dowling 18-6

The second longest winning streak in Iowa prep football history ended Friday when third-ranked Sioux City Heelan downed No. 2 Des Moines Dowling 18-6.

Heelan's decisive victory ended Dowling's victories at 44 in a row and quashed the Maroons' unbeaten streak at 47 straight.

Dowling's 44 straight victories equal the record turned by Ankeny between 1932 and 1938 and is 10 behind the current record held by five-time mythical champion Waterloo East.

Top-ranked East closes its season tonight against cross-town rival Waterloo West and could extend its state record winning and unbeaten strings.

"The better ball club won tonight," said Dowling coach Jim Williams after the rugged defensive match before an overflow crowd of 8,500 in Sioux City.

"They did the things we normally do," added Williams. "They really stuck it to us tonight."

"It was a case of us knowing what we had to do and going out and doing it," said Heelan coach Beanie Cooper.

"And I don't think this was a fluke victory on our part," added Cooper whose team finished 9-0 and avenged a 12-3 defeat at the hands of Dowling last year that tarnished an otherwise unbeaten season.

Dowling finished 8-1 on the season leaving Heelan and Waterloo East (8-0) the state's only two unbeaten Class AAAA schools.
