One of Martin's TDs came on a 41-yard scamper and delivered the defensive play of the game to quash Kennedy's only real offensive threat of the evening.

Cougar quarterback Tracy Crocker had completed passes of nine, three and eight yards to Mike Hartman just into the second quarter to move his team to the Regis 46, but Martin ruined the march when he stepped in front of a short flick intended for Brian Coffin on a delay pattern coming out of the backfield.

Martin picked off the throw and bolted 65 yards to paydirt. He finished with 130 yards in 15 carries, but went to the bench early in the third quarter after running

The dandy senior has now gained 684 yards in 100 carries and has scored 70 points. The state's other premier running back, Kelly Ellis of Waterloo West, gained 161 vards in 12 carries in a 19-0 win over Cedar Falls Thursday and has 593 yards in 54 trips this year. He's scored 48 points.

Regis limited Kennedy to just 42 yards rushing (only five in the first half) and the big reason the Cougar offense was as private as Birch Bayh's presidential try was the play of tackle Matt Pe-

The 6-7, 235-pounder made several tackles at the line of scrimmage and caught four runners for losses. The mammoth tackle's confrontation with Kennedy's all-state candidate didn't come off though.

We had planned to dog Martin with Ty Payton all night, that was our game plan," said Reed, "but during a contact drill Tuesday, Ty got a good rap on the head and we had to hold him out.

The Rams are No. 1 in total offense (432.6 yards a game) and second in passing offense (238.6) and scoring offense(-42.0). Another Iowa school, Buena Vista, leads in scoring offense (44.3). St. John's of Minnesota, av-

eraging 428.5 yards a game is listed on the NCAA chart as the top offensive team.

In addition, sophomore tailback Chris Hipsley's 54 points is also best in Division three. Hipsley has scored six touchdowns and kicked 18 extra points.

Andy Brinkman is tied for fourth in pass receiving (six catches per game) and Aaron Van Dyke of Mt. Vernon is fifth in total offense, averag-

Sellout 59,000 To See Iowa

The "exhibition games," as Woody Hayes used to call 'em, are out of the way for both clubs and a capacity audience of 59,000 will gather to see if Iowa has any kind of chance to end its long drouth against mighty Ohio State.

Woody will look much the same, but his Buckeyes will bring a record that is tackier than usual. Ohio State has a 2-1-1 record: A 49-21 romp over Michigan State, a 12-7 graze past Penn State, a 22-21 last-second loss to Missouri and a 10-10 tie with unbeaten UCLA.

All of which means Iowa Coach Bob Commings has only two worries for Saturday, right? Yup, just offense and

The Hawks have lost 11 straight times to Ohio State. Last Iowa victory was 28-14 in 1962. Ohio State leads the series by a prohibitive 24-10-

Iowa's record is 2-2, which is one game better than any Hawkeye fan dared hope last summer. But a mere recitation of the won-lost mark conceals the dimensions of Iowa's 55-0 landslide defeat at USC last Saturday night.

That must have registered a plus-seven on the Richter scale at Cal Tech, and its rethe Hawkeyes both physical-

ly and mentally. Two Iowa freshman reserves were knocked out for the season: Tackle Herlyn USC contest, apparently has Harrington with torn knee igaments and wingack Jesse "Road Runner" Cook with a broken hand.

Two key senior starters, Butch Caldwell and Jim Caldwell, are on the iffy list, but Butch's twisted knee has improved during the week and doctors have okayed him to play quarterback Saturday. Commings has QBs that pass better than Butch, but none who can run with his threat.

Jim Caldwell (no relation), co-captain and dependable cornerback, may play but is not running well on an ankle that was twisted at USC. Indeed, Iowa's secondary is pretty well banged up, perhaps inviting the Buckeyes to test their atrophied passing game if needed.

Butch is one of six Hawkeyes from Ohio who will start Saturday, so the game means something special to them. Others are tight end Tom Grine, wingback Dennis Mosley, tailback Ernie Sheeler, linebacker Dean Moore and strong safety Chuck Danzy. In addition, Ohioans Tim Gutshall and Mario Pace are likely to play, too.

And the Buckeyes? Although some of their super stars looked dinged a bit in the TV tie with UCLA, the full cast is expected to perform if needed. Funny how that phrase "if needed" keeps popping up, but the Bucks are a prohibitive favorite despite a comparison of how the two teams did against their only common foe, Penn State.

Pete Johnson, the 247pound senior fullback who already scored 45 TDs in 31/2 seasons (including three Rose Bowl games), will play Sherman tank again on two puffy ankles. Also in action will be three big defensive linemen, Nick Buonamici (sprained toe), Aaron Brown (sprained ankle) and Eddie Beamon (sprained ankles). Defensive back Bruce Ruhl is the only Buckeye regular who will miss it, but he was out for the UCLA game, too.

Woody hasn't taught QB Rod Gerald much passing so far, but Iowa can recall that last year his predecessor,






