

Ready to fire

VAN HORNE - The old tradition that "Benton Community can't be a winner" literally went up in flames on the sideline Friday night after the Bobcats' 21-0 victory over Grundy Center.

With the victory, young coach Reese Morgan's team gave Benton Community its first unblemished regular-season record at 9-0, and its first post-season berth, opposite second-ranked Fairfield in firstround Class 3A play here Wednes-

The Bobcats last week bagged their first East Central Iowa Conference championship.

What went up in flames in the symbolic sideline ritual Friday night, Morgan explained, was "a piece of paper I was handed when I

took this job three years ago. On it even better defensive team. were written the five barriers we had to overcome to make this a winning program.

"I told the players this week that if we won tonight, we'd burn that paper, we'd burn the old tradition that Benton Community can't be a winner.'

To achieve that, the Bobcats reversed the shutout magic Grundy Center had used on seven previous opponents this fall. Grundy Center had been scored upon only in its lone loss, 22-10 to top-ranked Hud-

"We're awfully proud of the courage and desire our kids displayed," Morgan said. "It was a great win for them, the school, and the community.

"Grundy Center is an excellent defensive team, just excellent." But Benton Community was an

The Bobcat defenders not only limited Grundy Center to 85 yards in total offense, they were responsible for the first two Benton Community touchdowns.

On the third play of the second period, the first of cornerback Bill Boies' two one-handed interceptions gave the Bobcats the ball at the Grundy Center 6. Workhorse fullback Wade King nudged over from the 1 four plays later.

Kevin Hook ad-libbed Benton Community's final score with 2:16 left in the third period.

Errors were the name of the game Friday as Cedar Rapids Prairie pounced on several early Linn-Mar turnovers and captured a 27-6 victory from the Lions in the final game of the season for both squads.

Running back Scott Joens scored all four Prairie TDs, including one on a third-quarter 35-yard jaunt with an interception, as the Hawks closed out the regular season with their third consecutive victory. Prairie finished 1-4 in the East Central Iowa Conference and 4-5 on the year. Linn-Mar, 1-8 overall, woundup 0-5 in the ECIC.

The contest was only three plays old when Lion quarterback Craig Connington had a short pass to the near sideline picked off by Prairie's Bret Wagner who returned the ball 10 yards to Linn-Mar's 25 yard line. "We should've scored three more touchdowns because we were inside their 10 yard line that often, and that was a disappointment to us. But I was happy with our defense. It was the best pass rush we've had all year, and Scott Douglas, Dennis Bruns and Sam Wilson

Douglas and Bruns are both underclassmen, but that's nothing unusual for Prairie. Oertel said his squad is largely composed of juniors. Among the others who will return to the team next fall are Joens, a 6-1, 185-pounder, and running back Jim Porter, who ran for 46 yards on five carries versus the Lions. Reserve quarterback Curt Woods is back, as is defensive back


