# Kennedy stumbles, 28-6

CEDAR FALLS - A near-perfect first half brought Cedar Falls a 28-6 nonconference victory over Cedar Rapids Kennedy in the second game of a prep football double-header Friday night in the UNI-Dome.

After recovering a Scott Owens fumble at its own 48, Cedar Falls drove to its first touchdown on nine plays, scoring on Doug Svobodny's 15yard pass to Jim Pedersen.

Nick Winkey's one-yard plunge capped an 80yard Cedar Falls drive to its second score with 27 seconds left in the first period. That 12-play series included a 25-yard Svobodny-to-Pedersen

Svobodny's 27-yard pass to Steve Goodwin and 16-yard throw to Mike Griffith sparked a 60yard Cedar Falls thrust to a third TD 20 seconds before the half. Goodwin scored it on a two-yard pass from Svobodny.

Kennedy drove to the Cedar Falls eight following the second-half kickoff, but Owens and quarterback Brad Sleep lost seven yards each on successive plays to end that threat.

The Cougars' Jon Bredeson subsequently returned a punt 14 yards to the Cedar Falls 36. and on the next play Sleep hit Bredeson for

Kennedy's lone score. Cedar Falls collected its final points after Kennedy faked a punt, Sleep's pass failed, and the Cougars gave up the ball at their own 49.

Passes from Svobodny to John Downs for 14 and 11 yards, followed by Griffith's 19 yards on two rushes, set up Griffith's three-yard run for

Kennedy drove from midfield to the Cedar Falls nine with two minutes to play, but Sleep lost a fumble there.

Cedar Falls finished 7-2, Kennedy 4-5.

# Jeff blanks City High in finale

IOWA CITY - Cedar Rapids Jefferson dominated hapless Iowa City High, 27-0, in the season finale for both teams Friday night.

The loss was the fifth straight for City High, which finished 1-8. Jefferson finished 6-3. The J-Hawks scored first on Dean Miller's 82-

yard punt return with 39 seconds left in the first period. With three minutes gone in the third period, Mark Reggentin intercepted City High quarter-

back Chuck Holbrook's pass and took it 28 yards

After Pat Robinson recovered a City High fumble at the Little Hawk 12, Jefferson's Steve Wise went three yards to score three minutes into the fourth quarter.

The J-Hawks chalked up their final tally on Dave Bishop's three-yard run 36 seconds before
