Michigan and Ohio State in rushing offense (206.7), ninth in passing offense (155.5) and seventh in total

offense (362.2). every defensive category, ranking second against the run (77.2), seventh against the pass (262.0), fourth in total defense (339.2) and third in scoring defense (18.0). Iowa has allowed seven touchdowns in conference games, Illinois 19.

Five Illinois receivers have caught 20 passes or more, with the leader being Mike Martin. He has 46 catches for 719 yards and three TDs. Tight end Tim Brewster is next with 32 receptions for 419 yards.

Phillips leads Iowa in receiving (21 for 176) as well as rushing. The Chicago junior ranks fourth in league rushing with an average of 104 yards per game, and needs to average 107 over the last four games to join Dennis Mosley in Iowa's 1,000-yard club.

Eason shared the Big Ten Offensive Player of the Week award last week with teammate Mike Bass, as both were instrumental in the 29-28 win over Wisconsin.

Bass, the son of San Diego Chargers defensive coordinator Tom Bass, kicked five field goals against the Badgers - including a 46-yard game-winner as time expired. He is 18-for-21 in field goal attempts for

Iowa and Illinois are alike in that they have excelled in close games. The Hawkeyes have won all three of their games decided by five points The Hawkeyes have an edge in or less. Illinois is 3-1 in games decided by a TD or less, losing to Ohio State and defeating Michigan State, Purdue and Wisconsin.

The improvement has been mainly on offense. We've been pretty consistent on defense.'

That defense is currently ranked No. 1 in the Big Eight and fifth in the nation.

Offensively, the Cyclones are third in the league, averaging 379.3 yards a game. Most of that has come from a balanced running attack, paced by Tommy Davis, Harold Brown and Jason Jacobs. Davis and Jacobs both had more than 100 yards in last week's 31-14 victory over Colorado.

But, ISU showed an ability to throw the ball in that game, too, as quarterback David Archer connected on 16 of 24 passes for 249 vards.

Of course, in past seasons, encounters with Kansas State weren't anything to fret much about anyway. That has changed.

K-State, buoyed by the return of 26 starters (we'll explain that in a minute), also has rolled to a 4-2-1 record this season and seems headed toward its best record since the middle '50s. Its only winning season since then came in 1970 when it was 6-5.

The Wildcats thumped Kansas, 36-7, last week and feature an experienced and opportunistic defense. They currently lead the nation in turnover margin, having forced 29 turnovers while giving the ball away only 12 times themselves.

Turnovers, in fact, seem to be the biggest reason for the Wildcats' success this season. Their offense ranks sixth in the Big Eight and their defense ranks fourth.

As in the case of the Cyclones, the ground attack has been the focal point of the offense. Tailback Mark Hundley, who collected 109 yards in the Wildcats' 10-7 victory over ISU last season, has been the leader again this season with 326 yards and four touchdowns.

But four other backs — Iosefatu Faraimo, Charles Crawford, Pete Brown and Greg Dageforde — all have 100 yards or more this season. Dageforde reinjured his shoulder against Kansas and will not play

Saturday but fullback Kilisimasi Toluao is expected to return to action after an ankle injury. Toluao had 80 yards against ISU last year.

The offensive triggerman is quarterback Darrell Dickey, an average but effective passer. The top receivers are split end Mike Wallace and flanker Eric Mack.

Defensively, everything centers around right tackle Reggie Singletary, a 266-pound junior with All-America credentials.

"It seems like the chemistry on this ball team is just right," said fifth-year coach Jim Dickey. "Everyone really gets along and they think about each other. That's a very important part of having a winning season.

And, oh yes, how does a team return 26 starters?

Dickey, in a highly-publicized and boldly-conceived move, redshirted 16 of his best players last season, hoping to concentrate his strength into this season's team. Thus, many of those returning starters were regulars in 1980, not
