

IOWA CITY — Cedar Rapids Jefferson won its first and last football game of the season Friday night, rolling to an easy 42-7 victory over outmanned Iowa City West.

The J-Hawks controlled the line on both offense and defense against the smaller Trojan line.

Offensively, Jefferson was able to move the ball at will stacking up more than 400 yards total offense.

Defensively, Jefferson snuffed drive after drive, allowing West only five first downs. Two of those came as a result of penalties.

"This is the way it has been all year," said J-Hawk Coach Bill Calloway. "We're a good football team, but it has been a strange year."

Another senior, quarterback Marty Pearson, also had a good finale completing 7 of 16 passes for 190 yards and four touchdowns.

West's only score came in the third quarter when senior fullback Ben Eskin broke open off right tackle and galloped 57 yards for the touchdown.

Jefferson held the Trojans to less than 150 yards, forcing seven turnovers, including six interceptions. Eskin led the West offensive effort

with 87 yards on 13 carries. Jefferson sophomore halfback Randy Meier scored three touchdowns, one

coming on an 8-yard pass from Pearson and the other two on runs of 3 and 22

Jefferson took the lead on the first possession when Pearson hit Driscoll on a 51-yard bomb.

On the ensuing kickoff, the J-Hawks surprised West with an onside kick which kicker Mark Tiedtke recovered himself at the West 48.

One play later, Pearson found Driscoll open on the same play, this time for 43 yards, giving Jefferson a 13-0 lead after less than four minutes.

The J-Hawks piled up 250 yards total offense in the first half, most coming from the Pearson-Driscoll connection.

West's bright spot in the first half came when defensive back Carl Jackson made a spectacular touchdown-saving interception on a long pass from

The rest of the first half was pretty dismal for West. The Trojans were able to gain only 38 yards.

The J-Hawks' other score came when junior split end Jim Lockett made a diving catch of a Pearson pass in the end zone late in the third quarter.

Jefferson finished the year 1-7, 1-6 in the Mississippi Valley Conference. West finished 0-9 and 0-7.

Wash upsets No. 2 Hempstead

DUBUQUE — The Cedar Rapids Washington football team may want to schedule all of its games in Dubuque next season.






