## **lowa City West ends** 25-game loss streak

"But yes, it surely was a big win for our program," added Dickel, a former University of Iowa defensive standout (linebacker, 1971-73) who later went on to play professionally with the NFL's Baltimore Colts. "I guess I've been through this type of thing (losing streak) before, so I'm not going to get too excited about one win.

THE TROJANS, 1-1, were sparked by a pair of one-yard touchdown runs by quarterbacks Jason Ross and Phil Knoedel in the second quarter. But the biggest boost was an electrifying 89yard kickoff return by senior running back John Hesse to open the

That had to be a real deflator for Kennedy," Dickel said. "But at the same time, it was a shot in the arm for us."

Senior running back Gary Smith put the Cougars, 0-2 and losers of nine straight games, on the board with 6:15 to play in the first quarter when he scored on a one-yard plunge. Russell Blood's PAT kick gave Kennedy a short-lived, 7-0 lead.

West then stormed back in the second period.

Ross, a junior who split playing time with Knoedel, drove the Trojans 80 yards in 10 plays. He capped the march by sneaking the final yard for West's first TD with 6:59 to go in the quarter. Knoedel's pass attempt for the two-point conversion fell incomplete.

The two teams exchanged punts before Trojan junior linebacker Jeff Ostrander pounced on a fumble by Kennedy quarterback Brian Dixon at the Cougar 41.

Nine plays later, Knoedel, a senior, reached the end zone on a one-yard keeper and then passed to Hesse for two more points to give West a 14-7 at intermission.

HESSE TOOK THE third-quarter kickoff at his own 11, broke a few tackles and raced down the right sideline for West's final touchdown. The Trojans went on to post their first victory since Sept. 17, 1982, when they beat Muscatine 14-7, and their first conference win since Oct. 1981, a 14-9 win over Dubuque Senior. "They had everything to gain and nothing to lose," said Kennedy

coach Al Stiers. "They played well, relaxed. "This certainly isn't the only game West will win this season." Running back Devon Hess led the West offensive attack by

MANHATTAN, Kan. (AP) — Two football teams trying to kick the turnover habit will square off today when Northern Iowa visits Kansas

Turnovers doomed both teams in their openers last week. Northern Iowa coughed up four fumbles and two interceptions in a 24-9 loss to Drake. Kansas State also had six turnovers in an even more embarrassing setback, 16-10 to Wichita

Northern Iowa Coach Darrell Mudra said he's looking for a much sharper performance from his team in today's game.

"We have enough talent to play a good game and if we get the breaks, we could win the game," Mudra

said. "But we need to play better than last week, and hopefully we won't make those first-game mistakes.

While Mudra is under no pressure today because his team is the underdog, the same can't be said of Kansas State and Coach Jim Dickey. The Wildcats need to beat the Division I-AA Panthers if they're to retain any credibility in the Big 8 Conference this season.

'We've got to sell our squad that there are going to be upsets," said Dickey, who is under intense pressure to post a winning season in his eighth year in Manhattan.

We've been talking about the 30scholarship limit, and teams are playing fairly equal week after week. There are going to be upsets and we had one of ours early."

Dickey said he's gearing his troops to fend off a passing attack by Northern Iowa, which threw 47 times against Drake.

"They look like a wide-open offensive team that really likes to throw the ball," Dickey said. "They like to throw the ball 50 times a game. They were 9-2 last year and even though they lost last week, it will be a game we've got to get ready for."

Mudra said he'll stick with sophomore Mike Smith as his starting quarterback. Smith completed 17 of 36 passes for 188 yards against Drake and showed good scrambling ability when he was pressured.

# TV's bids for '88 Olympics rejected

LAUSANNE, Switzerland (AP) — Olympic organizers haven't found a bid they like from U.S. TV networks for the rights to televise the 1988 Olympic Games in Seoul, South

NBC apparently made the highest bid, but one that was considerably lower than anticipated by the International Olympic Committee.

The IOC, the Seoul Olympic Organizing Committee (SLOOC) and the three major American networks wouldn't comment on the size of the bids made during a 17hour bargaining session Thursday.

But sources who insisted on anonymity estimated that NBC's bid was about \$400 million, or \$100 million less than the reported minimum established by the SLOOC. Based on ABC's winning Alberta, the SLOOC had hoped for met with the committee. Both

bids of around \$700 million. ABC paid \$225 million for the

rights to broadcast the 1984 Olympics in Los Angeles. Despite the low bid, NBC was

apparently a front-runner for the contract because the IOC's television negotiating committee early today reopened talks with the NBC delegation, headed by sports chief Arthur Watson. Sources said the renewed talks were aimed at reaching a compromise figure that would satisfy the SLOOC

Watson later reported that "we have concluded our presentation," but gave no other indication of progress in the talks.

But hopes of a compromise appeared to have cooled when the CBS delegation, headed by Vice President for Sports Neal Pilson, and the bid of \$309 million to broadcast the ABC group, led by President for 1988 Winter Olympics in Calgary, Sports and News Roone Arledge,

Pilson and Arledge refused comment until after a news conference scheduled for later today by IOC President Juan Antonio Samaranch.

The news conference can't be delayed to allow for additional talks, IOC officials said, because Samaranch is due to fly to the United States later in the day to attend the signing of the U.S.-Soviet sports cooperation agreement in Indianapolis. Samaranch was not involved in the negotiations with the networks.

The six-member negotiating committee spent more than half of its bargaining time Thursday in internal debate involving the three IOC members and three SLOOC members, accompanied by their advisers.
