# Watkins has lowa ties, too


· You might say Travis Watkins. the freshman who should see duty as an Iowa wide receiver today, is your typical Californian.

He was born in Iowa Eddyville. His father was born in Eddyville, his mother in Chillecothe, Iowa, which is about six miles downstream on the Des Moines River. He said he still has a grandmother in Eddyville, a grandmother in Ottumwa and an aunt in Cedar Rapids.

His father attended Northern Iowa on football scholarship - as a wide receiver, too. He dropped out of school when Travis was born the only child.

"We moved to California when I was two or three years old," Watkins said. "I used to come back to Eddyville often — in the summer and at Christmas.'

Watkins' parents are divorced. He stayed with his father in Denver until he started high school, then


Petrzelka, an offensive lineman at Iowa State who prepped at Regis. "I was an Iowa fan for so long, and

still am a little bit." That's only natural, although ISU Coach Jim Criner doesn't want any "Go Hawks!" emanating from No. 74's 255-pound body today.


Matt, one of Anton's three brothers, lettered at Iowa for four years and captained the Hawks in 1980, Hayden Fry's second year on the job.

"I'm going to have some butterflies," Anton admits. "I have some friends who are still on the team. I still cheer for them a little bit.



# Sindlinger keeps Hawkeye tradition alive

IOWA CITY - Mark Sindlinger has snapped the football more than 2,000 times in his Iowa career, so it won't be a momentous occasion when he does so again today.

But it will mark an unusual anniversary for Hawkeve football.

It will represent the 10th straight season the Hawkeyes have had an Iowan as the starting center. Through three Hilgenberg brothers from Iowa City Jim, Jay and Joel — and now Sindlinger, Iowa has had nothing but home grown talent at the center of things for the past decade.

Sindlinger will start his 26th consecutive game today when Iowa and Iowa State clash at Kinnick Stadium. The 6-foot-1, 255-pound senior from Charles City has been an extremely durable player

— and largely underrated. "We always try to put our best offensive lineman at center," Iowa Coach Hayden Fry said. "The center has to have good quickness, speed and ability. Plus, unlike the other linemen, he has to snap the ball. He has to be a very intelligent player along with all that.

# Cool QB fires Regis past Wash

Some outstanding quarterbacks have suited up for the Regis High School football team over the years - Hank Ryan, Tim Stephenson, Steve Egger, Jeff Purdy, Mike Williams and John Lawrence, just to name a few.


You can add to that list the Royals' current signal caller, Mike McCool.

McCool fired three touchdown passes Friday night - including one apiece to twin brothers Mike and Pat Schulte — as Regis outgunned stubborn Washington, 29-18, in a prep thriller at Kingston Stadium.

The game marked the 19th and perhaps final time the two east side Metro rivals have met on the gridiron. The victory gave the Royals a 10-9 lead in the neighborhood series, which may be discontinued due to future scheduling conflicts by both schools.

If it was, indeed, the final such contest, it will not soon be forgot-

McCool, a crafty, strong-armed senior, completed 7 of 12 passes for 103 yards. His 41-yard scoring strike to halfback Mike Schulte combined with Mike McWhinney's PAT kick in the first quarter gave Regis a short-lived 7-6 lead. He later tossed TD passes of 11 and 14 yards

McCool's scoring pass to Traynor with 8:36 to play came on a crucial fourth-and-two situation with Regis trailing, 18-14. He rolled right to avoid a strong Warrior rush and looped a perfect throw to an uncontested Traynor in the corner of the end zone.

Moments later, McCool rifled a respectively, in the final period to short pass across the middle to Brian Hoefer for the two-point conversion and the Royals didn't look back.

> "THAT TOUCHDOWN really got our momentum going," a smiling McCool pointed out afterward. "Our defense really toughened up after that and we pretty much controlled things the rest of the way."

A fired-up Washington team, considered a heavy underdog going into the game, took a 6-0 lead on a three-yard touchdown run by Kevin Bjornsen with 3:29 to play in the first quarter. Bjornsen's second TD bolt, this time from four yards out with 34 seconds left in the first half, lifted the Warriors into a 12-7 advantage at intermission.

# Linn-Mar roars to 1st MVC win

It took Linn-Mar 15 seconds to say hello to the Mississippi Valley

It didn't take the Lions much longer to bid farewell to Cedar Rapids Kennedy.

Linn-Mar senior Mark Lancaster returned the opening kickoff 86 yards for a touchdown Friday night in the Lions' 37-7 win over Kennedy at Linn-Mar's Armstrong Field. Lancaster had three TDs and his team had a 28-0 lead by halftime.

It was Linn-Mar's Valley debut after ruling the East Central Iowa Conference for the last several years. The Lions (2-0) look ready for the Class 4A league, though should surprise no one since they won the 4A state title last year, own a 14-game winning streak, and are 7-0 in their brief history against 4A

"To be real honest," Linn-Mar Coach Greg Purnell said, "we prepared for this game the same way we've prepared for every game the last six years."

Maybe, but Linn-Mar appears to have worked harder in the big play department. Besides Lancaster's kickoff return, Lion lightning struck twice in the form of 145-pound split end Tom Busch.

winning streak having defeated Kansas State and Oklahoma State in their final two games of the '85 season. Senior quarterback Alex Espinoza, who has passed for 443 yards and three touchdowns the past two seasons against lowa, directs the offense. The defense, anchored by All-America linebacker candidate Dennis Gibson, was ranked 14th in the nation against the pass last season allowing 148.4 yards per game. Senior place-kicker Rick Frank connected on 11 of 16 field goal attempts, including a 52-yarder against lowa last year, but was only two of six from 40 yards out.

lowa: The Hawkeyes finished last season ranked No. 10 by Associated Press and were ranked No. 1 for five weeks at mid-season. Fifth-year senior Mark Vlasic, who hit five of eight passes for 134 yards and one touchdown against ISU last season, takes over for Heisman Trophy runner-up Chuck Long at quarterback. The defense, ranked fifth last season against the rush and overall, is bolstered by All-America candidate Jeff Drost at tackle. Place-kicker Rob Houghtlin connected on 48 of 51 PAT attempts and was 19 of 27 on field goal tries, including seven of 14 from 40 yards or longer (with a long of 52), lowa is ranked 20th in the United Press International coaches'

Mike Schmidt's fifth-inning home run lifted the Phillies to 6-3 victory over New York and delayed the Mets bid to clinch the NL East title at least one more night. Schmidt was sympathetic.

"I've been in that position four or five times, trying to clinch a division," said the Phillies' third baseman. "That last win is the toughest."

Schmidt said that no team wants to allow a clincher in its ballpark. "But heck, they're 21 games ahead and they're going to drink champagne." The Mets lost their first match
