# Busch factor looms big in showdown

Can Tom Busch's boys stop Tom

Busch's boy? That unusual question will be answered tonight when Linn-Mar and Cedar Rapids Washington high schools meet in a Mississippi Valley Conference football game. Kickoff is

at 7:45 p.m. at Kingston Stadium. Tom Busch is an assistant coach at Washington whose primary responsibility is defensive backs. The Warriors' secondary will be trying to stop Busch's son, Tom, a star wide receiver at Linn-Mar.

"I'd like to have Tommy have a good game but I'd like the Washington Warriors to win," said the elder Busch, who was a three-year football letterman at Iowa State in the mid-1960s. "Really, I can't wait until tomorrow night's over with.

"It's gonna be a first and it's kind of a funny situation. But he's anxious and so am I.'

Busch, a senior, is Linn-Mar's top receiver. In two games, he has eight catches for 197 yards (23.3 average) and three touchdowns.

Linn-Mar, ranked No. 6 in Class 4A, has opened defense of its state championship with two impressive victories - 28-6 over Marion and 37-7 over Cedar Rapids Kennedy.

"I think this is going to be a very pivotal game for both teams," Linn-Mar Coach Greg Purnell said. "If we win, it puts us in pretty good shape as far as being off to a good start. Even though Washington hasn't won, it'll be a very emotional game for them. They have a lot of tradition."

Washington Coach Wally Sheets said he may start as many as nine juniors on offense and seven on defense. The Warriors have lost to Waterloo West, 15-0, and to Regis,

Mike McCool led a gallant comeback bid. McCool, who engineered second-half comebacks the past two weeks, completed 15 of 29 passes for 146 yards — including 11 of 22 the second half.

But McCool was continually harassed by Pleasant Valley tackle Tom Balunis and defensive end Andy Bell. As a result, the Royals' shotgun offense often misfired.

"We became a one-dimensional team after they shut down our running game early," said Royals Coach Gaylord Hauschildt. "I was impressed with their defense. I wasn't ready for a one-touchdown football game, but they just played sound defense."

Spartan free safety Shannon Burrage spoiled the Royals' fourthquarter bid, intercepting McCool's

pass on first down with 2:05 left. Burrage had six pass thefts last year, and got his first of the season at an opportune time. McCool had completed five

straight passes after beginning on his own 22-yard line and guiding Regis to the Spartans' 14. Pleasant Valley called a timeout to regroup from the barrage. On the next play, McCool rolled

to his right and fired to Chris Traynor who was double-covered. Burrage emerged from traffic with the ball and was brought down at the 15.

"In a defensive game like this, you have to depend on the breaks and they came our way," said Spartans Coach Ed Morrissey. "We were disappointed losing last week (12-0 to Iowa City High), and I think the kids learned a lesson."

Joe Pepitone, the former New York Yankee first baseman, was convicted by a jury in State Supreme Court in Brooklyn of two drug charges, but was found not guilty of the four most serious charges against him, including one, for possession of cocaine, that carried a mandatory minimum sentence of 15 years in prison. Neither of the convictions — one for possession of Quaaludes, a misdemeanor, and one for possession of drug paraphernalia, a Class D felony carrying a maximum sentence of seven years in jail specifies a mandatory sentence.


