Like a bad penny, Green will turn up again somewhere

CHICAGO (AP) - Dallas Green, who left the Chicago Cubs in the same gruff manner he used while running the team, should have no trouble finding a new job despite his occasionally abrasive style, other major league executives say.

Green, 53, became the latest general manager to land on the unemployment line since the end of the season Thursday. Green's resignation followed his apparent failure to stop encroachment from the Cubs' front office.

"I think he'll turn up somewhere before you know it," said Andy McKenna, a member of the Cubs board who was chairman of the team in 1981, when he spotted Green's name in a National League guidebook and put the Philadelphia Phillies' manager in charge of the Cubs' dayto-day operations.

"I think it's related to the whole shaping of the organization. It's not one single or overriding issue," McKenna said. "These things happen in sports, business everywhere."

The Chicago Sun-Times reported Friday that Green quit because John W. Madigan, executive vice president of the Tribune Co., which owns the Cubs, vetoed his choice of coach John Vukovich as field manager. The newspaper did not reveal a source for its

story but said Vukovich arrived for a final interview Thursday. The paper said Green, who also was the Cubs' president as well as G.M., had planned to introduce Vukovich today as the new manager.

Madigan denied opposing Green on his choice of Vukovich and said there was no rift over the choice of a manager. "Absolutely not," he said. "We haven't gotten

down to a final decision on that." There were some indications Green was unhappy about being told that player contracts would require final approval from another front-

office executive still to be hired. Madigan did not address specific areas of dispute between himself and Green, but he said: "I wanted to go one way, Dallas wanted to go another. Something had to give."

Red Sox General Manager Lou Gorman,

reacting in Boston to the news of Green's resignation, didn't doubt that a front-office fight precipitated Green's decision. He also suggested there might be more to the resignation than meets the eve. "I'd think that he would have wanted to stay and show he could build a winning ballclub,' Gorman said. "He must have something going. It

would be hard for me to believe he's quitting unless he's going somewhere else.' "I've been in baseball 30-some years, and I know that when philosophical differences pop up, as they will from time to time between ownership and field people, there's only a couple
