Cedar Rapids Kennedy split end Alan Feickert became his school's all-time receiving leader and smashed a Mississippi Valley Conference mark, while teammate Joe Gureno

He's got a big heart, and it was a tribute also to his teammates . . . The jury is still out on us. I don't think you have a tradition started with a 5-4 record. You have to
