Neighbor throws for 1 TD, runs for 2 more for Pirates

Jason Neighbor passed 24 yards to Mike Feldmann for a TD and scored on runs from 1 yard and from 25 yards as Alburnett (6-0) downed Northeast, 28-8, for a Class 1A District 5 win at Goose Lake.

Thomas Wright also scored for the Pirates on a 51-yard run. Northeast fell to 1-5.

■ Cascade upset No. 7 Center Point-Urbana, 28-26, in a 2A District 5 game at Cascade.

The Stormin' Pointers (5-1) had a 16-14 halftime lead but remained scoreless until late in the fourth quarter.

Cascade (5-1) was up 28-16 with 8:04 remaining in the game when the Stormin' Pointers scored on a safety to inch closer, 28-18. The Pointers scored a touchdown and got the two-point conversion with 2:32 left to close the margin.

Washington's offense wasn't stagnant, thanks to senior Deric Ward.

A dynamic runner and receiver, Ward caught seven passes for 102 yards and rushed 13 times for 98 more. He scored both Warrior touchdowns, the first on a 2-yard run and the second on a 6-yard reception from Tony Vespa.

Linn-Mar scored on its first three possessions as it built a 22-8 halftime lead.

The Lions showed early how they would attack the Washington defense. On their first possession, Nelsen carried seven times straight-ahead for 24 yards and Hubler connected with Matt Heaton on three passes for 48 yards, including the last 11 into the end zone.

The Warriors fumbled the snap on a punt attempt on their next possession, giving Linn-Mar a first down on the Washington 25. Three plays later, Nelsen plumed in from 1 yard out. Sophomore Ryan Turner booted the first of his four PATs and Linn-Mar led, 15-0.

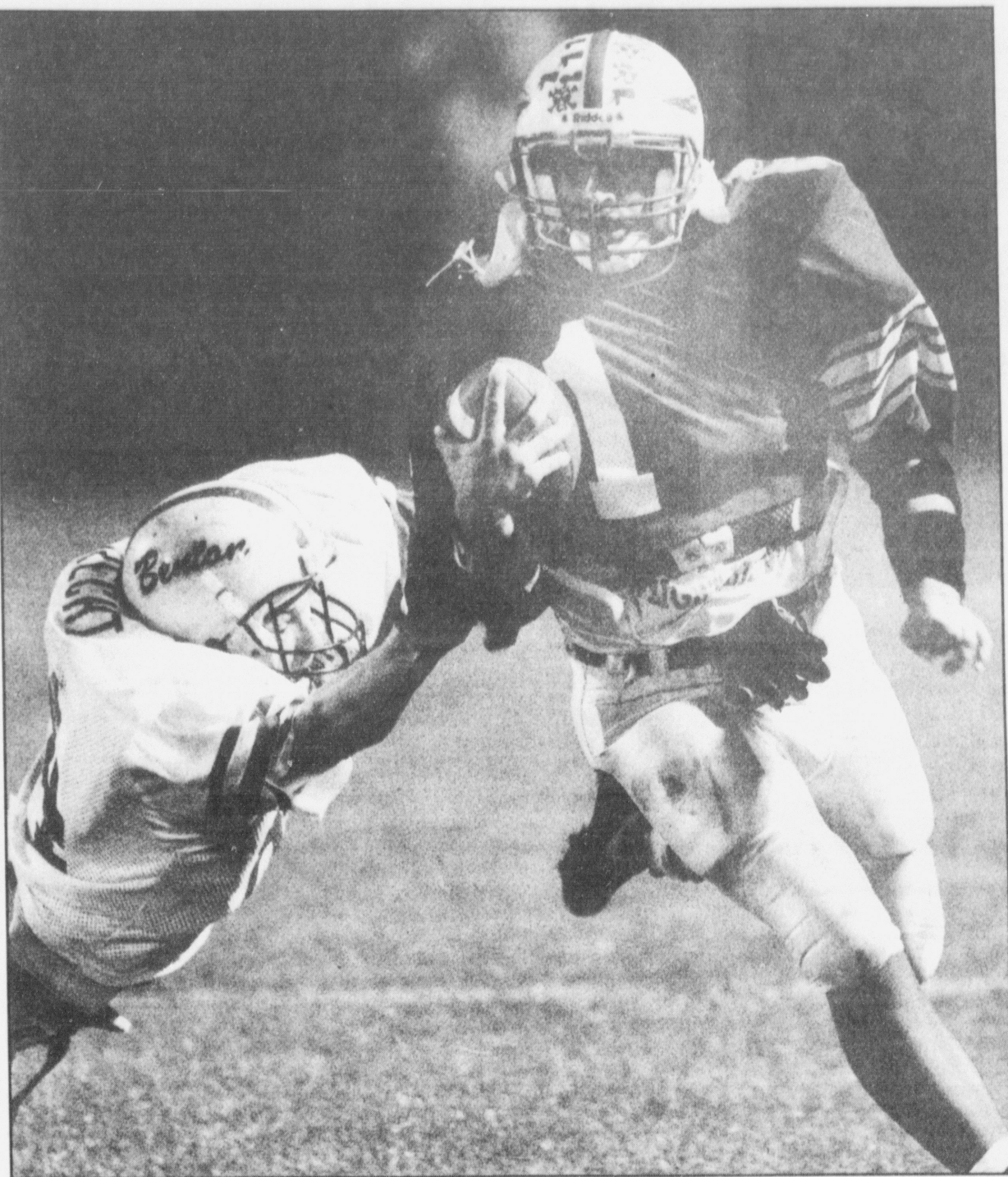
One play later, Hubler connected with Shipley over the middle for a 32-yard TD with 7:22 left in the half.

"Brad Walsh did a tremendous job on that play," Purnell praised.

Washington used the "Dedric Ward Show" to get on the board with 3:23 left in the half. Ward carried the ball five times for 31 yards and made a brilliant catch of a Tony Vespa pass for another 32 to lead the Warriors' nine-play, 78-yard drive. Ward capped it with a 2-yard run for the TD.

Linn-Mar iced the game with 14 third-quarter points, thanks to a pair of TD passes from Hubler. The first was an 11-yarder to Dave Braughn with 5:55 left in the third period, capping an 11-play, 61-yard drive, and the second a 19-yard screedn pass to Clint Hospadarsky with 1:10 left in the third period.

Ward's final touchdown for Washington culminated a 13-play, 67-yard effort.

Ruggerio's late bomb saves homecoming for feisty Marion

Just when it seemed the bottom was out of the tub, along came slender senior quarterback Tony Ruggerio to write a miracle finish that gave Marion an 18-16 homecoming win over Benton Community Friday night at Thomas Park.

One play after Jason Chappell took a 24-yard Ruggerio pass away from Bobcat defender Matt Garbers, Ruggerio hurled a 30-yard bomb to Scott Benest alone in the left end zone with just 51 seconds left.

The win improved the Indians to 2-1 in Class 3A District 5, 3-2 overall. Benton Community is 2-2, 3-3.

After throwing an incomplete on the first play of what turned out to be Marion's winning 86-yard drive, Ruggerio was flattened and had to be helped from the field for the second time in the fourth period. He returned after two runs and a Bobcat holding violation had moved the Indians out to their 40.

Did he think he could engineer a victory at that point?

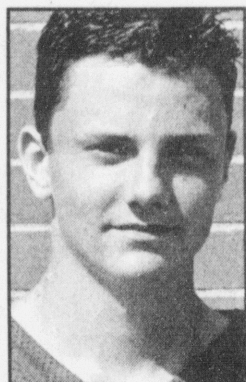
"I never had a higher confidence level in my life," Ruggerio replied. Was he excited? "Heck yeh!"

"We needed a big win like this," declared elated Marion Coach Dave Messerli. "Benton did a great job. Credit our defensive coaches, Dick Sloan and Tim Dirks."

HOW DID HE FEEL after the Bobcats' only touchdown drive gave them a 16-12 leave two minutes into the fourth period. "I thought we could move the ball on them," Messerli responded.

First-year Benton Community head coach Kal Goodchild said the obvious in the gloomy Bobcat dressing room: "We're down. We had an opportunity to win and couldn't get it done."

After Cam Feuerbach's 81-yard punt return and

two-point conversion run gave Benton Community an 8-0 lead 3:18 into the game, King's 22- and 24-yard TD runs sent Marion into intermission with a 12-8 advantage.

King netted 122 yards on 16 carries the first half, and finished with 180 on 26 carries. "Benton's stunting gave him some problems the second half," Messerli explained.

MARION RESPONDED to Feuerbach's TD punt return with an 82-yard scoring drive on which King ran for 52 yards and Ruggerio passed twice to Chappell for 43. The Indians had to offset a clipping penalty on the drive. King broke several tackles on his TD run.

Benest's leaping catch of a 16-yard Ruggerio fourth-and-8 pass at the Benton Community 14 kept the Indians' second TD sortie going. Marion drew a holding penalty on the next play, but King then threaded his way up the middle to score.

Extra-point passes failed after all three Marion TDs.

Until Marion's big finish, Benton Community was nearly as dominant in the second half as the Indians were in the first.

The Bobcats had been in Marion territory twice — the second time to the 29 — before they put together their only scoring drive, for 52 yards, all accounted for by Feuerbach, who began it with a 10-yard reception from Ryan Junge, then ran the rest on seven carries, the last from the Indian 1. His catch of Junge's extra-point pass made it 16-12 with 10:18 to play.

Ruggerio threw his second interception of the night to end a Marion thrust to the Bobcat 25, and Benton mounted a drive that carried to the Indians' 35.

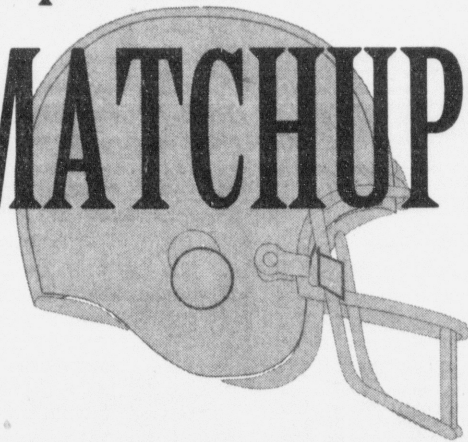
However, Marion defenders gave the Indians their chance by twice throwing Feuerbach for 5-yard losses, forcing a punt.

Limited to 29 yards the first half, Feuerbach finished with 100 on 23 carries.

Ruggerio was 10-of-18 for 145 yards.
