Biedenbach takes over in rout

Gazette sportswriter Jared Biedenbach ought to write a book. He ought to call it, "How to Single-Handedly Break Open a Close Game.

The senior from Cedar Rapids LaSalle forced a fumble, intercepted a pass and scored three touchdowns Friday night as the Lancers broke away in the second half and crushed Northeast, 44-13, in a Class 1A District 6 matchup at Lancer Field.

The book would begin inauspiciously, with Biedenbach muffing the game's first punt, leading to a Northeast touchdown and a 7-0 deficit. Then Biedenbach would sadly relate how he ran three only times for just five yards the rest of the half, as his team held onto a 14-13 lead at intermission.

Then, a few minutes into the third quarter, Biedenbach starts emerging as the hero. Teammate Ignacio Riera kicks a 35-yard field goal to give LaSalle a 17-13 lead. But

Riera knocks the ensuing kickoff out of

bounds, and the Rebels set up at their own 35. On the first play from scrimmage, Northeast tailback John Mlolk breaks left on a sweep.

Mlolk gets by Biedenbach and sees daylight, but the plucky linebacker knocks loose the ball and teammate Gene Formanek falls on it.

"In our drills we're taught to try and strip the ball," Biedenbach explains.

After taking over at Northeast's 36, LaSalle quarterback Tony Fandel hands off to Biedenbach, who darts untouched into the end zone for a 23-13 lead.

"He could only do that because the line blocked," LaSalle Coach Duane Schulte said. Later, with time running down in the third, Northeast is faced with a second-andthird at its own 29. Biedenbach breaks through the line and throws Mlolk for a three-yard loss. On third-and-long, North-

east quarterback Chris Lee looks to pass. He finds only Biedenbach, who grabs the

pass and falls down at Northeast's 29. Seven plays later, Biedenbach snares an overthrown screen pass from Fandel and runs 14 yards for a touchdown. After Riera's PAT, the Lancers lead 30-13.

On the Lancers' next series, Biedenbach sweeps right on second-and-8 and doesn't stop until he has covered 42 yards and scored another touchdown. Another Riera kick and it's 37-13 LaSalle.

Fandel adds a 19-yard TD run with just over two minutes left, and the book ends with LaSalle winning 44-13. Thanks, in large part, to Biedenbach, who finished with 84 yards rushing on eight carries, but whose presence was felt on both sides of the ball.

"Other than that punt he botched, he played great," Schulte said.

The Lancers improved to 2-4 in district, 3-5 overall as they prepare for next week's battle No. 4 West Branch, which whipped Alburnett Friday, 56-6, and has won 43 consecutive regular-season games.
