The bye-weeks don't seem to come at good times for any of the aforementioned. NFL teams could use a break further down the schedule, not in September. And Iowa would have been better off with two weeks to devote to Penn State rather than New Mexico State.

But the Hawks can't grumble too much about their schedule. After all, New Mexico State is on it.

While Iowa's coaches spend today in their laboratory, the rest of us can look around the state and nation and see if there's anything we like.

First of all, UNLV is at Iowa State. The Cyclones are fortunate UNLV is a basketball school. But so is ISU



### Steinberg proves he belongs

Sophomore back gains 216 yards in Kennedy's win

There have been times this football season when J.C. Steinberg has felt like an out-

After all, he's a sophomore playing for the Cedar Rapids Kennedy varsity and hasn't had a whole lot of success running the ball, partly because of an injured ankle.

But the quick and elusive

rookie proved to his teammates, coaches and just about everyone else at Kingston Stadium Friday night that he is indeed a varsity player.

And a darn good one at that. Steinberg racked up 216 yards on only 15 carries, scoring on a 63-yard touchdown, as Kennedy dropped Cedar Rapids Jefferson, 30-8.

"I got off to a slow start this vear." Steinberg said. "I wanted to prove myself because I didn't think everybody around here thought that I had the talent to play varsity. I just wanted to come out and have a good game.'

No problem there.

Steinberg lost two yards on his first carry before busting loose for 55 on his second attempt. His fourth carry like most of his others, a delayed handoff - was the 63-yard scoring effort late in the first quarter that gave Kennedy a 10-0 lead.






