

Hempstead routs Kennedy

Gazette sportswriter A lot of attention has been paid this prep football season to the two Mississippi Valley Conference entrants from Iowa City.

But Cedar Rapids Kennedy can now attest that there's some pretty good football being played in Dubuque these days, too.

Class 4A ninth-ranked Dubuque Hempstead rolled into Kingston Stadium Thursday night and demolished Kennedy, 34-6, in a Mississippi Division showdown.

"Our kids played very well and we hit very well," said Hempstead Coach Roger Baylor, whose Mustangs nipped arch-rival Wahlert, 6-3, last week. "The kids showed a lot of diversity and we're back a little more on our game. They showed a lot of character.

Hendricks carried the ball 28 times for 196 yards and three touchdowns in just more than three quarters of play. He had 141 yards and a pair of TDs at halftime.

"Hendricks had a nice night," Baylor praised. "He's a good ballplayer, but we use other things, too. It just so happened that their ends were coming across and allowing us to run the fullback. You try to take what the defense gives you, and if we're able to capitalize on that, so much the better.'

As good as Hendricks was, the Mustangs' play on the defensive side of the ball was even better.

Tackle Rob Kemp and linebackers Luke Gansen and Matt Koch led the charge. Hempstead held Kennedy to 96 total yards, including just 21 on the ground.

"We've got some real good defensive football players," Baylor said. "Kemp is a load by and tackle, and you can't be himself. He's played just out-

son. And Koch . . . superior performer. He's been pressuring the quarterback all season and tonight he was in (Kennedy QB Cory Hannen's) face most of the night.

"They've really done a real good job. The defense is just playing excellent."

Kennedy (2-3) simply never got untracked. It failed to convert any of nine third-down situations into first downs, and the result was nine punts.

Hendricks, meanwhile, was unstoppable. He had five runs of 12 yards or more, including a 52-yard scamper in the first quarter and a 43-yarder for a touchdown in the third.

His other TD runs covered 1 and 4 yards.

Hempstead also scored on a 42-yard pass from Doug Stockel to Steve Kapparos in the second quarter and on a 1-yard run by reserve quarterback Brian Breen in the fourth.

Kennedy got on the board with 3:01 left in the game when Hannen hit B.J. Hammes with a 24-yard scoring pass against the Hempstead defensive reserves.


