Murray clubs 500th

BALTIMORE (AP) — Eddie Murray hit his 500th career home run Friday night, joining Hall of Famers Hank Aaron and Willie Mays as the only players with at least 3,000 hits and 500 homers.

Exactly one year after Cal Ripken electrified a sellout crowd at Camden Yards by playing in his record 2,131st consecutive game, Murray became the 15th player to hit 500 home runs.

In the seventh inning of the Baltimore Orioles' rain-delayed game against the Detroit Tigers, he sent the first pitch from Felipe Lira over the right-field wall. His 21st homer of the season, a solo shot, tied the game 3-3.

As soon as the ball cleared the wall, multi-colored confetti rained down on the field. Murray slowly circled the bases and was greeted by most of his teammates at the

A huge banner unfurled down the ivy-covered wall in center field that read. "CON-GRATULATIONS EDDIE 500.

The crowd shouted "EDDIE! EDDIE!" for nearly nine minutes, and Murray came out to give the crowd a few heartfelt waves. The game was further delayed as ushers cleared the field of the confetti

Murray, 40, spent the latter part of the celebration alternating pacing the dugout and sitting down. Then he emerged for a second curtain call and shook hands with several fans in the first row to the left of the

Murray is the first switch-hitter in the 3,000-500 club. Aaron and Mays hit righthanded.

This homer came left-handed. A rain delay of 2 hours, 20 minutes severely depleted the crowd and left the stadium barely half full. But those in attendance gave Murray a prolonged standing ovation that he acknowledged with a tip of the cap after he reached the dugout.

Murray is hardly typical of the sluggers on the 500-homer list. He never hit more than 33 in a season and has reached 30 in only five of 20 seasons.

"I never considered myself a home-run hitter," he said recently.

Murray spent his first 12 major league seasons with the Orioles, hitting 333 home runs while averaging 99 RBI a year. But he was traded away after the 1988 season following a dispute that began when owner Edward Bennett Williams questioned his leadership abilities.

Ironically, many of the Orioles have lauded Murray's presence in the clubhouse since he rejoined the team in a trade with the Cleveland Indians on July 21.

"Eddie has meant a lot to me and everybody," Orioles second baseman Roberto Alomar said. "I learn a lot from him, just by watching him and talking to him.

Murray hit six homers in his first 25 games with the Orioles as their designated hitter, giving him 498 for his career. That's when his drive for No. 500 turned into an arduous task.

Early in his second tenure with Baltimore, Murray said his biggest wish was that his 500th homer would come quickly so he and the Orioles could fully concentrate on getting into the playoffs.

It didn't quite work that way.

Murray hit No. 498 on Aug. 16 in Oakland, then went 12 games — including nine straight at home — without one. During that homestand, team officials stopped posting the number "498" on the right-field scoreboard at Murray's request.

Murray finally hit No. 499 on Aug. 30 in Seattle, but went homerless in the final five games of the road trip. The Orioles returned home Friday.





City High dominates

Gazette Johnson County Bureau IOWA CITY — Coach Larry Brown unveiled the 1996 model of Iowa City High football Friday night. It's sleek, powerful and looks like another winner.

The Little Hawks sure impressed Cedar Rapids Prairie Coach Craig Jelinek, whose squad was overwhelmed in the season opener for both teams, 41-14, at Bates Field.

The Little Hawks finished 10-2 last year after winning consecutive Class 4A titles in 1993 and 1994. They showed no signs of slowing down Friday.

"City High just has outstanding athletes, there's just no two ways about it," Jelinek said. "Our game plan, our offense and our defense, I think I was just happy with. But we cannot match up athletically, and I don't think anybody will.

It was easy to see where Jelinek was coming from Friday night. At times his Prairie Hawks (0-1) looked to have figured out City High's game, throwing running backs for losses, knocking down passes at the line of scrimmage. They trailed just 21-7

at the half. But the Little Hawks (1-0) were able to strike quickly with big plays, and it finally did in the Prairie Hawks.

Five of City High's six touchdowns came from at least 29 yards out.

Tailback Jesse Holland ran 80 yards, nearly untouched, to score on City High's first play from scrimmage. Quarterback Mitch Price hit receiver Kahlil Hill for a 29-yard touchdown pass. Hill juked his way to a TD on an 85-yard punt return. Tailback Jason Ringena raced 49 yards on a dive play

"We do have a lot of weapons," said Ringena, who ran only four times but gained 78 yards. "Sometimes it's hard to get

all those weapons together, but I think we're doing a good job.

Holland ran eight times for 119 yards, without touching the ball in the second half. Hill looked like the big-play threat that has Division I programs interested. He caught four passes for 79 yards and a touchdown, returned a punt for a touch-

down and ran 21 yards on a reverse. Once City High's runners got to the outside. Prairie could not catch up. "We just don't match up athletically, plain and sim-

ple," Jelinek said.

Asked if he thought any other Mississippi Valley Conference team could, Jelinek responded, "No, no, no, no."

Only Price's 1-yard keeper on the second play of the second quarter failed to wow the crowd. But it did open a 21-0 lead with 11:20 still to play in the first half, and seemed to spell doom for Prairie.

Regis wears out Kennedy

Somewhere this morning, Tom Good is smiling.

In a performance reminiscent of the old Tom Good-coached Cedar Rapids Regis football teams, the Royals used a strong running attack and a stout defensive effort to beat Metro rival Cedar Rapids Kennedy, 26-9, in the season and Mississippi Valley Conference opener for both teams Friday night.

Regis churned up the Kingston Stadium turf for 304 yards on the ground, led by halfback Jon Scheib, fullback Ben Bowers and quarterback Matt Johnson.

Scheib carried 13 times for 111 yards and a touchdown, Bowers 17 times for 95 yards and a TD, and Johnson used the option keeper to total 78 yards on four carries (70 of those came on a second-quarter touchdown run).

'Twenty-three of our top 24 players are seniors, and they played like that tonight," said Regis Coach Mike Winker. "We have some things we need to take care of, obviously, but I've had a lot of these guys for four years now and we know each other pretty well."

Winker was the sophomore coach before taking over the varsity job last year.

The Royals were impressive, but they got some help from the Cougars. Regis defenders picked off five passes, and Fritz Ebinger returned one of them 42 yards for a touchdown.

Dave Celichowski had a pair

of interceptions for the Royals. 'You can't turn the ball over like that, and expect to win the ballgame," Kennedy Coach Don Knock said. "We looked like we haven't even practiced. It's awful early in the season to talk about gut-checks, but these guys are looking at a gut-check right

march 70 yards to the Regis 10-yard line in nine plays. The drive stalled there, however, and Kennedy settled for a 27yard field goal off the toe of Eli

After that it was all Regis. Bowers scored on an 8-yard run with 24 seconds left in the first quarter when the Royals gained possession after an interception by Matt Volk. An interception by Chad Buresh with 4:46 left in the first half led to Johnson's 50-yard scamper down the right sideline 51 seconds

Scheib added a 10-yard TD run in the third, and Ebinger's interception return in the fourth quarter capped Regis' scoring.

Winker praised the play of his offensive and defensive lines, led by big Jeff Machado (6-3, 260), Seth Cruise, Chad Buresh, Doug Wendling and Ebinger.

"Those guys really did a nice job tonight," he said.

Johnson and his late-game replacement, Nick Putman, failed to complete any of the nine passes they threw, a stat that caused concern for Winker.

"You can't win in this league by just running the football," he said. "The teams that are going to do it over the long haul are the ones who can pass.'

Kennedy added a late touchdown on a 3-yard run from tailback J.C. Steinburg.

Cougar quarterbacks Brad Steenhoek and Kyle Bassett combined to complete nine of 24 passes for 148 yards, and were plagued by the five interceptions. Steenhoek threw three all in the first half — and Bassett two.

The Cougars may have lost lineman Cory Hannen, who Kennedy looked good on its came out of the locker room at first possession when it used a halftime on crutches and with nice mix of run and pass to his right knee heavily wrapped.
