# End of a losing streak

# Linn-Mar breaks 3-game skid with 36-18 homecoming victory over Dubuque Hempstead

n the throes of a three-game losing streak and seeing its postseason hopes quickly dissipating, Linn-Mar made one last grasp to save its football season Friday night.

"Everybody was just fighting out there," quarterback Wil Meggers said after his Lions claimed a convincing 36-18 win over Dubuque Hemsptead

Linn-Mar (2-3) made the plays on offense, as it has been doing much of the season, scoring touchdowns in each quarter - two in the second. Keith Musser ran for two scores, and Meggers threw for a touchdown and ran for

The maligned Lion defense finally showed its fangs, too, intercepting three passes and hopping on a fumble in the fourth quarter that essentially ended any Hempstead hopes. Linn-Mar came into the game ranked last in the Mississippi Valley Conference defen-

"I'm just really happy for our kids," Linn-Mar Coach Greg Purnell said.

"Hopefully this will get us untracked "Dropping three in a row, not playing very well and not being very aggressive those three weeks. I thought our kids came out tonight and really wanted to win a homecoming game.

"I thought we executed well, and I thought we rose to the occasion on defense when we had to and came up with some big (turnovers).'

As balanced a team offensively as there is in the Valley, Linn-Mar had six different players carry the ball and three more catch passes

Musser led the rushers with 60 yards on nine carries. Roger Abel, the Valley's leading receiver, caught eight passes for 93 yards before leaving in the third quarter with an ankle injury.

Linn-Mar ended with 190 yards on

the ground, 115 through the air.

'Roger, the guys up front, they all had great games," said Meggers, who completed 11 of 13 passes. "We definitely wanted to get the ground game going, and that would open up our passing game a little. The misdirection seemed to work nice.'

Linn-Mar scored its first touchdown late in the first quarter when Meggers hit a wide-open Abel on a 1-yard pass, then extended its lead to 14-0 with 10 minutes left in the second on Meggers 8-yard run around end.

Hempstead took advantage of a fumbled punt return to cut the lead in half a couple minutes later. Back Zak Gordon converted on a 4th-and-3 run, then scored from 5 yards out two plays later. quarterback at all.'

Linn-Mar took the kickoff and drove 63 yards on 10 plays to make it 22-7. Fullback Dave McEowen plowed over from the 4 for the score. Nate Hansen had the two-point run.

Zach Schultz' 21-yard field goal made it 21-10 at the half, but Linn-Mar got a 31-yard TD run from Musser in the third and a 9-yard run in the fourth. Joel Decker's 10-vard pass to Tyler Hedrick in the fourth accounted for Hempstead's final points.

"Greg's got a nice team," said Hempstead Coach Roger Baylor, whose team dropped to 2-3. "He's not as big as he'd like to be, but he's got a lot of good skill players. We couldn't contain their

"They're real physical and we're not very physical," Marion Coach Dave Messerli said of Western Dubuque.

Marion was held scoreless until Rob Wiley broke loose for a 78-yard touchdown run with 2:59 to play. Wiley finished with 99 of the Indians' 130 yards rush-

Western Dubuque (4-1, 3-0) ground out 331 yards of rushing offense, 234 in the first half. Senior I-back Joe Strief upped his season rushing total to 906 yards with 158. He ran for 151 in the first half and scored two

"We knew going in they would try to run the football right at us and, unfortunately, we didn't tackle very well," Messerli said. "When you got a good, hard running back, you better tackle him.

Western Dubuque senior fullback Matt Moore left six Marion tacklers in his wake when he rambled 40 yards for a touchdown that capped a 98-yard drive midway through the first




