

LaSalle offense rolls, 65-20

Life at the top of Class 1A District 6 is a little lonelier for the Cedar Rapids LaSalle football team.

The 10th-ranked Lancers churned out 477 yards of total offense and nearly broke the

school scoring record with a 65-20 rout of Alburnett Friday at Lancer Field.

LaSalle (6-0 overall, 4-0 1A-6) stands alone atop the district, thanks to Guttenberg's 32-8 victory over previously undefeated Bellevue Friday.

"We were hoping to still be unbeaten at this point," LaSalle Coach Duane Schulte said. "But we're just taking things one play at a time.'

LaSalle's offensive explosion was nothing new. The Lancers are averaging about 47 points

Blocked PAT costs Prairie

Thirteen didn't turn out to be an unlucky number for the Cedar Rapids Prairie football team so much as 19 did.

Jake Swanson got his potential game-tying extra point blocked with five minutes left as Dubuque Wahlert preserved a 7-6 win Friday night over Prairie at John Wall Field.

The win was Wahlert's fifth straight after a season-opening loss. Prairie dropped to 3-3 and

most likely out of the playoff race, considering it has a date left with Iowa City West.

"We'd made 17 out of 18 extra points this year, but they blocked (No. 19) and that cost us the game," Prairie Coach Craig Jelinek said. "I don't know if it was blocking or if it was a bad kick. Back gets 6 TDs in 49-35 thriller

Cedar Rapids Kennedy junior J.C. Steinburg may have to think about changing his initials. T.D. would seem like a nice fit.

Steinburg, a 5-8, 165-pound tailback with sprinter's speed, matched his Mississippi Valley Conference single-game record of six touchdowns and led Kennedy past intracity rival Washington, 49-35, in a wild and crazy prep football game at Kingston Stadium.

The 3 hour, 25 minute affair wasn't decided until Steinburg zipped 51 yards for his sixth touchdown with 56 seconds left. Seven touchdowns were scored in the game's final 11:52, including four by Washington.

Steinburg, who set MVC records for touchdowns (six) and points scored (36) in Kennedy's win over Waterloo East a week ago, matched both of those totals Friday night. His TD runs covered 11, 5, 3, 12, 65 and 51 yards.

Unofficially, Steinburg finished with 294 yards on 30 carries. The Cougars totaled 378 yards

rushing and 100 more through the air.

Kennedy (3-3) celebrated the return of Coach Don Knock from a two-game suspension by busting to a 28-7 halftime lead. Steinburg's 11-yard touchdown scamper in the third quarter gave the Cougars a 35-7 lead, but no advantage was safe with Washington quarterback Keith Lesmeister operating with a 20 mph wind at his back in the fourth quarter.

Lesmeister, the MVC's top passer, completed a

staggering 24 of 48 passes for 349 yards and three touchdowns. If the 349 yards stands, it will be a single-game league record, topping the previous high of 344 set by Scott Flynn of Iowa City High

Lydale Waller also completed a 35-yard pass for the Warriors, which gave them an unofficial MVC record of 384 passing yards in one game.

Two of Lesmeister's TD passes went to tight end Scott Cornish, who matched his league record of nine touchdown receptions in a season with three

games still to play. Washington (3-3) began to cut into Kennedy's lead when Lesmeister and Cornish hooked up from 10 yards out with 10:04 left in the game. That's when the real craziness started.

The Warriors successfully converted an onside kick on the ensuing kickoff, and took over on their own 49. Nine plays later, Ross Meyeraan caught a 5-yard TD run and a two-point conversion made it 35-21, Cougars.

Washington recovered another onside kick, this time on the Kennedy 44. Lesmeister threw 35 yards to Jason Dougherty, then nine more to Cornish to cut the Cougar lead to 35-28.

After trading a couple of possessions, Kennedy got back on the board when Steinburg found some running room to the outside and sprinted 65 yards for a score with 2:12 left.

The fourth of Jameson Kendrick's five PATs gave Kennedy a 42-28 lead, and the Cougars seemed to finally have some breathing room.

But they had to suck it up one last time. Starting on their own 20, Washington moved the ball to the 42. From there, Lesmeister and Dougherty hooked up on a 58-yard scoring pass with 1:08 left to make it 42-35.

That's when Steinburg broke loose for his final TD to give the Cougars the win.

Turnovers ultimately doomed the Warriors' comeback. They turned the ball over six times, including an interception and a lost fumble in Kennedy territory during the wild fourth quarter.

Kennedy controlled play in the first half, racking up 237 yards and 28 points while holding Washington to 159 yards and seven points.

beat New York for the first time since May 1993, had retired 10 straight batters before Derek Jeter hit a two-out double and Bernie Williams grounded an RBI single to left.

Tino Martinez then hit a double to left. Left fielder B.J. Surhoff made a nice play cutting the ball off before it could get in the corner and threw the ball to Todd Zeile at third. Zeile faked a throw to second but the ball popped out of his hand and rolled toward shortstop as Williams sprinted home with the go-ahead run.

"I really don't know if he was trying to make a snap throw or what," Baltimore Manager Davey Johnson said. "I think he was going to fake a throw and get someone."

Torre, thinking the play was over, didn't even look up until the ball was rolling loose.

"I saw Bernie stop and figured it was second and third," Torre said.

"I was starting to look ahead to what might happen next, and of a sudden I look up and he's halfway home."



Jefferson, 40-0

By John Shipley Gazette Johnson County Bureau IOWA CITY — Jesse Holland gave the homecoming crowd at Frank Bates Field something to cheer about Friday night, even if most of it left sometime around the beginning of the fourth quarter.

That's when Holland stopped getting carries.

Unless you count the crowning of the homecoming king and queen, the only mystery surrounding Iowa City High's 40-0 win over Cedar Rapids Jefferson was whether Holland would crack the 200-yard rushing

Pressed into double-duty because of an injury to backfield mate Jason Ringena, Holland carried 25 times for 194 yards and three touchdowns. His last carry was a six-yard dive on the first play of the fourth quarter; then the backups took over.

"I was looking forward to it," said Holland, a senior tailback. "It makes it a lot more difficult with Jason not in because that means I'm pretty much the workhorse. We're missing him, hopefully he'll be back next

Ringena watched from the sidelines, a cast on his left foot, the result of an ankle injury

during last week's 28-7 win over 4-yard strike from backup QB crosstown rival Iowa City West. That win pushed the Little Hawks to No. 1 in Class 4A and could have made it easy to overlook the J-Hawks, who have won only once in three years.

But other than some penalties, City High looked sharp, producing scoring drives of 68, 40, 79 and 66 yards, and holding Jefferson (1-5) to 83 yards offense.

"It was hard coming off of West High and keeping our intensity up because we pretty much sold out on every play against West," said Holland, who also returned the opening kick of the second half 99 yards for a touchdown. "It was hard but I think we stuck with it. We made some stupid mistakes, but we got after it."

The Little Hawks were penalized eight times for 80 yards and Jefferson successfully thwarted their passing game.

Little Hawks starter Mitch Price connected on just 3 of 8 attempts for 45 yards after throwing for 139 yards and three touchdowns against West High. Likewise, star wide receiver Kahlil Hill was held in check, scoring just one touchdown on a in the other two.

"Our schemes were good but we had some breakdowns," said J-Hawks Coach Jim Dostal, whose team broke a 25-game losing streak two weeks ago.

Afterward Dostal spoke of City High's speed, a familiar refrain from opposing coaches.

"It's just speed, we lack speed," Dostal said. "You might say, 'You've got Corey Young and those guys,' but that's only so good if you don't have interior line speed."

It appeared early that Young and quarterback Matt McCracken might be able to make something happen. On Jefferson's opening drive the two connected on five consecutive pass attempts, two of which were negated by penalties.

But City High adjusted and the J-Hawks didn't complete another pass the rest of the night. The opening drive stalled at City's 32-yard line, the closest Jefferson would get to the end

moving Ben Sanderson from receiver to tailback. The change worked wonders as the Hawks produced a six-minute, 14-play, 80-yard drive - mostly on the ground — to get within a point with 5:03 left.

Sanderson ran and caught passes totaling 44 yards on the drive. Fullback Ryan LaGrange plunged over from the 1 on third down for the TD.

"We just had to make a change. That's all there was to Jelinek said. "I thought (Sanderson) did a heck of a job. We were trying to get him the ball in the slot and we couldn't, so we moved him to tailback to get it to him.'

But just as the Prairie faithful had begun to settle in for what looked like certain overtime, a Wahlert defender appeared to come through unblocked on the end and swat away Swanson's

"This is a huge win for us," said Wahlert Coach Mike Cooper, who had no idea who ended up with the big block. "Prairie is a very good football team, a very good team. We're 5-1, if we lose we're 4-2 and we've got (top-ranked) Iowa City High left, so this was big.

'They just hogged us up front on the last possession. They just took it to us."

Wahlert moved 89 yards on

five plays in the last 1:48 of the first half to score its lone touchdown.

Running back Troy Clemen rambled 35 yards off an option pitch on the fourth play of the drive, then took another pitch from quarterback Matt Seamer on the following play, pulled up and threw a strike to a wideopen end Andy Burbach for a 33-yard TD pass.

Tim Pitz nailed what turned out to be the winning extra point.

"That's the first one I've thrown since freshman year," said Clemen, who ended with 125 yards rushing on 21 carries. "I threw an interception last week on the same play."

"It was a great call," added Cooper. "We had just run the same play and gained 40 yards, so we figured 'this is the time.' The corner came up and it worked just like we wanted it

Wahlert accumulated 287

yards, 220 on the ground. Prairie passed for 64 yards and ran for 159.

Despite the stinging loss, Jelinek is certain he can rally his troops.


'The season isn't over," he said. "Sure this was a disappointing loss. All losses are disappointing, but we've just got to go from here.
