C.R. Kennedy's playoff hopes washed away

Dubuque Senior overwhelms Cougars

Friday night at the quagmire formerly known as Kingston Stadium, Cedar Rapids Kennedy became the team formerly known as a playoff contender.

Too many fumbles, too many interceptions, too little offense, too little defense, too little dry turf to play on. Too much for the Cougars to overcome in a 49-14 loss to Dubuque Senior.

Forget making it to the playoffs now. With a week to go in the regular season, Kennedy (4-4) finds a .500 record its new and only priority.

"This is very disappointing for the 29 seniors on this team," said Kennedy Coach Don Knock, who had few kind words to say to his squad in an end-zone meeting following the game. "But it's just one of those deals."

On the other hand, Senior (5-3) suddenly finds itself in a rare place — alive in the race for one of 16 spots in the Class 4A playoffs. The Rams — who host Cedar Rapids Regis in their season finale next week — have never qualified for postseason play.

"We knew if we wanted to get into the playoffs, we had to get this one," said Senior running back Scott Boleyn, who scored three touchdowns and rambled for 218 yards on the soupy Kingston field. "We wanted it. We played hard."

Senior was the better team up front on both sides of the ball, and that more than anything else, told the story of the game.

The Rams literally ran 42 offensive plays, attempting no passes. With the exception of a 20-yard bootleg run for touchdown, quarterback Ben Duve's night consisted solely of handing off to halfback Boleyn and fullback Jeff Smith.

Boleyn, a sturdy 180-pounder, contin-

ually pounded the Kennedy defense, breaking through would-be tacklers ad nauseum. He had 210 yards rushing on 17 attempts in the first half alone, and seemed a good bet to break the Missis-

sippi Valley Conference single-game record of 283.

Kennedy owned the ball much of the second half, and Boleyn carried only seven times for eight yards.

"We knew it was sloppy and we had to come out and own the line of scrimmage," Boleyn said. "We came in thinking 'run the ball'. We just took advantage of it — the cold weather, the

sloppy field. Even coming down to their plays, we felt we had the advantage."

"I thought the weather was a big factor," said Senior Coach Pat Murphy. "The rain gods were looking upon us tonight because I think that affected them more than us. But I also felt we played pretty well. Our offensive line and defensive line controlled the line of scrimmage, and that was a big difference."

As were six Kennedy turnovers.

The Cougars fumbled twice and were intercepted once on their first three possessions, and Senior took advantage all three times to leap to a 21-0 first-quarter lead.

Smith popped over from the 3 for Senior's first score with just over three minutes gone in the game. Then, on Kennedy's ensuing possession, Boleyn picked off a Kyle Bassett pass in the flat and strutted 56 yards for another touchdown.

Kennedy immediately fumbled again in its own territory, and Boleyn broke loose on a 28-yard scoring jaunt for the three-touchdown advantage.

Boleyn scored on a 19-yard run in the second quarter, followed by another 3-yard Smith TD. Senior's other points came on a fumble recovery in the end zone and Duve's 20-yard naked bootleg run.

Kennedy scored in the second quarter on a 29-yard pass from Bassett to wide receiver Ryan Pauly and in the third on a J.C. Steinburg 27-yard run. Steinburg led the Cougars with 143 yards rushing on 28 carries.

Bassett — the MVC's leading passer — was thoroughly grounded by the elements, completing just 2 of 5 passes for 37 yards. He was intercepted twice.

Still, Knock refused to let the weather be a crutch for his team.

"Both teams played in it," he said. "We've got some finesse stuff we do, we're a little bit different offensively, but there are no excuses."

Lancers snare playoff spot

LaSalle survives double-OT thriller

Chris Miller caught a 10-yard touchdown pass from Craig Grobstich in the second overtime Friday as Cedar Rapids LaSalle clinched a playoff berth with a 28-27 victory over Bellevue.

Bellevue also scored in the second overtime and had a chance to win, but failed on its two-point conversion.

Grobstich threw a touchdown passes in overtime to John Hoffman but Bellevue answered to force another overtime.

The Lancers (6-2 overall, 6-0 Class 1A District 6) got things going in the second quarter on a 1-yard run by Brian Shedeck and Mike Kouri's 56-yard pass interception for a touchdown as LaSalle took a 14-6 lead into halftime.

Bellevue (1-7, 1-5) scored on Chet Kanake's 7-yard run in the third quarter and completed the two-point conversion on a pass from Justin Medinger to Joe Putnam to tie the score at 14-14 and complete the scoring in regulation.

■ **CAMANCHE 10, MOUNT VERNON 7** — Suffering an apparent letdown after last week's 39-0 rout of arch-rival Solon, the visiting Mustangs mustered just 58 yards rushing (they had averaged 330) en route to their first Class 2A District 5 defeat.

Chris Roloff completed 8 of 17 passes for 93 yards, and Mike Wieseler caught five for 63. Mount Vernon (6-2, 5-1) must win its regular-season finale at Tipton to claim a playoff berth. Camanche improved to 4-4, 3-3.

■ **C.R. JEFFERSON 15, DUBUQUE HEMPSTEAD 3** — Jeremy Brown rushed for 156 yards and scored on runs of one and 10 yards as the J-Hawks (4-4) won a Mississippi Valley contest at Dubuque. The Jefferson defense held the Mustangs (5-3) to zero yards passing and just eight first downs.

■ **LINN-MAR 31, WATERLOO WEST 20** — Keith Musser ran for a pair of touchdowns and Chris Nebraska scored on a 92-yard kickoff return in the fourth quarter for the Lions at Waterloo. Jim Erickson also scored on a 10-yard pass from Buzzy Bussewitz.

■ **NORTH LINN 37, PRESTON 19** — Brett Haughebury carried 35 times for 257 yards and five touchdowns for the host Lynx (5-3 overall, 4-2 Class A District 8). Haughebury also ran for a 2-point conversion. Preston slid to 2-6, 2-4.

■ **GUTTENBERG 32, ALBURNETT 18** — In Class 1A District 6 at Guttenberg, Matt Lernhart hit 6 of 14 passes for 153 yards and two touchdowns, both by Thomas Vogt, on plays covering 56 and 26 yards. Guttenberg is 4-4, 4-2, Alburnett 3-5, 3-3.

■ **TIPTON 12, SOLON 6** — The turnover-plagued Spartans lost five fumbles, one for a touchdown, in their second successive loss after a 4-0 start in Class 2A District 5. Brent Owen, 10-of-19 for 143 yards without an interception, connected with Kasey Schmitt for 42 yards and host Solon's lone TD. Both teams are 5-3 and 4-2.

■ **STARMONT 33, CENTRAL CITY-SPRINGVILLE 7** — Derek Adams rushed for 104 yards and a pair of touchdowns as the Stars (6-2, 4-2) won a Class 2A District 4 battle at Central City.

Benji Silver had 117 yards on 27 carries for the Cat-Birds (3-5, 1-5).

■ **IOWA CITY REGINA 20, OLIN 12** — Ian Ferrell ran for 161 yards and 3 touchdowns on 27 carries as the host Regals (3-5, 2-4) rolled past the Lions (1-7, 0-6).

Regina's John Crane collected 24 tackles (three solo) and recovered one fumble.

■ **GRINNELL 31, OSKA-LOOSA 6** — Second-ranked Grinnell clinched the Class 3A District 6 championship at Oskaloosa.

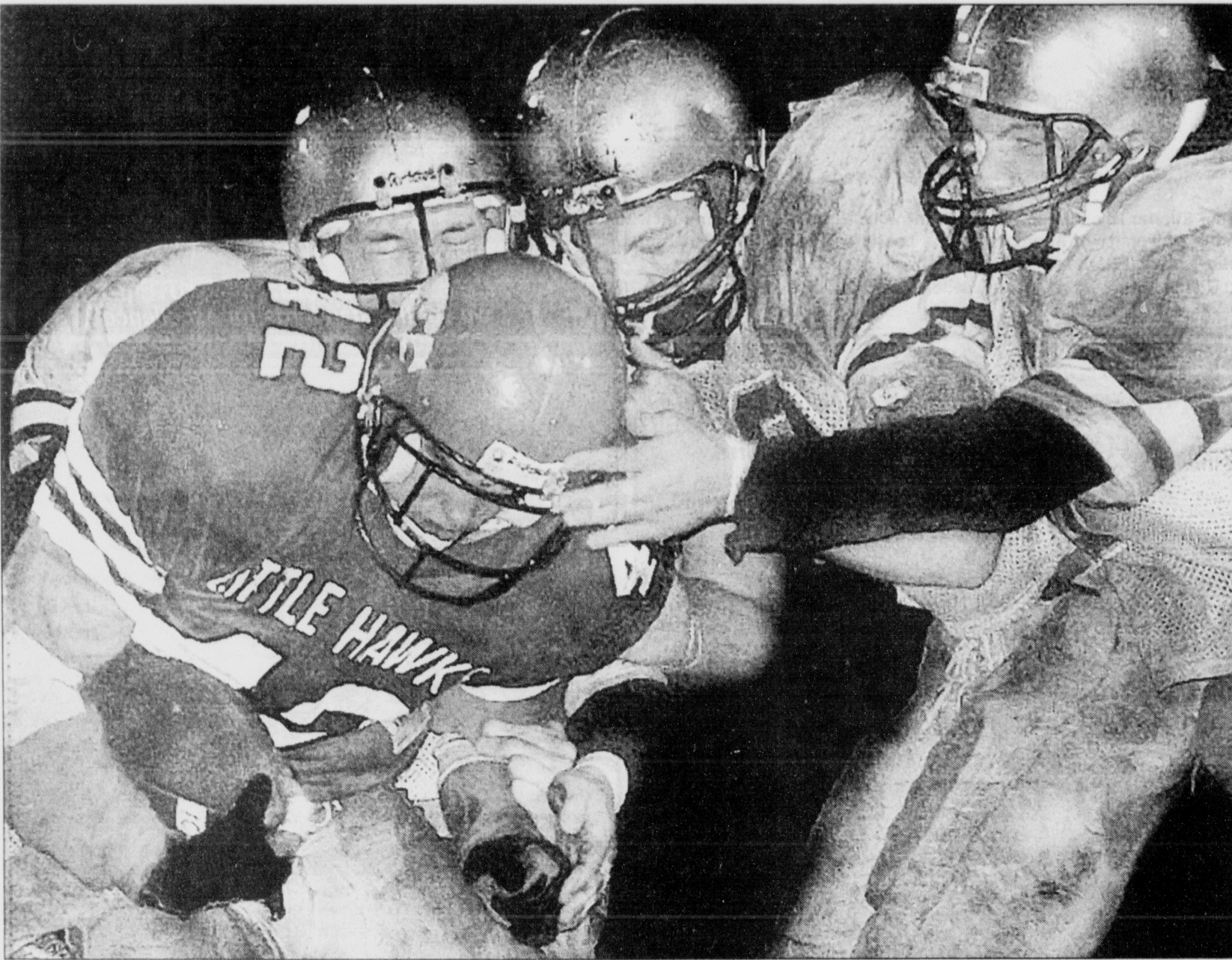
Grinnell's only two losses last year came at the hands of eventual 3A state champion Oskaloosa.

Justin Jansen led the Tigers (8-0, 6-0) to victory with TD runs of 2 and 4 yards.

■ **DECORAH 31, CRESTWOOD 7** — Third-ranked Class 3A Decorah's Burke Bockman ran for 121 yards on just six carries — one a 32-yard touchdown scamper — and caught a 10-yard TD pass from Burt Batzler.

Batzler also tossed a 34-yard touchdown pass to Chris Wenthold, and kicked a 32-yard field goal. The Vikings improved to 8-0 overall, 6-0 in District 7, while dropping Crestwood to 6-2, 4-2.

■ **BELLE PLAINE 36, VAN BUREN 0** — With Bill Walton rushing for 205 yards and two touchdowns on 35 carries, the fifth-ranked Plainmen kept their record perfect at 8-0 overall, 6-0 in Class 1A District 7. Visiting Van Buren dropped to 1-7, 1-5.

blocked and another cover only 12 yards after a bad snap.

The result of those blunders was excellent field position for the Trojans. Their four first half scoring drives — three touchdowns and a field goal — covered 46, 26, 42 and 55 yards.

"Field position is critical in any football game," Morgan said. "Certainly Prairie is one of the outstanding football teams in the state, and we were able to take advantage of some turnovers and our kids played fairly aggressively."

The Trojan defense was especially aggressive, limiting the Hawks to 204 total yards. Seventy-four of those yards — including a 1-yard touchdown run by Nick Yanda with 12 seconds left in the game — came in the fourth quarter against west reserves.

"Coach (Dan) Dvorak had a heck of a scheme defensively," Morgan said. "This is the same base defense we've been playing all year and we were fortunate things bounced our way tonight."

Prairie Coach Craig Jelinek

took sole responsibility for his team's poor performance.

"First of all, Reese had his kids ready to play. I didn't have my kids ready to play," he said. "I'm going to take all the blame I can for this. We got beat on both sides of the ball. It was a big game and our kids didn't show up to play, and that's my fault."

The Trojans' first scoring drive ended with a 19-yard field goal off the toe of Nate Kaeding. First half touchdowns came on a 1-yard run by Nathan Robinson, a 26-yard pass from Whisler to Weldon and an 8-yard pass from Whisler to Gian Longo.

West put together its most impressive drive of the game in the third quarter, moving 67 yards in just under 6 minutes thanks to three Whisler completions for 49 yards. Bruce Davis capped it with a 1-yard dive.

The Trojans' final TD came in the fourth quarter when Weldon broke loose on a 53-yard scamper with 10:29 left.
