Speed, 'heart' key factors for ISU

Defenders say there are ways around size differential

Gazette sportswriter - Wrestling has weight classes, golf has handicaps and bowling has the beer frame. Football has no great equalizer.


If you're a 6-foot, 210-pound linebacker, you don't get a baseball bat when a 6-7, 320-pound offensive lineman has you in his sights. Ab Turner knows this, and he's fine with it.

"It's not the size of the player, it's the size of his heart. That's all that matters," said Turner, a junior-college transfer who'll make his first start for Iowa State at 11:30 a.m. Saturday against Texas Christian at Jack Trice Stadium. "Being that we're smaller, we have to try to pull out tricks. We're going to try to avoid blocks as much as

Iowa State's other starting outside linebacker is Jess Beckom, a 6-0, 215-pound transfer from Trinity College in Illinois. The hope is their speed will keep them from being pancakeblock SportsCenter highlights.

"We haven't had backers who could run like this since I've been here," Iowa State Coach Dan McCarney said. "You don't have to be 235 or 240 to be effective, but you better be fast and you better be physical and you better be a great fundamental player to have success on

Big enough?

"Normally, week in and week out, when you line up you're not going to be as big as offensive lines are," McCarney said. "It seems we line up against five hotels anymore when we line up in the Big 12 and Division I.

"You do need quickness and speed. You need to be able to disrupt the quarterback. There's no question I think we've upgraded that area.'

How ever they do it, the Cyclones' front seven must, at the very least, disrupt. Though the Cyclones lost the time-of-possession battle just twice last season, they were outrushed in every game but a 24-17 victory

The fewest yards they allowed were 179 to Baylor; the most 491 to Nebraska.

The lack of a disruptive presence showed up in the turnover margin. Iowa State ranked 10th in the Big 12 with a minus-1.09 a game, including just four interceptions, tying for the league

"We haven't been very physical and haven't had enough team speed in the past," McCar-

"Obviously, people have controlled the ball rather easily against us. Now, our whole front seven has more ability and a little more depth."

Along with Beckom, who McCarney is high on, and Turner, end Reggie Hayward (6-5, 240) and noseguard Clyde Sanders (6-3, 300) will be making their first starts. Tackle James Reed (6-0, 265), end Chin Achebe (6-2, 255) and middle linebacker

The second half didn't go much better with UNI punting on six of eight possesions.


"They kind of caught us off guard for a little bit," Goebbel said.


