Iran opens arms for wrestling

he Orlando Sentinel featured an editorial cartoon last week that was worth a thousand words.

In it, four people — men and women, young and old — are sitting on a park bench and reading newspapers. A nearby garbage basket is overflowing with the sections trumpeting doom, gloom, disasters, the crazy stock market and sex scandals. The four people are reading sports pages. They are smiling.

Dana Summers' cartoon, of course, was a tribute to the home run exploits of Mark McGwire and Sammy Sosa. But another feel-good sports story barely got a blurb in the United States, and probably deserved a lot more.

Last week, the American flag was raised and about 16,000 Iranians stood respectfully as our national anthem played in a Tehran sports arena. It was the kind of moment that had been thought impossible since 1979, since the Islamic revolution, and since Iranian militant students seized the U.S. embassy in Tehran and held 52 Americans hostage for 444 days.

But in 1998, Iranians found a reason to chant "USA! USA!" It was a fairly amazing scene, but one that has gone unnoticed on American soil. The press corps following McGwire and Sosa

around has numbered

several hundred at any given moment.

A trip to Iran might not sound like the ideal vacation to most, but it was the chance of a lifetime for wrestling enthusiast Allen. He traveled with former Iowa head wrestling coach Dan Gable, Hawkeyes assistant coach Tom Brands and Dr. Terry McFarland.

"It all started a couple of months ago when I was talking to Lincoln McIlravy (who earned a bronze medal at the Worlds with seven wins in eight matches)," Allen said. "He said I should go. I didn't know if I could afford it, but the finances came around. It was too good an opportunity to turn down for myself personally, and career-wise.'

Allen telephoned reports to eight U.S. radio stations and ESPN Radio. It was four intense days and nights of wrestling, pomp and circumstance.

"It was a 12,000-seat arena, but they had 16,000 for the championship sessions," Allen said. "They did not stop chanting, singing, dancing and beating drums. It was a show within a show. "And when an Iranian wrestler won,

the place came unglued. U.S. wrestlers came to Iran in February for a groundbreaking visit, and

were received extremely well. The American team, which finished third (Iran won), had a surprisingly large amount of fan support.

'The Iranians' whole attitude was that Americans were here, so this was a true world championship," Allen said. They were so happy, so appreciative the U.S. wrestling team was there.

"When Sam Henson won the gold medal and the U.S. flag was raised to the rafters and they played our national anthem, I got goose bumps. It was a moment in history that I was there to wit-

While he was on a pretty short leash about where he could go in Tehran an amusement park just across the street from his hotel was forbidden to him — Allen said Iranians were very hospitable toward him.

"It was a once-in-a-lifetime experience," he said. "I would like to be able to go to Turkey (for the World Championships) next year and do the same

Xavier bests 1st Metro foe on TD pass late in 4th

The Cedar Rapids Xavier football team pulled out its old, ragged copy of The Yellow Pages, looked up "Passing Game," and dialed itself a winner Thursday

Quarterback Tom Ekland and flanker Zach Schreiber hooked up on a 57-yard touchdown pass with 2:12 left to lift Xavier past Cedar Rapids Kennedy, 21-17, in front of another large crowd of about 5,000 fans at Kingston Stadium.

Schreiber had managed to get behind a Kennedy defender while heading down the left sideline, stretched to make the catch, staggered, then regained his balance and sprinted to the end zone.

"It was a flag (pattern) and I just barely got around the defender and I beat him by just a little bit," Schreiber said. "I was able to keep my balance, but it was close, it was very close. It was a great pass by Tom Ekland. It couldn't have been a better pass. I give him all the credit HIGH SCHOOL FOOTBALL

It was a simple play, according to

'Kennedy has a tough defense but the line gave me all kinds of time to throw. Zach got open, so I hit him," he said. "I can't remember what play I called,

but they did a great job of playing catch,' Xavier Coach Duane Schulte said. "He put it up there, Zach caught it and ran in for a touchdown. Sometimes we refer to football games as basketball games because you just try to outscore people and play great defense. All sports are really the same.'

The outcome leaves no undefeated teams in the Metro area just three weeks in the season. Xavier and Kennedy are 2-1 overall and in the Mississippi Valley Conference.

The game was interrupted for nearly 30 minutes after Xavier's winning touchdown when Kennedy defensive end Scot Knock suffered a neck injury on the conversion attempt.

Knock, the son of Kennedy Coach Don Knock, was strapped to a board, loaded on a stretcher and taken to Mercy Medical Center by ambulance as a precautionary measure.

The younger Knock was showing movement in his arms and legs while being treated on the field, and Coach Knock stayed to coach the game's final minutes. Coach Knock left the stadium right after the game and was unavailable for com-

At press time, a Mercy spokeswoman said Scot Knock was in the emergency room. No details about his condition were

Kennedy had taken a 17-14 lead with 2:52 left on a 29-yard field goal from Brad Fowler. The lead lasted 40 seconds before Ekland and Schreiber hooked up.

Hawkeye veterans eye better, healthier times in final year

IOWA CITY - There's a wonderful photo on the cover of the Iowa media guide of Matt Hughes, Vernon Rollins and Jared DeVries gang-tackling Michigan State tailback Sedrick Irvin in a Big Ten game two years ago.

Hughes has thrown his body in front of Irvin, stopping the powerful runner in his tracks. Rollins has latched onto Irvin from behind, forming a second part of the sandwich. And there's DeVries coming in from the side, just in case. Those were happier - and

much healthier - times for the Iowa Hawkeyes. Hughes, Rollins and DeVries

were sophomores in 1996 and had shown signs of stardom. Won't that be something when they're seniors in 1998, Iowa fans thought.

Well, here it is. Rollins, a rugged 242-pound linebacker, suffered a knee injury against Iowa State last year and is still trying to recover from reconstructive surgery. He's a long way from playing again. DeVries, a two-time all-

American defensive tackle, was plagued by cramps and dehydration in the season opener against Central Michigan, requiring hospitalization. Now he's battling foot and knee problems. Hughes, Iowa's leading tack-

High-profile ASA team going through drivers in '98

American Speed Association car owner Scott LaFavre of Lakeville, Minn., reached a pinnacle in the summer of 1997, a season of bounty that must now seem like the distant past.

It was a perfect fit. LaFavre had put second-year ASA driver Kevin Cywinski behind the wheel of his ACDelco Challenge Series Pontiac, and Cywinski responded by winning the ASA's national championship.

He became the first driver since Mark Martin - now of NASCAR Winston Cup fame - to win

the ASA's rookie of the year award and the national title in back-to-back seasons. Martin did it in 1977-78.

When the summer of 1998 rolled around, Cywinski was gone, having moved on to seek fame and fortune in the NASCAR ranks. But a driver change wouldn't slow the big-monied LaFavre Racing Team.

In fact, when the ASA came to Hawkeye Downs in July for the Hawkeye Downs 300, LaFavre announced his enterprise had grown into a two-car team, with rookie driver Johnny Sauter joining veteran Joe Nott behind the wheels of

Cedar Falls sets sights on West

Tigers trip Kennedy in division meet at Hunters Ridge

Waterloo West has gotten most of the acclaim in boys' golf the past couple of years. With good reason, considering the Wahawks state team championship last fall.

But there's another school up Waterloo way that's trying to horn in on some of that attention.

"I think we've got a real good - better than last year,' team said Jim Nygren about his mates at Cedar Falls. "We're looking to go to state and to do pretty well at state.

"And to beat West."

Cedar Falls didn't go head to head with its Metro rival Thursday, but had enough firepower to subdue six other schools at a Mississippi Valley Conference Mississippi Division gathering at Hunters Ridge.

Behind Nygren's medalist round of 2-over-par 74, the Tigers shot a 314, six strokes ahead of runner-up Cedar Rapids Kennedy. In the chase for the overall division championship, Cedar Falls has a tworound, 36-hole team total of 613, 12 shots ahead of Dubuque Wah-

With one more division meet to play, Nygren leads the overall medalist race by one shot over Dubuque Wahlert's Brett KaufHIGH SCHOOL GOLF

"I hit a lot of greens and didn't putt too bad," said Nygren, who went 1-over 37 on both the front and back nines. "I just hit the ball pretty good, hit it pretty straight. I just tried to stay out of trouble.'

Which is sometimes hard to do at Hunters Ridge, particularly on the tight back nine.

Like Nygren, Cedar Rapids Kennedy's Jeff Gudenkauf shot a front-nine 37. But Gudenkauf couldn't match his rival on the back, going 3-over 39 for a round of 76, good for second place.

Gudenkauf's lone birdie was on the par-5 sixth hole.

"I've been playing pretty bad the last couple of weeks, so I went and got a lesson," said Gudenkauf, who won the state Maxfli championship over the summer. "I was hitting my irons pretty well today. I wasn't real straight off the tee, but I was hitting my irons. I putted pretty well, too. The putts were dropping, so I scored pretty

Third place went to Cedar Rapids Xavier's Rob Byers, whose 5-over-par 77 was 20 shots better than at the MVC Super Meet. That tournament at Dubuque's Bunker Hill served as the first of the three divisional

"I work here, but that didn't help me the last time I played out here. I shot an 89," said

"I'm really excited about the future of this team," LaFavre said in July. "Joe Nott and John Sauter are talented young drivers who put on a real show for the fans.

It wasn't a perfect fit.

Neither Nott nor Sauter is still employed by LaFavre Racing, and neither driver will return to the team in 1999, according to LaFavre team spokesman. The ACDelco Challenge Series

is back at Hawkeye Downs Speedway Saturday for the first running of the ACDelco 300. The July races are called the Hawkeye Downs 300, the first September race in 1996 was the Iowa 300, and last year's September race was called the Pontiac Excitement 300.

Despite the upheaval, LaFavre racing will have a car in Saturday's Hawkeye Downs field. It will be driven by Bloomington, Minn., driver Ted Smokstad.

"Joe Nott was injured in a crash at Pikes Peak International Speedway in August, and he broke his wrist," said Duane Frederickson, LaFavre's marketing director. "He's had some ups-and-downs with it, and while he's tried to drive with it, it's still causing him some problems and he needs surgery. He's going to miss the last two rac-

Smokstad is an ASA veteran who has also raced in the NAS-CAR Busch Grand National Series and the ARCA Series. He finished ninth at last September's Pontiac Excitement 300.

"He's an experienced driver and we know he'll do a good job wheeling the Tecumseh Pontiac at Hawkeye Downs," Frederickson said.

There were persistent rumors that the LaFarve ride would go to former ASA driver Brad Loney of Cedar Rapids, but Loney had other commitments and isn't expected in town this week-

It's been a tough season for Nott, and for ASA rookie Adam Petty, the center of much attention during the series' visit to Hawkeye Downs in July.

At the Miller 300 at Minnesota State Fairgrounds Sept. 7, Petty's crew chief, Chris Bradley, was killed in a pit road accident while Petty was pulling back out on the track. Bradley was Nott's former crew chief.

"It was such a shock for all of Nott said. "Chris and I went through a lot together and remained close despite working on competing teams. He was a great talent and good friend."

Petty, 17th in the ACDelco Challenge Series points, missed last week's race at Jennerstown Speedway in Pennsylvania to attend Bradley's funeral.

The fatality was ruled accidental after an ASA investigation, and Petty is expected to be in Saturday's field, according to Spree Racing Team spokeswom- Head straight for the Gaan Amy Hunerberg.


