Waterloo East, which scored the first points against West High in the first half this season, only trailed 17-6 at halftime before running out of steam in the final 24 minutes.

"We didn't come out with intensity in the first half. They came out pumped up," West High senior defensive end Tyler Luebke said. "We weren't playing with our hearts. We were thinking too much. We got down on ourselves and didn't stay positive. We were not playing with good team unity.

Defending state champion West High (3-0), which has a 16-game winning streak, turned it up in the second half and outscored Waterloo

EDAR RAPIDS — Derek Kielkopf rushed for 180 yards and two touchdowns to lead Cedar Rapids Kennedy to a 45-14 Mississippi Valley Conference win over Cedar Rapids Xavier Friday night at Saints Field.

Kielkopf, who has 407 rushing yards in the last

Kennedy (2-1) built a 23-0 first-half lead on a 1-yard Phil Coonrod touchdown run, a safety on a Drake Busch blocked punt out of the Xavier end zone, a Kielkopf 5-yard score and Steve Breen's 37-yard touchdown pass to Bryan Rempt.

Xavier (1-2) collected itself and sliced the lead to 23-14 thanks to touchdown passes of 65 and 12 yards from Tom Ekland to Andre Hedgepeth. Playing catchup, the Saints threw 38 passes in the game, completing only nine. Six went to Hedgepeth for 169 yards.

But Kennedy ripped off the final three touchdowns of the game. First, Kielkopf rushed 23 yards for a score. Brett Kellogg then ran 19 yards for a touchdown. Breen, the backup quarterback who rushed for 64 yards, got 42 of those on the game's final touchdown run.

The bigger Cougars blasted away for 286 yards on the ground and 401 overall. At one point, they had 151 yards to minus-8 for the Saints, who have allowed 100 points in their last two games.

Xavier found rushing yards extremely hard to attain, getting just 40. So it passed and passed. Ekland was nine of 36 for 201 yards and never got intercepted.
