

Pair of blocked punts spur the Spartans

SOLON — The Solon Spartans improved to 9-0, 7-0 in the district, after their Friday night 31-12 victory over Mid-Prairie.

Special teams paved the way to the Spartans win at Spartan Field.

"Our special teams haven't done much this season, but we stepped it up tonight," said Spartan Ben O'Loughlin, who blocked a punt in the win.

"And tonight we were able to make some plays."

In the first half all of the No. 1-ranked Spartans' 21 points came after big plays on special teams. The Spartans started their scoring spree in the second quarter after Craig Volk blocked and recovered a Hawks' punt on their 28-yard

line.

Two plays later Spartan running back DJ Jedlicka broke free over the middle and scored on a 26-yard touchdown run.

The Hawks then got the ball back with 9:39 minutes to go in the half. Mid-Prairie was only able to gain one yard on the drive and when Hawks punter Adam Kos tried his second punt of the evening, the Spartans' special teams made another big play when they blocked

this one as well.

O'Loughlin came from the side and blocked the second Hawks' punt of the night. Solon linebacker Mike Miller caught the blocked punt close to the line of scrimmage and gave the Spartans great field position again.

As the Spartans' offense got the ball on the Hawks' 15-yard line they were able to convert on another turnover. On the second play from scrimmage,

again, Solon scored their second touchdown of the night when quarterback Adam Hadenfeldt threw a 12-yard pass to T.J. Bevans.

"We noticed that they played soft coverage on us, and that's why we called this play," Hadenfeldt said. "T.J. (Bevans) hadn't even practiced in two weeks, but he just made a great play."

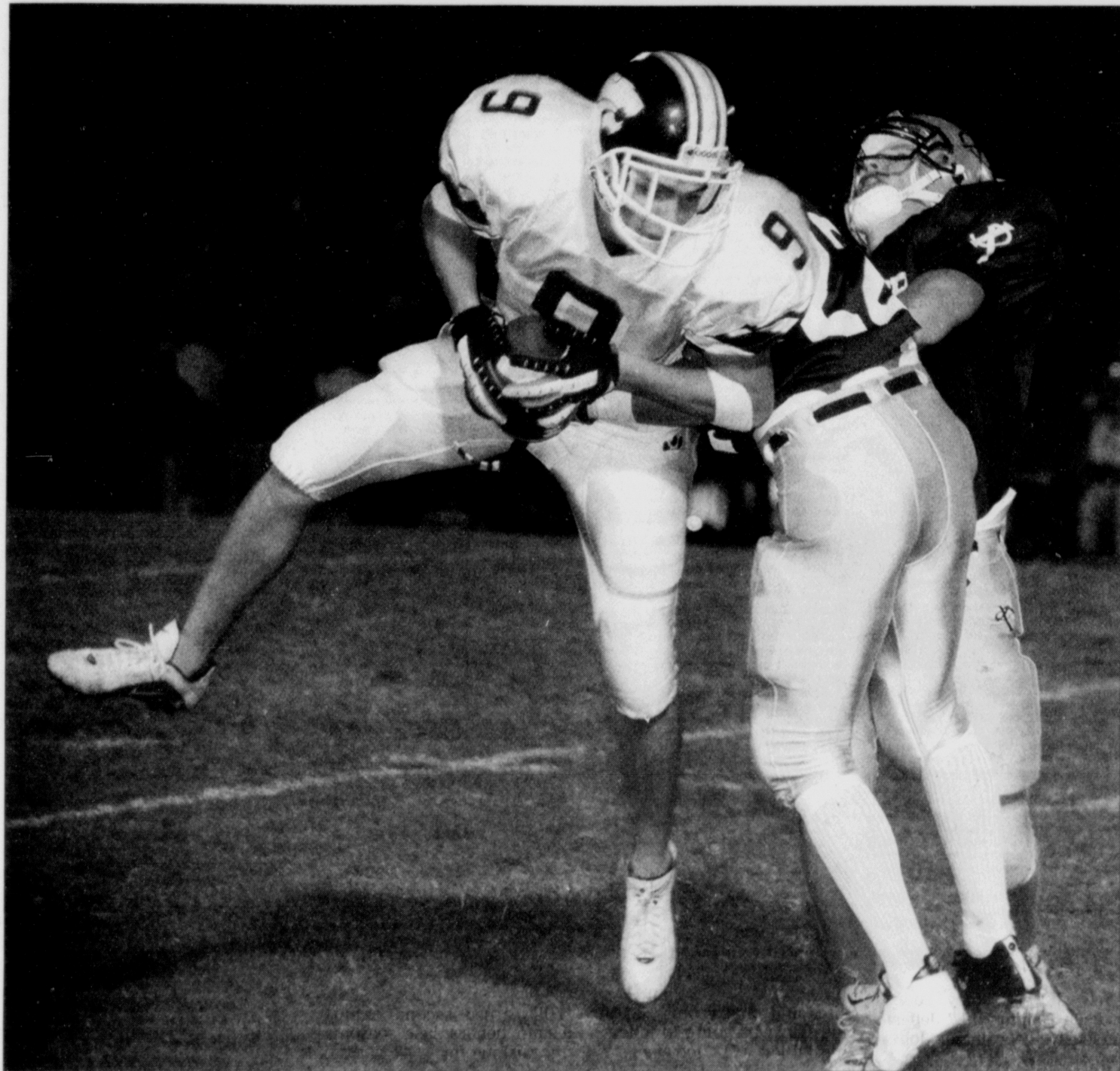
Although Solon was shutting out Mid-Prairie, 21-0, in the

first half, the Hawks never gave up after intermission.

Mid-Prairie got its first score early in the fourth quarter when Hawks quarterback Seth Fisher led his team on a 9-play, 69-yard scoring drive to make the score 31-6.

Fisher completed 6 of 8 passes for 52 yards on this drive. He scored on a 10-yard quarterback scramble.

Fisher threw for 204 yards on 15 completions in the game.

Xavier prevails in OT

CEDAR RAPIDS — With the University of Wisconsin marching band in the house, was there any doubt this one would go into overtime?

The Badger band has watched three OT games involving its football team this

season. Make that watched four OT games all together now, after Cedar Rapids Xavier's 20-14 overtime with Friday night at Saints Field over Cedar Rapids Kennedy.

Justin Peck's 1-yard touchdown dive on third down ended the third and undoubtedly the most exciting football version of the battle of 42nd St.

"This was just a big win for our seniors," said junior full-back Peck, who earlier in the game had caught a 56-yard touchdown pass. "We wanted to make sure they were going out on top."

Xavier (4-5) did go out on

top, thanks to Peck's determined run and a huge defensive stand on Kennedy's overtime possession. The Cougars faced a fourth down and less than a yard, but six-foot-four Matt Keel was stuffed on a quarterback sneak attempt.

"Give credit to our whole defense. Everybody just stepped up there," said Xavier Coach Duane Schulte, after watching his team and several members of the Xavier student body do a celebratory version of the Chicken Dance with the Wisconsin band on the field after the game. Band members, who will play at today's Iowa-Wisconsin game in Iowa City, stayed the night in town as guests of several Xavier parents.

After the stop of Kennedy, Xavier took the ball and ran Peck three times up the middle. He scored on his third dive.

"This is a very tough conference," Schulte said. "and we were just a couple of plays away from being 6-3 and being in the playoffs. It was very

Xavier dominated the first half, more specifically, the Xavier dominated the first half, holding Kennedy to only 45 total yards. The Saints offense, meanwhile, nearly quadrupled that total with 171 yards. But oddly enough, it was neither Xavier's offense nor its defense that set up the only points of the half.

We're talking about the Saints' special teams, Adam Jensen in particular, he recovered a muffed punt return, at

the Cougar 18 very late in the first quarter, eventually setting up John Winter's 5-yard option run with 12 seconds to go in the first first quarter. Matt Behmer's extra-point kick made it 7-0 Xavier at halftime.

Kennedy (2-7) finally got things going in the second half. The Cougars took the opening kickoff and drove 73 yards on seven plays to tie it at 7-7.

Keel completed two big pass plays, both to tight end Grant Jacobs. An 18-yarder over the middle went for a touchdown.

Xavier re-took the lead before quarter's end, though, on Peck's long catch-and-run touchdown. Peck caught a pass in the flat from Winter, broke a pair of tackles and rambled down the sidelines to the end zone.

A 50-yard pass play from Keel to Troy Blankenship set up Keel's 3-yard QB sneak touchdown with 6:29 left in the fourth quarter, tying the game back up at 14-14. Neither team seriously threatened the rest of regulation.
