

Zeal-ous Lions outlast Trojans

Andy Zeal's 3 TDs lead Linn-Mar to win

MARION — The Linn-Mar pom squad stood in the middle of Armstrong Field at half-time, smiles fixed on their faces. A

boom-box malfunction delayed their routine.

All worked out fine in the end, though.

The same could be said for the

home football team. Late starters, big finishers. And a happy ending.

Bitten by penalties and general ineffectiveness through the first half, the Lions finally subdued Waterloo East, 34-20, in the season-opening Mississippi Valley Conference football game for both teams Friday night at Armstrong Field.

No, the Lions weren't always a well-oiled machine. But they were plenty Zeal-ous.

Andy Zeal, a junior running back, netted 188 yards on 30 carries in his varsity debut. He scored three touchdowns, capped by a 20-yarder with 1:16 remaining that finally put the Trojans away.

"It was great running behind our big line," said Zeal, who did most of

his damage behind 295-pound left tackle Sam Kuster. "We had a lot of first-game jitters, but once we got settled in and settled down, we were OK."

Linn-Mar trailed, 7-6, at halftime. The Lions led, 19-7, after three quarters before East took a 20-19 lead on a pair of scores by Dalane Morehead early in the fourth period.

The Trojans' advantage lasted less than a minute.

Quarterback Dustin Palmer scrambled away from two would-be tacklers and launched a 51-yard strike to Perry Knapp along the right sideline to put the Lions in front, 27-20, with 6:49 remaining.

"We were just in sync on that play," Palmer said.

"We had some problems (offensive) in the first half. Once we made some adjustments, everything worked out. Our line is so big and works so hard. We knew we could run behind big Sammy."

East, which surrendered 39 points per game in a winless campaign last year, stymied the Lions early on. Linn-Mar picked up a couple of first downs before penalties choked the first drive. The next two possessions went three-and-out.

The Lions finally broke through on Zeal's first touchdown, a 1-yard blast with 2:38 left in the first half. That got Linn-Mar within 7-6 at the break, and provided a precursor for a wild second half.

Zeal's antics more than atoned for

an early gaffe. He muffed an East punt, and the Trojans recovered at the Linn-Mar 30. East then took a 7-0 lead when Everett Roberts scored on a 15-yard quarterback draw on the first play of the second quarter.

"I wanted to make up for that fumble," he said. "That was a big play that helped put them ahead."

Zeal scored on a 6-yard run early in the third quarter to give Linn-Mar a 12-7 advantage, then Palmer hooked up with Nick Cappussi for a 4-yard touchdown to make it 19-7.

LINN-MAR WILL face Cedar Rapids Prairie next Friday at Wall Field. East will host Cedar Rapids Xavier.

Tigers tame Saints

Big plays power Cedar Falls

CEDAR RAPIDS — The Xavier Saints had nearly twice as many yards, twice as many plays and twice as many first downs as the Cedar Falls Tigers Friday night at Saints Field.

That's why the Saints had to feel twice as bad.

Cedar Falls, capitalizing on its own big plays and Xavier's

big mistakes, spanked the Saints, 32-21, on opening night in the Mississippi Valley Conference football wars.

Xavier rolled up 485 yards and 22 first downs as quarterback John Winter hit 24 of 42 passes for 284 yards, but those glittery numbers were not enough to stop the Tigers.

Jonathan Zanders returned a fumble 90 yards for one Cedar Falls touchdown, John Mershon galloped 72 yards on a kickoff return for another TD for the Tigers, and Mershon scored on a 43-yard touchdown pass from Jordan Juel.

Those big plays offset Xavier's ball-control offense. The Saints had 87 plays from scrimmage compared to only 39 snaps for the visitors, but it all went for naught.

Chad Davidson caught 14 passes for 180 yards and a 24-yard touchdown for Xavier, but the Cedar Falls defense rose to the occasion most of the night — thanks to five turnovers by the Saints.

Cedar Falls proved there is life after Terrance Freeney, the record-setting tailback who is attending a junior college in North Dakota these days. The Tigers collected only 10 first downs and 258 yards, but that was enough on this night.

Mershon, replacing Freeney at tailback, carried 10 times for 76 yards and three touchdowns. Cedar Falls completed only two passes — one to an offensive lineman on a deflected pass.

Matt Erusha, a top defensive lineman for Xavier, suffered an apparent wrist injury early in the second half and did not return to action.

Xavier tailback Justin Peck carried 26 times for 131 yards and two touchdowns.

Same old Iowa City High

Nice debut for Little Hawks coach

CEDAR RAPIDS — The offense is still explosive. The points still get put up in droves.

It's just the way the Iowa City High football team got all those points Friday night that was a little different.

That would be through the air, where City High was most

effective in its 31-14 season-opening win over Cedar Rapids Kennedy at Kingston Stadium.

The Little Hawks, known as a traditionally strong ground team, got three touchdown passes from quarterback Connor Jostes. Two of those went to University of Iowa receiver recruit Calvin Davis, who

caught five passes for 76 yards in his much-anticipated varsity debut.

Jostes also ran for another touchdown and kicked a field goal. He completed 11 of 21 passes in the game for 200 yards.

It was all quite a debut for new head coach Dan Sabers.

"It's been awhile since we've thrown that much," said Jostes, a senior making his first varsity start as well. "We're real excited. We've been waiting a long time to do this. We've got the personnel to throw 20 to 30 times a game."

"We've got quite a bit of stuff going on," said Sabers. "I think as coaches we wanted to find out what we had, so we were doing a lot of different things (offensively) and taking a look at some things. Now we've got things to evaluate and say, 'Hey, what are we really like here?' and kind of go from there."

What City High was like last night was full of athleticism

and big-play passing potential. That's why it lined up in three, four and even five-receiver sets much of the game.

And it took all of three plays for the Little Hawks to begin their air assault. That's when Jostes connected with tight end Warren McDuffie — another Iowa recruit — on a 60-yard bomb.

Two plays later, Jostes rolled out left and found Matt Rhoades wide open in the flat for a 12-yard touchdown and a 6-0 lead.

The Little Hawks then cranked it up a notch in the second quarter, scoring three more times.

The first came when Jostes hit Davis on a 34-yard post pattern with 11:28 left. Davis also caught a two-point conversion pass for a 14-0 lead.

A little while later, that duo hooked up again for a 22-yard TD. A blocked punt help set up the final City High score of the half, a 15-yard run from Jostes with 4:09 left.

Kennedy took the ensuing kickoff and drove 80 yards on 14 plays to get on the scoreboard when quarterback Matt Keel hit a leaping Mike Hachey in the end zone from 22 yards out on the last play of the half for the touchdown.

"I guess I knew they were going to throw that much just by hearing things through the coach's grapevine," Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis said. "But when they've got that much speed and we don't, that's tough to beat."

The only second-half points came in the fourth quarter: a 28-yard Jostes field goal for City High and a 25-yard touchdown pass from Keel to Nick Mohinkle for Kennedy.

Keel, who completed 18 of 34 passes for 219 yards, then completed a two-point conversion pass to Hachey for the game's final margin. Hachey caught eight passes for 100 yards.
