

## Cougars roll past Rams

**UBUQUE** — Jared Godbey ran for 173 yards and three touchdowns and Matt Keel threw three touchdown passes to lead Cedar Rapids Kennedy's 49-7 rout of Dubuque Senior on Friday night at Dalzell Field.

Godbey scored on runs of 5, 20 and 10 yards. His first two scores sparked Kennedy's 21-point first quarter.

"The line just fired off the ball," said Godbey, whose final

Keel's 25-yard touchdown pass to Grant Jacobs in the first quarter jumped Kennedy's lead to 21-0.

Keel fired touchdown strikes of 45 and 67 yards to Nick Mohwinkle in the second quarter boosting Kennedy's lead to 35-0 by halftime.

"We executed very well," Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis said. "We didn't have the best week of practice."

"I wasn't sure what to expect, but we executed well offensively and defensively."

Kennedy rolled up 334 yards of rushing offense and 219 passing yards.

"This has been a long time coming," Lewis said. "Last year we struggled offensively, threw the ball well but could not get the running game going."

"This is something we wanted to focus on. Hopefully, we turned a corner."

Kennedy (2-1) limited Senior (0-3) to 64 total yards. The Rams had only two yards of rushing offense.

"They were a tough football team," Senior Coach Pat Murphy said. "They played good defense and had a lot of weapons on offense."

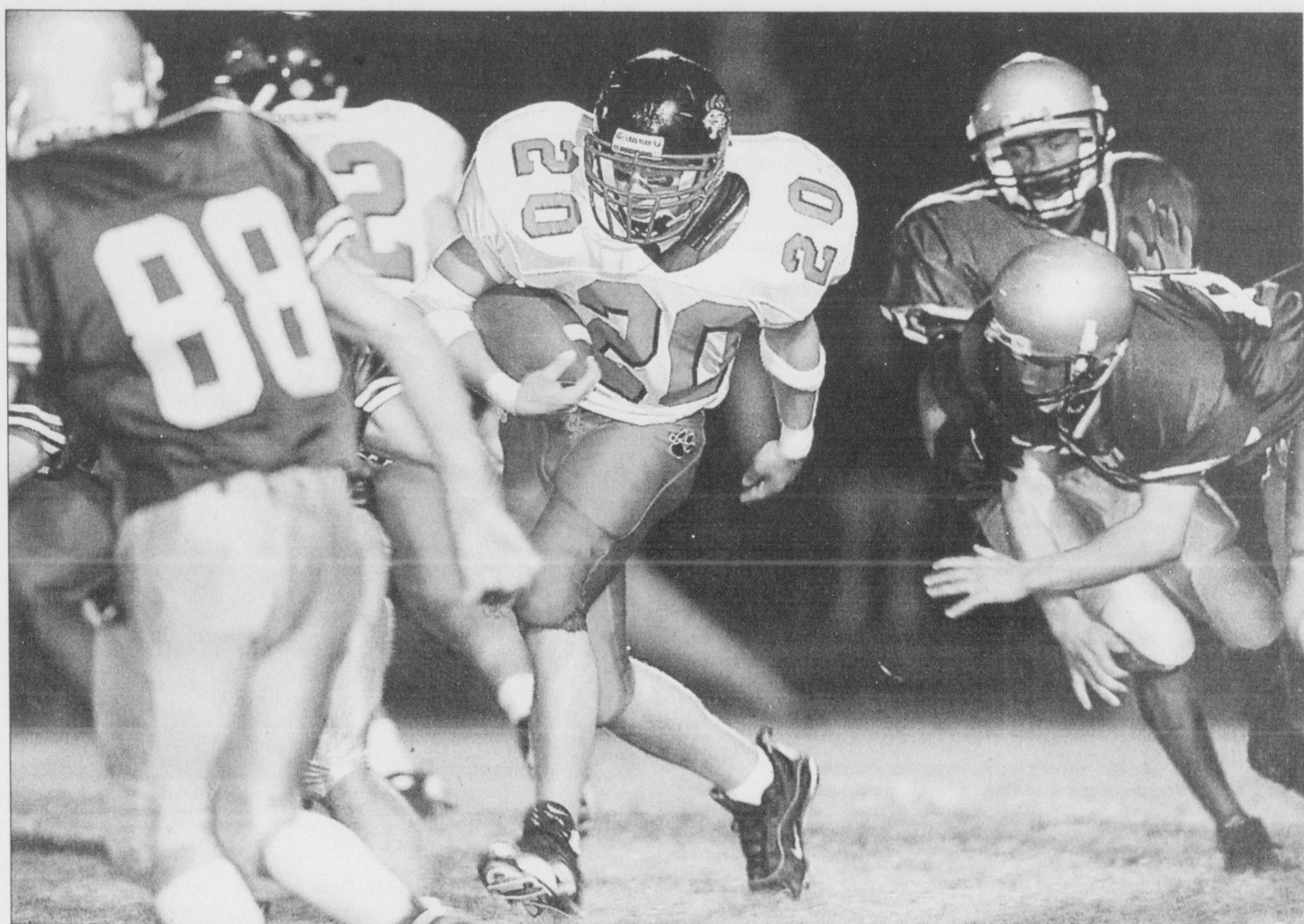
The Blue Devils (2-1, 1-0) held Springville (0-3, 0-1) to 88 yards.

## 4th-quarter rally falls short

Late West score dumps Linn-Mar

**I**OWA CITY — Talk about a test of character.

Iowa City West got a tough test Friday night from Linn-Mar in a Mississippi Valley Conference football game, and passed thanks to a clutch fourth-quarter scoring drive that enabled the Trojans to pull out a 28-27 victory.

"This game was so emotional. It was a big play here and a big play there," West Coach Dan Dvorak said. "We talked to the kids about never ever giving up. That's what happened tonight."

Mistake-prone West squandered a 14-point lead in the fourth quarter and fell behind, 27-21, after Nick Cappussi's 28-yard scoring run for Linn-Mar with 3 minutes, 35 seconds remaining.

Placekicker Nick Kray missed the extra point, which proved costly.

With 3:28 left, the Trojans took over possession on their own 31.

Quarterback Grant Norland

hit Michael Haywood with a 24-yard pass on the first play. Running back Greg Coleman then picked up 20 yards on two carries, followed by Norland's 19-yard scramble, which put the ball at the 6.

Coleman did the honors, bullying in for the 6-yard score with 1:25 left.

Nick Miller's conversion gave the Trojans the winning point.

"I think this showed a lot of character in our team," Coleman said. "It shows we have to come out hard every week. This week was the hardest we've practiced all year."

West (1-2) avoided its first 0-3 start since 1992. Linn-Mar falls to 1-2.

Coleman finished with 261 yards on 27 carries and four touchdowns.

"Greg Coleman is a great back, but there's not a great back in this world who doesn't have people up front making holes for him," Dvorak said.

Coleman's first score was a school-record 98-yard run with 5:22 left in the second quarter, which gave West a 14-0 lead. Rick Smith held the previous mark for the longest running play in school history with a 96-yard scamper against Iowa

City High in 1974.

Coleman, a 6-foot, 200-pound sophomore, took the handoff from Norland and sprinted down the left sideline, cutting back at the Lion 30-yard line to avoid the tackle of Dustin Palmer on his way to the end zone.

"I'm just going what I do," Coleman said. "I'm just trying to run."

On West's first play from scrimmage this season against Cedar Rapids Prairie, Coleman dashed 95 yards for a touchdown. This season, Coleman has 591 yards on 71 carries and seven touchdowns.

**TRAILING 21-7**, Linn-Mar put a scare into West in the fourth quarter, scoring three touchdowns in just under six minutes.

After a bad snap over West punter Jeremy Housel's head resulted in a 17-yard loss and gave the Lions the ball at the Trojan 29, the quarterback Palmer hit Shawn Freese with a 29-yard touchdown pass with 9:13 remaining.

The Lions didn't stop there, as the Trojans continued to play giveaway on their next possession.

On 2nd-and-4 from the West 28, Norland hit Coleman in the helmet with a pitch, and Linn-Mar covered at the 26.

Three plays later, Cappussi scored on a 5-yard run. Kray's conversion tied the game at 21 with 7:30 left.

"Give Linn-Mar credit. Boy, their kids battled all night long," Dvorak said. "It was a game in which it's unfortunate that either team had to lose."

Despite his offensive exploits, Coleman made things tough on the Trojan defense, losing fumbles on successive plays in the third quarter.

Cappussi recovered the first fumble at the West 35. Six plays later, the Lions turned the ball over on downs at the 18.

However, Linn-Mar capitalized on Coleman's next fumble, which was recovered by J.D. Triggs at the Trojan 16.

Andy Zeal did the honors, scoring on a 1-yard run with 5:50 left, pulling the Lions within 14-7. The drive was kept alive on Palmer's 10-yard scramble on 4th-and-9 from the 15.

Nick Hamsel rushed for 128 yards and two touchdowns as the Vikings won at home. Brandon Moser completed 8 of 13 passes for 134 yards and two touchdowns.
