

# Warriors pounce on Kennedy early

Washington scores 6 touchdowns in first half in 55-12 victory

CEDAR RAPIDS — It was seldom cute and only occasionally crisp, but the Cedar Rapids Washington offense clicked when it counted Friday night.

The Class 4A second-ranked Warriors scored six first-half touchdowns on plays from scrimmage of more than 24 yards and went on to bury Cedar Rapids Kennedy, 55-12, in a Mississippi Valley Conference marathon played in front of an estimated 6,000 fans at Kingston Stadium.

Junior tailback Travis Rhone scored four touchdowns and senior wide-out Adrian Arrington two as Washington used the onslaught to improve to 2-0 while Kennedy dropped to 0-2.

"They're exactly what we thought they'd be," Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis said of Washington during comments on KCRG-AM radio at half-

"Speed is a hard thing to make up for. They have it and we don't.

admirably last night, finishing with 203 yards on 16

He wasn't the Warriors' only offensive weapon, however. Maurice Cantrell carried the ball only three times but finished with 110 yards and a touchdown, and quarterback Warren Suess completed three passes for 124 yards.

Washington totaled 476 yards of offense, including 352 on the ground.

Kennedy struggled against the rock-solid Washington defense, finishing with 253 total yards, most after this thing was long decided. Quarterback Mark Paterson threw 37 times, completing 14 for 153

The Warriors put this one away early and built a 40-6 first-half lead by taking advantage of outstanding field position and the outstanding big-play abilities of its numerous talented athletes.

Their six first-half scoring drives required a total of 18

Rhone, the only non-senior in Washington's starting lineup, had first-half touchdown runs of 24, 39 and 53 yards and had 195 rushing yards at intermission.

Arrington caught touchdown passes of 70 and 39 yards from Suess and fullback Cantrell busted straight up the gut for an 81-yard touchdown trot.

The Warriors had 385 yards lins. Rhone filled that hole of total offense at halftime

despite losing the time-of-possession battle. It was the only battle Washington lost all night.

Kennedy scored its lone touchdown of the first half after recovering a lost Washington fumble on the Warrior Six plays later Curtis Meier caught a 7-yard touchdown pass from Mark Paterson to make the score 14-6 with 2:51 left in the first quarter.

Washington answered with 26 unanswered points in the second quarter.

Kennedy quarterback Paterson threw 28 passes in the first half, completing 12 for 115 yards.

The Warriors tacked on a pair of touchdowns early in the third period on a 2-yard plunge from Rhone and a 45-yard punt return Tyrell Calhoun.

Kennedy finished the scoring when Paterson hit Brad Christensen with a 24-yard scoring pass with 7:39 left in the game.

Washington plays at Linn-Mar and Kennedy hosts Iowa City High at Kingston next Friday night.
