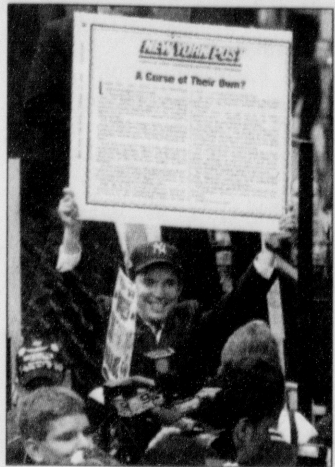

Big, thrilling sweep

First City High, now Xavier tops I.C. West in a heartstopper

IOWA CITY — Cedar Rapids Xavier doesn't have the biggest players in the Mississippi Valley Conference. Or the fastest. Or the strongest.

But their will to win is a different story.

The Class 4A 10th-ranked Saints completed an Iowa City sweep Friday night with a heartstopping 32-31 overtime victory over No. 8 West High at Trojan Field.

Xavier had been winless in five previous games against West.

Xavier (6-1) handed City High its only loss of 2003 in the season opener at Bates Field.

"We have so much respect for these programs down here," Xavier Coach Duane Schulte said.

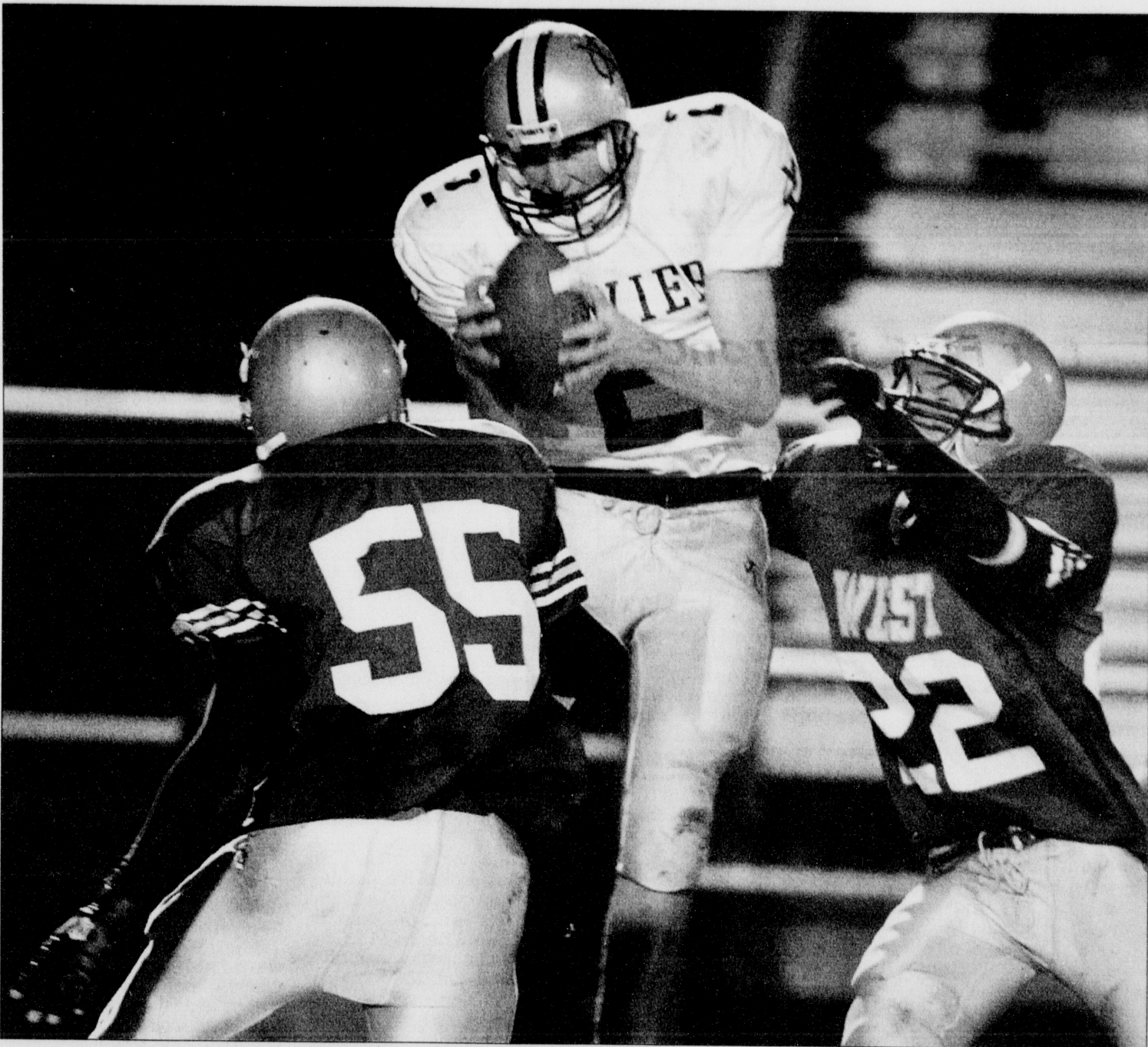
"We were not going to come down here and be intimidated. We just came down here and tried to win."

That was obvious all night, but particularly in overtime.

West (5-2) got the ball first in the extra session. After all-state tailback Grey Coleman gained nine yards on first down, fullback Tony Teel scored from a yard out. Bryan Watkins' extra point gave the Trojans a 31-24 lead — their first advantage of the game.

Xavier, which rebounded from a 49-14 loss to No. 2 Washington last week, countered on second down when quarterback Mike Sayre rolled out and found Nick Weber for a 10-yard TD.

Kennedy wins third straight with thriller over Linn-Mar

CEDAR RAPIDS — Once a football team is eliminated from playoff contention, it has nothing to play for, right?

If that's so, it's a premise no one bothered to explain to the Cedar Rapids Kennedy Cougars.

Junior Curtis Meier blasted into the end zone from 1 yard out with 19.6 seconds left in the game to lead Kennedy past Linn-Mar, 34-27, in a Mississippi Valley Conference thriller Friday night at Kingston Stadium.

After starting the season with four straight losses, Ken-

nedy (3-4) won its third straight and kept its hopes alive of finishing the season with a winning record. Linn-Mar fell to 2-5.

The Lions fell behind by 14 points in the first quarter only to rally to tie the game at 27 when Dustin Lincoln scored on a 25-yard run with 10:54 left in the game.

The Cougars gave the ball back to Linn-Mar on a loss of downs on its own 25, but a 15-play drive to the Kennedy 26 produced no points.

The Cougars took over with 4:06 left on the clock, and with Meier picking up 5 and 6 yards a pop, they marched to

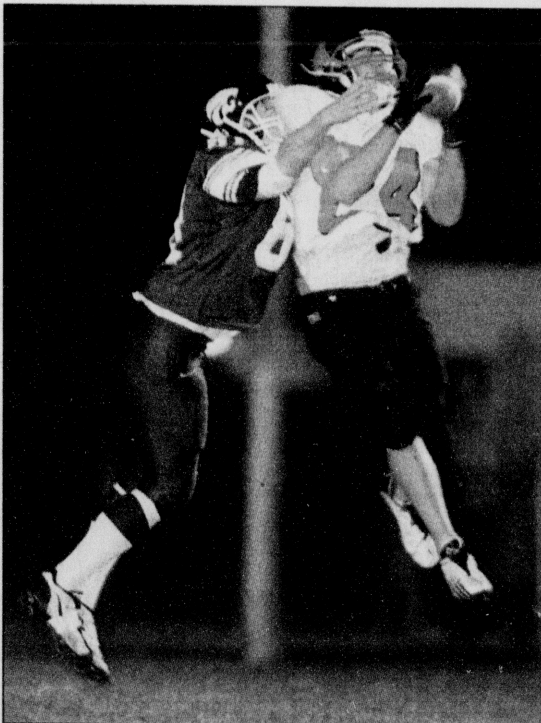
the 1-yard line where Meier scooted in for the game-winner.

"I couldn't be more proud of a football team," Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis said. "There were many times they could have folded up tent. It was a great team effort. What a great win for Kennedy High School."

Kennedy got slaughtered in the stat book, but it didn't matter. Linn-Mar finished with 387 yards to Kennedy's 314, and the Lions had 21 first downs to the Cougars' 12.

Meier was terrific for the Cougars, carrying 20 times

Fox powers Prairie past Waterloo East

CEDAR RAPIDS — Cedar Rapids Prairie's star junior Glen Fox made one senior-like play after another, and another, and another Friday night.

Fox, a 6-foot-3 split end and safety, scored three first-half touchdowns to spark Prairie to a 34-7 victory over Waterloo East in a Mississippi Valley Conference football game at John Wall Field.

The Hawks (3-4) kept alive their hopes of a winning season and sent East to its 34th straight loss.

Fox hooked up with quarterback Joe Cooper on two fade patterns that resulted in scores. Fox also intercepted a pass and raced 49 yards for a touchdown.

"He's a two-year starter and he played like it," Prairie Coach Craig Jelinek said. "He played like he expects to and like we expect him to."

Fox, complimenting his teammates on all three scores, said he'd never scored three touchdowns in a half.

"The line did a great job up front allowing Joe enough time to find me," Fox said. "It was a total team effort."

Fox's first TD was a 20-yarder. He lined up split to the left and appeared to have drawn double coverage. But before the snap, he made a hand motion to Cooper.

"That was supposed to be a quick slant," Fox said. "But the back crashed in. We did a little audible and it worked out well."

Charles Showalter's blocked punt set up Prairie's third TD, an 8-yard strike from Cooper to Fox on third-and-goal.

Fox made it 27-0 when he stopped one of East's better drives with an interception on third-and-10.

Fox and most of Prairie's other starters went to the sidelines midway through the third period and the Hawks ahead, 34-0. That was shortly after Prairie tailback T.J. Collins burst outside and raced

80 yard to the end zone.

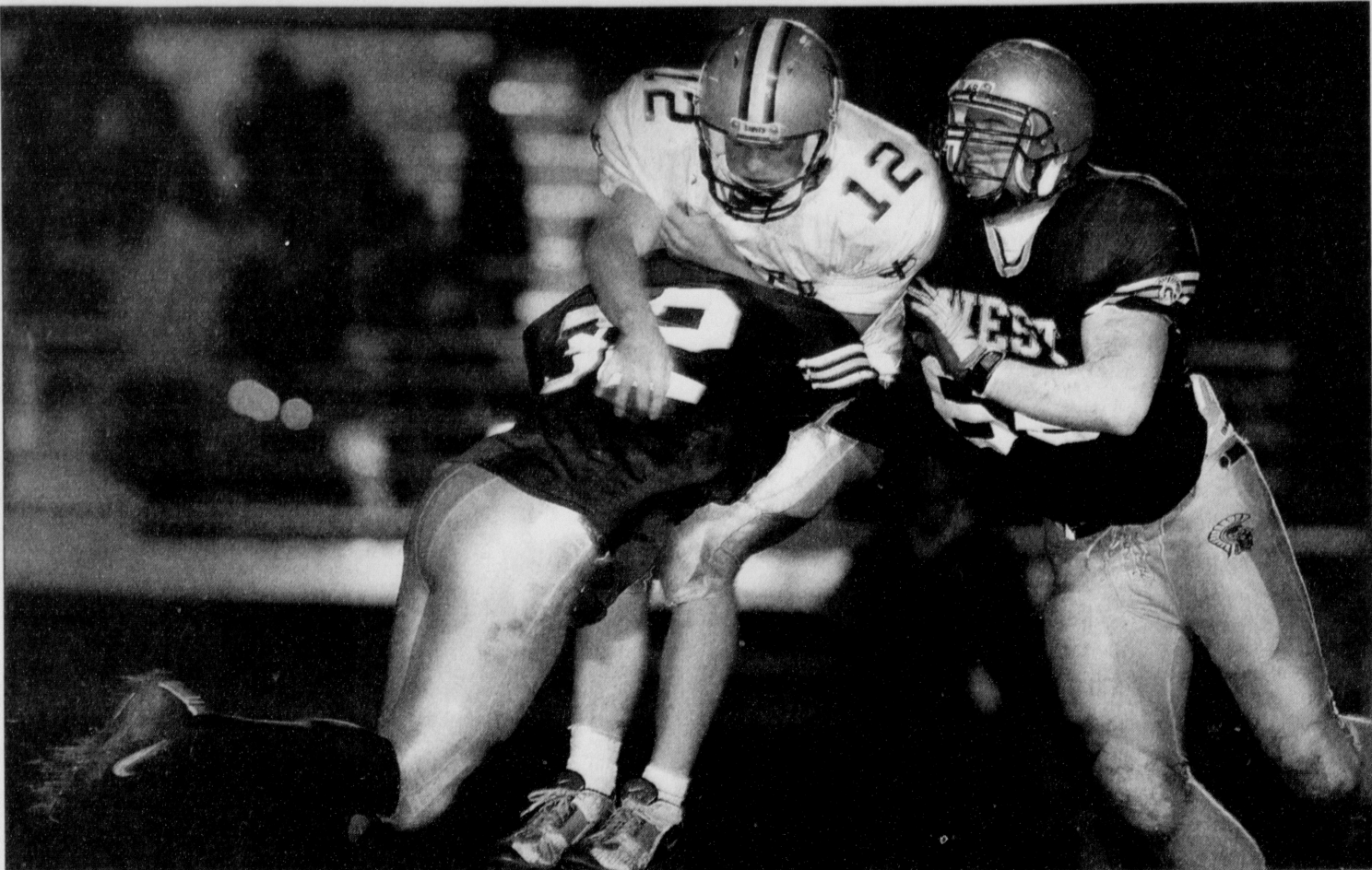
When the Prairie first-team defense left, East had just 45 total yards.

East averted a shutout with a minute remaining when Monroe Tillman hauled in a 31-yard pass from Josh Way. That was the Trojans' long-gainer on a 151-yard night.

Prairie's Collins had 142 rushing yards on 14 carries. Ricky Robinson managed 68 yards rushing on 19 carries for the Trojans.

for 86 yards and catching four passes for another 54, including a 14-yard screen pass during the decisive drive.

He also scored three touchdowns.

"Our linemen did a great job tonight," Meier said. "I just ran the ball hard and there were some great holes there."

Quarterback Mark Paterson completed 10 of 20 passes for 165 yards and a touchdown.

Linn-Mar got 109 yards on 14 carries with one touchdown from Mickens, and quarterback Clark Anderson completed 9 of 21 passes for 123 yards.

Kennedy took advantage of excellent field position to post three first-half touchdowns on its way to a 21-14 half-time lead.

By contrast, Linn-Mar used the entire length of the field and perfect execution of the 2-minute drill to put up its two scores.

The Cougars' scoring drives covered 16 yards after Nick Dolan recovered a Linn-Mar fumble, 35 yards after a short Lion punt into the wind, and 32 yards after Mike Russell returned a Linn-Mar punt 43

yards.

The touchdowns came on a 14-yard pass from Paterson to Brett Schultz, a 5-yard run by Paterson and 1-yard run from Meier, with the first two coming in the first quarter when the Cougars had the wind at their backs.

Linn-Mar got on the board early in the second quarter when Mickens scored on a 1-yard walk-through to cap a 14-play, 78-yard drive that never left the ground. Five backs carried the ball during the march.

when Anderson engineered a 7-play, 66-yard drive that began with 1:07 left in the half and ended when Anderson hooked up in the end zone with Jay Hake from 14 yards out with 13.6 seconds remaining.

Anderson also completed passes of 13 yards to Mickens and 20 yards to Blake Zundel during the drive.

"That was a good lift for our kids," Linn-Mar Coach Bob Read said. "We went to our 2-minute offense and that was just a huge lift."

The Lions outgained the

Cougars, 222 to 111, in the first half and had 11 first downs to Kennedy's five.

Linn-Mar rallied with five points in the third quarter on a safety and 29-yard field goal from Josh Dodds, then tied the game on Lincoln's fourth quarter touchdown run and a two-point conversion pass from Anderson to Michael Harris.

Kennedy travels to Iowa City West and Linn-Mar hosts Waterloo West in games next Friday night.
