Hempstead spoils J-Hawks' homecoming

CEDAR RAPIDS - It's an honor to be nominated for homecoming king. It's a sign of respect from your classmates, and you get to pose with all the pretty girls after the ceremony.

But it's not so neat for a high school football coach if your quarterback is one of the candidates for homecoming king, especially if the coronation is held at halftime while the rest of the team is in the locker room making adjustments.

It happened to Cedar Rapids Jefferson last night in a 31-7 loss to Dubuque Hemp-stead on homecoming at Kingston Stadium.

Jefferson Coach Jim Womochil would have enjoyed talking to quarterback Josh Faaborg at halftime, but by the time Faaborg made it to the locker room after the ceremony, it was time to get back on the field.

All Womochil could have asked was, "Who won?," assuming he was interested in the king and queen stuff. It

wasn't Faaborg, by the way.
"Yeah, it's tough," Womochil acknowledged. "It would be nice to talk to him at halftime to make adjustments.

"I don't know what to say about that. It's a treat for the kids. An honor. But it would have been nice to talk to

It might not have mattered. The J-Hawks (0-3) trailed 21-0 at halftime, and it was 28-0 before Jefferson got its hands on the ball in the second half after Hempstead (1-2) scored

"Yeah, it was tough," Faaborg said. "I talked to Coach as much as I could on the sideline before I went out on

defense. We got things straightened out.

Three other Jefferson football players were nominated for homecoming king and took part in the ceremony. They didn't win, either.

Jefferson struggled all night on offense and did not cross midfield until it marched 88 yards for a consolation touchdown with 28 seconds left against Hempstead's reserves and scored on a 23yard pass from Faaborg to Josh Haines.

The J-Hawks finished with 182 yards in total offense, with nearly half coming on their last drive.

"We just didn't get it done on offense," Womochil said.
"We couldn't move the ball consistently.

Jefferson lost a fumble on its first possession and Hempstead scored in three plays, making it 7-0. The J-Hawks committed another turnover on their second possession to set the tone.

"We have to get out of the gate quicker," Womochil said. Hempstead tailback Eric

Asche scooted for 187 yards and three touchdowns for the Mustangs on runs of 2, 2 and 3 yards. Hempstead also scored on a 50-yard touch-down pass from Nicholas Edwards to Cody Krug and a 22-yard field goal by Lucas Garrigus.

Hempstead was burned for 84 points in its first two games, but the Mustangs put the clamps on Jefferson.

"We were real confident we'd put some points on the board," said Faaborg, who finished 10 of 21 for 94 yards. 'We had trouble. Turnovers again (three). Just finding things that worked for us.


