Lions' Evans rocks J-Hawks

Linn-Mar running back scores 5 touchdowns in big 47-29 victory

MARION — Beau knows touchdowns. Beau Evans raced for 253 yards and scored five touchdowns as Linn-Mar enjoyed homecoming with a 47-29 victory over Cedar Rapids Jefferson on a wet, windy night at Armstrong Field on Friday.

Evans, a 5-9, 175-pound junior, capped his stellar performance with a 70-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter after scoring from 17, 2, 4 and 26 yards earlier in the game.

He had other runs that measured 33, 27, 15 and 11 yards and averaged a robust 11.8 yards every time he carried the ball.

"You must be pretty tired," Linn-Mar Coach Bob Read said to Evans as they left the field.

"Actually, I feel pretty good," Evans smiled, his mouthpiece dangling from his lips. "It was a lot of fun."

Evans normally shares the load with

senior Jon Krueger, but Krueger got hurt in practice Wednesday. That put the onus on Evans, and he delivered.

"Evans stepped up real big tonight. Amazing game," said Linn-Mar quarterback Blake Zundel, who directed a well-oiled machine that rolled up 544 yards.

Evans rushed for 105 yards and three touchdowns in the first half, then added 148 yards and two more scores in the second half before calling it a night.

"Man, did he perform tonight," Read said.

"It was incredible blocking," Evans said.

The Lions (3-2) scored on eight of their first nine possessions with six touchdowns and a pair of field goals by Evan Gutierrez. They touched the ball four times in the first half and found the end zone each time.

"We were just clicking tonight," Zundel said.

Linn-Mar finished with 24 first downs and was never threatened by winless Jefferson (0-5).

"We finally got the monkey off our back," Read said. "You know, we hadn't won a homecoming game since 1996."

The J-Hawks fought gamely and scored 22 points in the fourth quarter.

They finished with 383 yards and 26 first downs as Kyle Walker rushed for 122 yards and Erwin Clayton netted 114 on just four carries.

Evans scored the first three times the Lions had the ball as Linn-Mar raced to a 21-0 lead midway through the second quarter.

Jefferson countered with a 13-run touchdown gallop by Derek Bronner, but Zundel hit Blair Harris with a 30-yard touchdown pass on the final play of the first half for a 28-7 bulge at intermission.

Gutierrez kicked a 27-yard field goal to start the scoring in the third quarter and Evans tacked on a 26-yard touchdown, making it 37-7 with 10:45 left in the game.

Evans saved the best for last, breaking a tackle and racing 70 yards to make it 44-14 with 7:17 to go.

Bronner pulled the J-Hawks within 44-21 with an 11-yard run with 6:45 left. Gutierrez made it 47-21 with a 22-yard field goal.

Jefferson finished the scoring with a 16-yard touchdown pass from Travis Bennett to Peter Lewison and a 2-point conversion with 37 seconds to go.

Brockmeyer turns botched hold into winning TD

Kennedy holder recovers to throw for winning points

CEDAR RAPIDS — As the rest of his Cedar Rapids Kennedy teammates whooped and hollered in a celebratory circle with helmets hoisted in the air, Kyle Brockmeyer knelt off to the side. His head was down, his eyes fixed on the ground.

It was as if he was praying. And perhaps he was.

Divine intervention just may have played the biggest role in allowing Brockmeyer, the holder for all Kennedy field goals and extra points, to turn what appeared to be a game-losing play into a game winner. To make chicken salad out of chicken ... well, you know the old saying.

With Kennedy down by a point, 14-13, it was Brockmeyer who fumbled a perfect snap from center as kicker Alex Butters was about to attempt a game-winning 30-yard field goal with 11.6 seconds to play last night at the quagmire formerly known as Kingston Stadium. It was Brockmeyer who then took off with the ball to the right, then back to the left as Waterloo West defenders closed in on him.

It was Brockmeyer who looked up at the last second and located teammate Curtis Meier wide open in the corner of the end zone. And it was Brockmeyer who threw a perfect pass to Meier for a 13-yard touchdown with 1.7 seconds left that gave Kennedy an unbelievable 21-14 homecoming win over West.

"I mishandled the snap to begin with," Brockmeyer said after experiencing the lowest of the lows and the highest of the highs in a matter of 10 seconds. "I just had to rely on my guys up front. They threw some huge blocks for me up front. Curtis yelled for the ball, and I got it to him."

"I played a crappy game. But, wow! What can you do?"

Meier scored an early fourth-quarter touchdown on a 2-yard run that brought Kennedy within a point at 14-13. But a high snap from

center on the extra point forced Brockmeyer to pull the ball down again and make a run for it. He failed, leaving the Cougars down by a point.

Little did anyone know the same scenario would play itself out again.

"I was the wing on the left side, and all I did was block my guy," Meier said. "I looked up after awhile, and there was no ball. So I turned around, and there's Kyle with the ball in his hands running."

"All of a sudden, he stops, turn and runs around to my side. That's when I released, and I was all alone in the end zone. I was waving and screaming 'Throw it to me. Throw it to me.'"

Which Brockmeyer did, on a play that no one in Cougar land could think of a good name for after game's end.

"Lucky, I guess," said Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis. "We'll call it luck. There may be some people who think we may have faked it (intentionally) there, but we did not fake it."

Kennedy (3-2) drove 93 yards in 3:03 to get its winning touchdown. The Cougars stopped West (2-3) on a fourth-down Ryan Keel end-zone interception as West was about to go in for the clinching touchdown.

Quarterback Tyler Thompson ended up connecting six pass plays on the drive, which was aided by a huge 15-yard personal foul penalty on West as Kennedy reached the Wahawk 35. Thompson hit Ben Mohwinkle for a 6-yard pass that took the football to the West 13 with 11.6 seconds left.

The Cougars called timeout, then West called two timeouts to ice Butters. It nearly worked, only on the holder.

"Obviously, I don't agree with what happened," said West Coach Doug Gee, who thought Kennedy should have been called for an illegal-mandownfield penalty on the last play. "But like I told the kids, there's nothing you can do about it."

Waterloo West completely dominated the first half, but one big offensive play allowed Kennedy to hang closer than it probably should have.

Lone TD sinks Saints

DUBUQUE — As a kid, you dream about playing football in the mud and muck. Then when you get old enough and the game is important enough that mom can't force you to stay in out of the rain, you discover it's not quite so dreamy.

Dubuque Hempstead and Cedar Rapids Xavier fought in a quagmire for four quarters Friday at Dalzell Field. It was frustrating for the most part, but the Mustangs had one beautiful sequence that propelled them to a 6-0 homecoming victory.

"I give our kids a lot of credit," said Xavier Coach Duane Schulte. "They battled against a team with guys 6-5, 300 pounds, 6-4, 280 pounds. The rest of their linemen are 240 and 250 and we've got guys 200 pounds. For our kids, the size they are to go against a team that big in mud and make it a 6-0 game shows you how tough our kids are."

Hempstead punched across the game's only score on a 1-yard run by Eric Asche in the third quarter.

"It looks fun, but really it's a little more fun on defense because you don't have to worry about holding onto the ball or making cuts and keeping your footing," Asche said.

Xavier pounded out 153 rushing yards on 46 carries and registered no passing yards.

we took advantage of it."

On the Trojans' two other scoring drives, they did all the work themselves.

Jeremy Shibata kicked a 27-yard field goal to cap an 8 minute, 14-second drive and send West into halftime with a 10-0 lead.

West ran the ball 14 times to open the second half and open a 17-0 lead. Quarterback Marcus Ahrens faked to Kanellis, then scampered 11 yards around the left side for the touchdown.

West didn't attempt a pass in the second half.

"That's their game," City High Coach Dan Sabers said. "Once they were able to get that going, we knew we were in for a big battle. That's what they can do, and they do that very well."

Kanellis also keyed a West defense that held City High's offense to 156 total yards — less than half of the Little Hawks' previous average. City High had 45 yards and two first downs in the first half.

City High scored with 8:42 remaining on a 3-yard run by Phil Kenney over left tackle. The Little Hawks forced West to punt on its next series, and the Little Hawks had the ball back with 3:56 remaining.

City High made a first down, but Kanellis sacked City High quarterback D.P. Eyman two plays later, then pressured him into an incom-

pletion on fourth down to get the ball back for West to run out the clock.

"He's a pretty special football player, but more importantly, he's a special person," West Coach Dan Dvorak said. "I'd go to battle with him any day. That's for all our kids. We've got a great group of kids. We'll never, ever give up on them."

West snapped a three-game losing streak and improved to 2-3 on the season. City High lost its first game, falling to 4-1.

Eyman was 9 of 21 for 111 yards. Kenney, Dorian Davis and Ryan Boehm had three receptions apiece for City High.

"West High did an outstanding job," Sabers said. "They were the better team tonight, and our hats are off to them."
