CEDAR RAPIDS - The Cedar Rapids Jefferson football team normally rides the bus back to school after a game at Kingston Stadium, but not last night.

The J-Hawks (1-6) had lost all six of their games this season and had a seven-game losing streak dating back to last year. Waterloo East (0-7) proved to be the perfect tonic.

The Trojans have lost 43 straight games and have yet to win a game in the 21st Century.

"We understand that we didn't beat a conference contender," Coach Jim Womochil said. "What we said to our kids each and every week of the season, let's get better. Let's finish strong and be competitive.'

Jefferson had lost 17 of its last 18 games, but this night and walk back there and just belonged to the kids from the west side of town. Josh Faaborg passed for three touch-Bronner, who scored a pair of downs, Kyle Walker rushed

The J-Hawks did not do a lot of whooping and hollering after the game, but the victory felt good.

"I'm very, very happy for our kids," said Womochil, in his fourth year at Jefferson. "They have worked hard. They've put in a lot of time and effort. They deserve it.

"It's nice to see smiles on their faces.'

Bronner scored on a 4-yard run and Mike Polaski kicked the extra point, giving Jefferson a 7-6 lead with 6:16 left in the first quarter.

The J-Hawks recovered an onside kick and marched 38 yards for a touchdown, scoring on a 13-yard pass from Faaborg to Bryant Kucera. Polaski kicked the PAT for 14 points in less than 3 minutes and the rout was on.

Peter Lewison scored on a 10-yard pass from Faaborg and Bronner tallied on a 4yard pass from Faaborg and the J-Hawks led, 28-6, at halftime.

Walker finished the scoring with a 15-yard run in the third quarter.

Working with the wind in the second quarter, the Hawks tacked on 17 more points.


The first TD came on an 8-yard touchdown pass off play action from Joe Cooper to Drew Blahnik

Washington Coach Paul James then decided to put the offensive madness to rest once and for all, electing to go for a do-or-die two-point conversion. In a shotgun formation, Suess handed off to Rhone, who ran off tackle to the right side of the Linn-Mar line but failed to cross the goal line.

It was about the only time all night Rhone, the all-state senior tailback, was stopped all night. He ran 26 times in the game for 360 yards, six touchdowns and a two-point conversion.

His TDs came on runs of 19, 44, 85, 38, 54 and 10 yards. He also caught a 39-yard pass.

Linn-Mar ran to a 28-14 halftime lead, but Washington used the magic feet of Rhone to get right back in it early in the third quarter. The fleetfooted tailback ran home from 44 yards out on the opening possession of the second half to make it a 28-21 game, then sprinted 85 yards for another TD after Washington's defense stopped Linn-Mar for the first time all game.

A failed extra point prevented the game from being tied.

An 18-yard TD pass from Linn-Mar quarterback Blake Zundel to Blair Harris gave Linn-Mar a 35-27 lead late in the third quarter, but Washington stormed right back to tie the game on a 38-yard Rhone run and two-point conversion run.

A 54-yard Rhone TD early in the fourth gave Washington its first lead, 42-35. But Linn-Mar drove right back down the field to tie it at 42-42 on a 5-yard Beau Evans run.

That was all the scoring until the final two minutes. Linn-Mar capped off a drive on a Greer 30-yard touchdown run with 1:53 left, making it 49-42 Linn-Mar. But Washington needed only one play to re-tie it, Suess hitting Paki O'Meara on a 61-yard touchdown bomb. O'Meara's extrapoint kick made it 49-49 with 1:40 to

Washington got the football back again with 44 seconds left and used a couple of Rhone runs to move to the Linn-Mar 25. But O'Meara's 42-yard field-goal attempt with 5 seconds left

came up short and left, sending the game to OT.

Greer led Linn-Mar with 151 yards rushing on 14 carries. He had three touchdown runs and a touchdown pass. Beau Evans added 109 rushing yards on 25 carries.

Linn-Mar used a ball-control, ground-oriented offense to ride to a 28-14 halftime lead.

The Lions rushed 34 times in the opening half for 233 yards. Linn-Mar racked up 309 total yards to Washing-

Linn-Mar converted a pair of fourth downs on the opening possession of the game, getting its touchdown on a 20-yard Beau Evans run. Washington came right back to tie the game, though, when Paki O'Meara picked up a rolling kickoff near the sideline at the 20 and tight-roped his way to an 80-yard touchdown.

Linn-Mar continued moving the ball at will on its second possession, driving to the Washington 45. That's when wingback Matt Greer took a handoff right, stopped and lofted a perfect pass to wide receiver Blair Harris for a 45-yard touchdown and a 14-7 Linn-Mar lead with 4:29 to go in the first quarter.

Washington drove downfield on its next possession and appeared to have the tying touchdown when Rhone broke free on a 13-yard run, but the tailback was hit and spun as he got to about the 3, thought he was in the end zone, let up, was hit from behind and fumbled at the 1, with Linn-Mar recovering.

The Lions then drove 99 yards on 16 plays for yet another touchdown, this time a Greer 24-yard run off a wingback sweep play. Evan Gutierrez' extra point made it 21-7 Linn-Mar early in the second quarter.

Washington came right back to score, taking just two plays and 19 seconds to do it. The first play was a 39-yard flat pass and run from quarterback Will Suess to Rhone. The second was a 19-yard Rhone TD run.

Cougars come from behind for overtime win over Iowa City West

IOWA CITY — After Kennedy quarterback Tyler Thompson connected with fellow senior Ben Lamaak for the sixth time last night, Lamaak pushed, shoved and reached to cross the goal line to complete a 10-yard pass that gave the Cougars a 21-20 overtime victory against Mississippi Valley Conference rival Iowa City West.

"I have all the confidence in the world in Lamaak, and I knew they were giving him a big cushion, so we let it out there to him and he made the play," Thompson said. "It surprised me every time I went back and he was open. You have to get the ball in the hands of our receivers to

make plays, and he was open." Lamaak went 6-of-15 for 95 vards and two touchdowns, while Thompson led the Kennedy offense with a 20-for-40 performance for 196 yards and all three Cougar scores. The victory keeps Kennedy's postseason hopes alive, but ends West's chances in the tournament.

"We started out a little slow, but the line started to give me Thompson said. "We talked all week about how the line had to give me time to get the ball in the receivers' hands and let them make plays. That's what we did.'

For Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis, the come-from-behind victory was the exact opposite of what hap-

pened to his team against Prairie. "We battled back," he said. "We were in the same situation

against Prairie, and we used that over at the sidelines for motivation. I knew we were going to struggle on offense, so I knew we were going to do something else, and throwing the ball was what I

was hoping. "Fortunately, our receivers made big plays when they had to. I'm proud of our kids."

West High went up 14-0 in the second quarter, but Kennedy was brought back into the game when a high snap overshot West punter Evan Maifield and put the Cougars at the home team's 9-yard

Thompson hit up Lamaak for a 9-yard TD pass and brought it to 14-7 to end the half.

Kennedy continued to neutralize the Trojan running game, and West continued to give up their lead. On Kennedy's final drive, the Trojans handed the Cougars a facemask penalty and a pass interference call that kept them on the warpath.

With just over a minute left in the game, Thompson connected with Ben Mohwinkle to tie the game and send it into overtime.

The Trojans won the toss and scored on their first possession. However, Jeremy Shibata's extra point went wide right and gave Kennedy the opening they need-

Going into Friday's matchup, West running back Alex Kanellis had a commanding 976 yards this season, including 182 yards against Dubuque Wahlert last

But Kennedy keyed in on the senior and muzzled him with a 6-3, man-to-man defense that kept Kanellis with 19 carries for just 67 yards.

Kannelis' most significant run of the first half — a 10-yarder late in first quarter - kept the Trojans in a 13-play, 52-yard drive that culminated with a 16-yard TD pass from Marcus Ahrens to Richie Amendola for the first score of the game at 10:21 in the second quarter.

Sophomore James Teel and senior Bobby Windauer tried to step up for Kanellis in the first half, with eight carries for 65 yards and six carries for 52 yards, respectively. Teel also had a 15-yard touchdown run to put West up 14-0 with 6:22 left in the

But the unorthodox defense kept West successfully at bay.

"That's not a defense that anyone runs," West High Coach Dan Dvorak said. "Give Kennedy credit for something they put in this week.'

West (3-4) hosts C.R. Jefferson next week, and Kennedy (4-3) travels to Dubuque Wahlert.
