## Kinnick turf to be replaced

New natural grass field to be installed after UNI game

IOWA CITY — You shouldn't have spent all that time adjusting your television. The Kinnick Stadium turf really was that bad.

After Iowa and Ball State turned the middle of the field into a collection of divots Saturday, the Iowa Athletics Department has decided to replace the turf after the Iowa-UNI game Sept. 17, Athletics Director Bob Bowlsby told the Presidential Committee on Athletics at its meeting Thursday.

The grass turf will be torn up and replaced with a natural grass surface in a procedure that should take five or

six days, Bowlsby said. Iowa's first home game after UNI is two weeks later, Oct. 1 against Illinois.

The university contemplated a switch to artificial turf but opted against it. Grass is about one-third the cost of an artificial surface, Bowlsby said.

"Our coach and players really would prefer grass," Bowlsby said.

The 2005 season would have been the eighth full year of football on that turf. Bowlsby said most grass surfaces have a six or seven-year life cycle. Already halfway through an \$87 million stadium renovation, Bowlsby said Iowa hoped to get an extra year out of the turf.

It didn't happen, thanks in part to this summer's heat, which Bowlsby said included 45 days of 90 degrees or more.

**Odds and ends**

• Football season-ticket holders will receive "priority points" for next year's tickets in October, Associate Athletics Director Mark Jennings said.

Re-seating will be announced in November. Jennings said the ticket office expects 150 calls a day for 100 days.

• Bowlsby said graduation rates will be announced this month, and Iowa appears to have had an "excellent" year.

• The Hawkeye Express train to Kinnick Stadium had 3,400 riders for the Ball State game, up from last year's average from about 3,000, Jennings said.

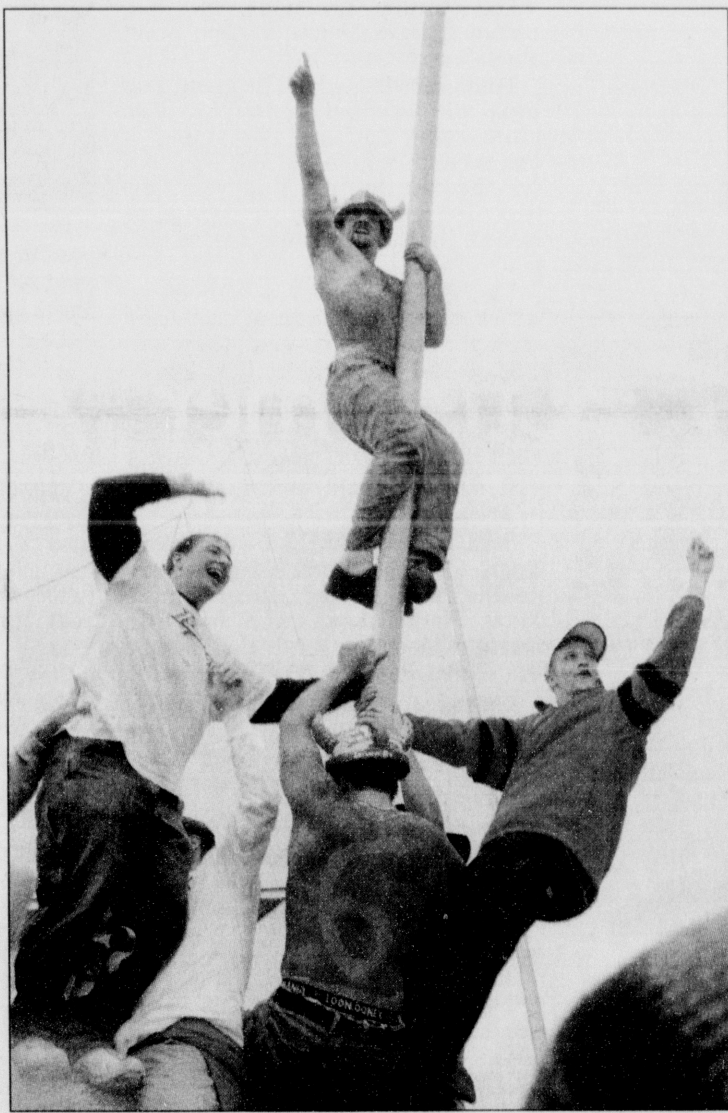

## Flynn dives right in

ISU wide receiver has wealth of knowledge in quarterback's ways

AMES — Austin Flynn promises he won't flap his arms in disgust or stomp his feet if he's open for a touchdown pass Saturday and Bret Meyer doesn't see him.

Perhaps more than any receiver in America, Flynn understands how hard it is for a quarterback to sift through the clutter and find his target. He's been there, done that.

"I've been on the other end of the spectrum," he said, "and I understand what it's like, and that you can't see sometimes."

Flynn was a quarterback all his life. In backyard games in Texas, pee-wee ball, junior high, high school, three years of college.

With just one game as a receiver, he's tied for third in the Big 12 Conference after catching seven passes against Illinois State last Saturday night.

"It pleased me," Flynn said, "but at the same time, I thought I really worked hard during the offseason, so I don't think it really surprised me. I just have a lot of hope."

Flynn displayed a good pair of hands, a knack for getting open and the ability to take a hit. It was just one game, against a I-AA opponent, but ISU Coach Dan McCarney was impressed.

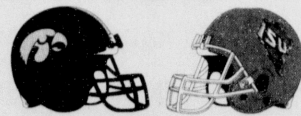
"It's what we've seen every day in practice since last spring," McCarney said. "What you see is what you get."

Flynn was surprised by one aspect of his new position, and it had nothing to do with catching the ball.

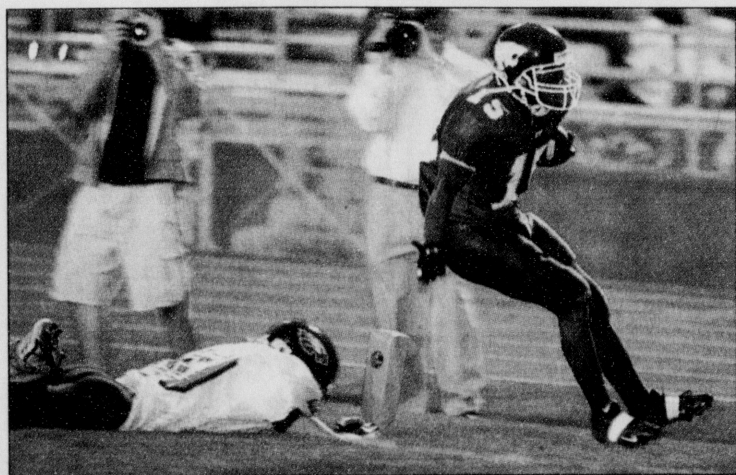
"I'll tell you what, it's a little more physical than I thought," he said, "but I still enjoyed it."

## Speedy Baker leads Cougars past Prairie

Kennedy senior's 7-yard run seals overtime victory

CEDAR RAPIDS — The football coaching staff at Cedar Rapids Kennedy knew

track sprinter Cordale Baker possessed outstanding speed. The question was how to best utilize it.

Head Coach Tim Lewis may have answered that question last night.

Baker, a slight 5-foot-8, 150-pound senior, scored Kennedy's only touchdown in regulation on a 20-yard run, then sprinted in from 7 yards out in the first overtime period to lead the Cougars past Class 4A fifth-ranked Cedar Rapids Prairie, 14-13, at cool and damp Kingston Stadium.

Back-up kicker Mitch Crandall kicked the wobbly PAT that determined the final score, but it was the running of Baker and Luke Dolan, the scrambling of quarterback Matt Carey and strong defensive play that led the Cougars (2-0) to their second overtime win of the season.

The Cougars beat Xavier, 16-13, in overtime last week.

Baker finished with 80 yards on seven carries, mostly on inside handoffs and end-arounds. He easily com-

plemented the bruising power-running of Dolan and the fleet feet of Carey.

"Coach knew since I had a lot of speed, I might be able to get to the outside," Baker said after joining his teammates in a rousing rendition of "The Hokey Pokey" in the winners' locker room. "These first two weeks have been nail-biters, but we pulled them out as a team."

It was a game of missed opportunities on both sides, with Prairie (1-1) missing a 26-yard field goal late in regulation and its PAT attempt in
