

O'Meara, Suess lead Warriors past I.C. West

IOWA CITY — The Cedar Rapids Washington offense is giving opponents two options. And neither is very good for the challenger.

It's a game of pick your poison.

Paki O'Meara rushed for 239 yards and three touchdowns last night and Will Suess passed for 143 yards and a touchdown as the Warriors posted their third straight win, a 34-19 Mississippi Valley Conference victory at Iowa City West.

It was Washington's first win on Trojan field.

"There's a lot worse positions to be in," Washington Coach Paul James said after his Warriors improved to 3-1.

The Warriors wasted little time getting on the scoreboard last night — 15 seconds to be exact.

O'Meara, who has rushed for 588 yards the last two Fridays, went around left end on Washington's first play and scooted 80 yards for a touchdown. He wasn't touched until he was inside the 10.

The second Warrior possession produced another hand-off to O'Meara, another run around left end and another 1-play drive — this one taking 14 seconds and covering 81 yards. This time, however, O'Meara broke several tackles at the line of scrimmage before breaking away.

That was too easy, James knew.

"It did (worry me)," he said, "because we know what kind of coaching, what kind of team West has. We knew it wouldn't last long."

O'Meara had 165 yards on five carries by halftime and Suess was 6 of 7 for 103 yards by intermission.

After O'Meara's two scores, Suess passed 21 yards to Nick Lenzen with 6:50 left in the second quarter to give Washington a 20-6 lead. He added a 9-yard run on a quarterback draw a little more than two minutes later.

Cougars squeeze by J-Hawks

QB Carey makes big plays as Kennedy staves off upset

CEDAR RAPIDS — Matt Carey is one of the smallest quarterbacks in the Mississippi Valley Conference, but he might have one of the biggest hearts.

Carey passed for one touchdown and scrambled nine yards for another Friday night as Cedar Rapids Kennedy trimmed Cedar Rapids Jefferson, 28-21, at Kingston Stadium.

Carey is listed at 5-foot-9 and 150 pounds, small for Class 4A quarterbacks, but he made the big plays as the Cougars (3-1) won their third close game of the year.

Kennedy trailed, 14-13, late in the second quarter when Carey scrambled out of trouble and rifled a sideline pass

to Teddy Shonka, who slipped a tackle and strode into the end zone for a 28-yard touchdown with 15 seconds left in the half.

Carey passed to Ben LaMaak for the two-point conversion and a 21-14 edge at halftime.

The Cougars were still clinging to that 21-14 advantage when Carey scored on the first play of the fourth quarter.

He faked an inside handoff, scooted to the right and rolled into the end zone for a 27-14 lead with 11:53 left in the game.

Mitch Crandall kicked the PAT for a 28-14 lead, and the Cougars needed all those points when it got exciting near the end.

Jefferson (0-4) pulled within 28-21 when Travis Bennett connected with Adam Sankot for a 12-yard touchdown pass with 2:24 left in the ballgame. Eric Holub kicked the PAT and it was 28-21.

The J-Hawks held Kennedy on downs and got the ball at their own 12-yard line with 1:55 left, needing to go 88 yards without benefit of a timeout.

Jefferson reached the Kennedy 44-yard line with 71 seconds to go, but the game ended with four straight incomplete passes, the final one going off Sankot's fingertips at the 15-yard line on fourth down.

Kennedy jumped to a 13-0 lead in the first quarter before the J-Hawks had run a play from scrimmage.

The Cougars took the opening kickoff and marched 66 yards on eight plays, scoring on a 5-yard run by Luke Dolan. Kennedy missed the extra point and settled for a 6-0 lead.

The Cougars kicked off to Jason Foster, but Kennedy's Mike Terukina yanked the ball out of Foster's hands on the kickoff return and ran 23 yards for a touchdown. Jordan Grimm kicked the PAT and Kennedy had a 13-0 lead with just 3:58 elapsed.

It could have gotten even worse for Jefferson, because Bennett was intercepted by Terukina on Jeff's first play of the game. The Cougars did not take advantage, however, and the J-Hawks managed to get themselves back into the game.

Jefferson grabbed the lead, 14-13, on a 14-yard by Bryant Kucera and the PAT with 6:50 left in the first half.

Ryan Garman put Jefferson on the board with a 1-yard run with 4:18 left in the first quarter, and the PAT pulled the J-Hawks within 13-7.
