# Cougars blast Lions, earn playoff berth

MARION — They didn't back in. They danced in.

Cedar Rapids Kennedy clinched its first playoff berth in six years, dominating the first half and cruising to a 30-7 victory over Linn-Mar in a Mississippi Valley Conference football game last night at Armstrong Field.

And after they shook the Lions all about, they did the Hokey Pokey and turned themselves around in the visitors' locker room.

"We do that after every win," chuckled Kennedy's Mike Morio, who found his way into the Linn-Mar backfield with frequency. Then he turned serious.

"We knew we had the potential to make it to the playoffs. We were disappointed we didn't make it last year. We didn't want to leave anything to chance tonight."

Kennedy (7-2) will play its first-round game at 7 p.m. Wednesday; the opponent and site were determined after press time. The Cougars might have qualified even with a loss. But by halftime, it was obvious that wasn't going to happen.

It was 23-0 at intermission as Kennedy won its third straight game since shifting Ben Lamaak from tight end to quarterback.

"Ben's a playmaker, and we weren't getting the ball in his hands enough," said Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis.

Lamaak engineered the Cougars to four scoring drives in the first half. He hit Teddy Shonka for a 39-yard touchdown pass, then

Herve Cantrell scored on runs of 13 and 5 yards. Jordan Grimm's 27-yard field goal with 1:09 left in the half made it 23-0.

"We knew what we had to do tonight," Lewis said. "We wanted to take care of what we had to do. We didn't want to back in. We came out ready."

The signature play of the game in the middle of the Cougars' third scoring drive. Scrambling from pressure, Lamaak stiff-armed a Linn-Mar defender and hit Daren Hlavacek for a 29-yard gain. Cantrell scored three plays later.

"He was hanging on me and I saw Daren," Lamaak said. "I was going to do whatever it takes."

Linn-Mar (3-6) had the ball and moved fairly effectively in the second half but only broke even on the scoreboard.

Mark Rigby connected with Michael Biechler for a 23-yard touchdown pass to get the Lions within 23-7 early in the third quarter. But Cantrell's third touchdown, a 31-yard scamper, clinched it with 8 minutes to play.

Final statistics were deceiving. Linn-Mar had more first downs (19-15) and outgained the Cougars by a 322-265 margin. But field position was key — Grimm's kickoffs regularly went into the end zone for touchbacks, forcing the Lions into a long field.

And Kennedy had no turnovers, compared to two for Linn-Mar.

"We got it done tonight," said Prairie tight end-linebacker Robbie Kramer. "Everybody did. Head and shoulders, this was the best game we've ever played."

The Hawks put together a third-quarter drive that culminated in a 1-yard quarterback sneak for TD by Nate Suchomel.

Cedar Falls punted on its next possession, with Prairie scoring the go-ahead points just three plays later on a Brandon Zinser 39-yard touchdown run with 58.4 seconds left in the third quarter.

Zinser rushed for 83 yards on 13 carries, as the fullback trap worked wonders much of the night.

Prairie again held Cedar Falls (8-1) on its next two possessions, including turning back the Tigers even though they took possession after a nice punt return at the Prairie 22 the second time. A huge sack of Cedar Falls quarterback Nate Curran by a blitzing cornerback Randy Shramek took CF back to the 43 and forced a punt.

# Xavier closes out strong by blanking Trojans, 30-0

IOWA CITY — Led by the fast feet of junior Will Martin, Cedar Rapids Xavier shut out Iowa City West, 30-0, last night in Mississippi Valley Conference football.

Martin rushed for 134 yards on 13 carries to lead the Saints to their sixth win of the season. But despite ending the season at 6-3, Xavier will not be a contender in the Class 4A playoffs that start next week.

"It makes you wonder, 'What if?'" Saints Coach Duane Schulte said. "Some years that happens, you get six wins and don't make it. Two out of the three losses were pretty close games, so it boils down to about five plays and we're 8-1 maybe."

"But you've got to make those five plays."

Xavier benefited from Martin's two first-half touchdowns, as he racked up 109 yards on 12 carries by intermission.

He rolled right, hugged the sideline, and outran the Trojans' Jed Snyder for his second, a 62-yard run that put the Saints up, 14-0. He had made a 5-yard touchdown for their first score.

Eddie Anders racked up 80 yards on 16 carries, and he put the finishing touches on the win with a 23-yard touchdown run to give the Saints a 27-0 lead at the start of the fourth quarter.

"Both Will and Eddie ran real hard," Schulte said. "But they don't get anything unless somebody's blocking, and

A scoreless first quarter proved to be just a lead-in to a second quarter in which the Little Hawks put two touchdowns on the board to give them a 13-0 halftime lead.

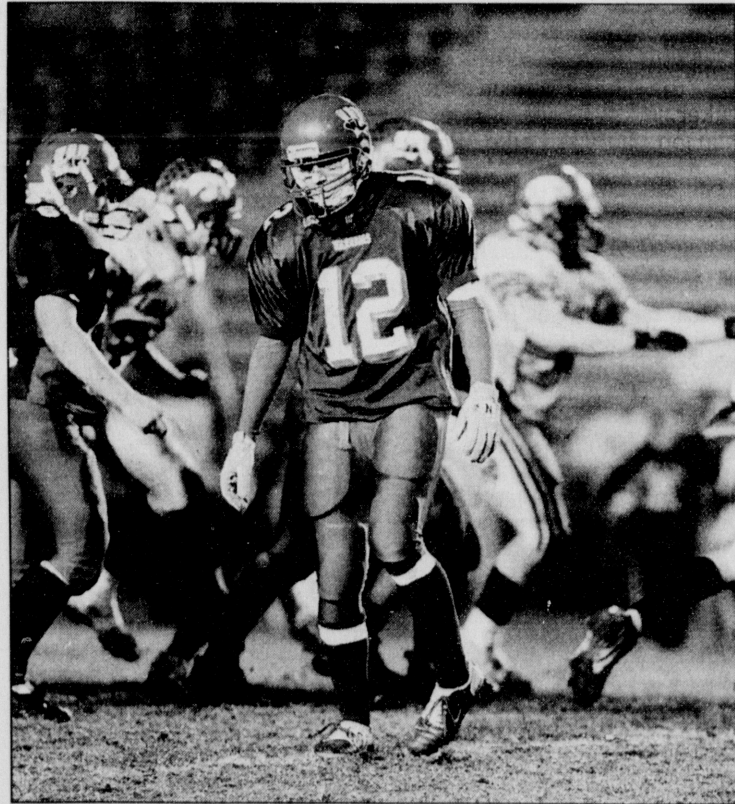
The first was an 18-yard scoring strike from quarterback Jon Gilmore to fullback Arcidius Robinson, who came out of the backfield to make the catch.
