Shonka shakes J-Hawks

Cougar standout has 2 big plays in 28-10 victory

CEDAR RAPIDS — Teddy Shonka is certainly no Keyshawn Johnson in terms of arrogance, but he just might share Johnson's attitude.

Just give him the darn ball and good things will likely happen for his Cedar Rapids Kennedy Cougars.

Shonka returned the game's opening kickoff for a 90-yard touchdown and caught a 23yard "jump ball" touchdown pass from quarterback Guy Martino to help opportunistic Kennedy down Cedar Rapids Jefferson, 28-10, last night at cold and wind-whipped Kingston Stadium.

Kennedy improved to 5-2 with the win and positioned itself nicely for a late season playoff run. The Cougars will be favored in their remaining games against Dubuque Senior and Waterloo East.

But all Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis saw was 12 penalties for 85 yards, a statistic that burns seven weeks into the season.

"In the seventh game of the season you can't be making the mistakes we made tonight," Lewis said. "I'm talking as a happy coach for winning in the MVC . . . but I'm really, really frustrated from the standpoint that it just wasn't very pretty football for the seventh game of the vear.'

It was special teams and defense that ruled for the Cougars, starting with Shonka's blockbuster that gave the Cougars a 7-0 lead just 18 seconds into the game.

IOWA CITY — Iowa City High senior Ryan Quigley conceded he is not a great interviewee.

He may want to reconsider his self-assessment, because he perfectly summed up the Class 4A ninthranked Little Hawks' 35-0 blanking of Cedar Rapids Washington last night at Bates Field.

"It's Little Hawk pride. It's Little Hawk football," said Quigley, a 6-foot, 164-pound defensive back.

City High is a proud program that has made 17 playoff appearances and won three state titles. and the 2006 team is carrying on the school's tradition of excellence with a dominating defense and

dynamic offense. The Little Hawks (6-1) pitched
