

Kennedy trounces Senior for fifth straight win

CEDAR RAPIDS — Sometimes it's as easy as it looks.

That's not a knock against Dubuque Senior, but Cedar Rapids Kennedy quarterback Guy Martino said when the Cougars are clicking things are easy. The Cougars clicked big time last night at Kingston Stadium.

Playing less than two quarters, Martino guided Kennedy to its fifth win in a row, a 58-21 prep football blowout of Senior in the Mississippi Valley Conference.

The Cougars (6-2) scored six touchdowns in the first quarter and led 44-7. It was 58-7 by halftime.

"Everything is clicking right now," said Martino, the most prolific single-season passer in MVC history. "It's really fun."

In very limited duty, Martino completed 18 of 26 passes for 241 yards and five touchdowns. In one stretch, he completed 5 of 6 for 125 yards and four touchdowns.

That's clicking.

"To see them come out and do that doesn't surprise me," Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis said. "They are really focused right now."

The toughest decision for Lewis last night was when to call off the dogs. That time came midway through the second quarter.

"I struggle with that," he said. "We want our kids to get some reps. It's always a tough call."

Kennedy's barrage started midway through the first quarter when Tim Johnson

rushed 10 yards for a touchdown, capping an 82-yard drive. Senior, however, answered with Jake Rannals' 98-yard kickoff return.

Then the floodgates opened.

With 5:40 left in the first, Martino and Eric Shultz connected on a 20-yard touchdown. Senior snapped the ball out of the end zone for a safety two minutes later, and, 16 seconds later, Demetreus Johnson took a screen pass from Martino 41 yards to the end zone.

Less than a minute later,

the score was 30-7 Kennedy when Anthony Cooper and Martino connected on a 10-yard scoring pass. Johnson and Martino hooked up again on a 42-yard scoring play with 51 seconds left and, seven seconds later, Greg Easley intercepted a Lucas Huseman pass and returned it 15 yards for a TD.

Then the first quarter ended.

Martino added another touchdown pass — 4 yards to Jake Heffernan — in the second quarter and Adam Ber-

troche scored on a 26-yard run to end Kennedy's scoring.

The Cougars didn't get — and didn't need — a first down in the second half.

Ten receivers caught passes for the Cougars, led by Demetreus Johnson with five for 124.

"We were prepared," Martino said. "The main thing was not to lose our focus."

Mission accomplished.

Kyle Haase, who caught seven passes for 109 yards.

"We work hard in practice and we've been playing together since seventh grade, so that helps a lot," Haase said of his football relationship with Schmall.

"He throws a real nice ball."

Schmall deferred to his receivers.

"They do a great job," he said. "I may not always put the ball in the perfect spot but they always try to make me look good, and I have a lot of confidence throwing to those guys."

Xavier broke open a 14-point game with a 21-point

third-quarter on touchdown runs of 2 and 11 yards from Eric Gilmour and the 41-yard pass to Hollingsworth. Jefferson (2-6) had played the Saints tough until that onslaught.

"The third quarter was brutal for us," Jefferson Coach Jim Womochil said. "They hit a couple of big passes and we fell asleep back in the secondary . . . and you got to give it to them."

"They're a good football team and they showed they can throw the ball pretty good tonight."

Jefferson tacked on fourth-quarter scores on a 29-yard field goal from Blake Steil and a 57-yard pass from Drew Higgins to Harrison Gerber.

Terrell McBride rushed for 132 yards for the J-Hawks, going past the 1,000-yard rushing mark for the season.

A fast-moving first half ended with Xavier leading 14-0 after the Saints punched in touchdowns on their first and final possessions of the half.

Both drives — the first covering 71 yards on 10 plays and the second 77 yards on 11 plays — were capped by 1-yard Schmall sneaks, the first at the 4:23 mark of the first quarter and the second with just 8.7 seconds left in the second quarter.

A 27-yard pass from Schmall to Bryce Colston gave the Saints a first-and-goal on the Jefferson 7 with

less than a minute left to set up the second score.

That led to the prolific third quarter.

"It's a great way to (play your final home game) as a senior," Haase said. "It was nice get everybody in."

"We knew coming into the game . . . we had to win out and get some help to get into the playoffs," Schmall said. "We came out fired up and ready to go tonight."

Jefferson hosts Iowa City High, and Xavier is at Iowa City West in regular season-finale next Friday.

After a run for no gain and a 5-yard penalty, Bernard hit Michael Schindel on a post pattern for a 15-yard touchdown strike to put the Tigers up 14-3 with 28 seconds left in the half.

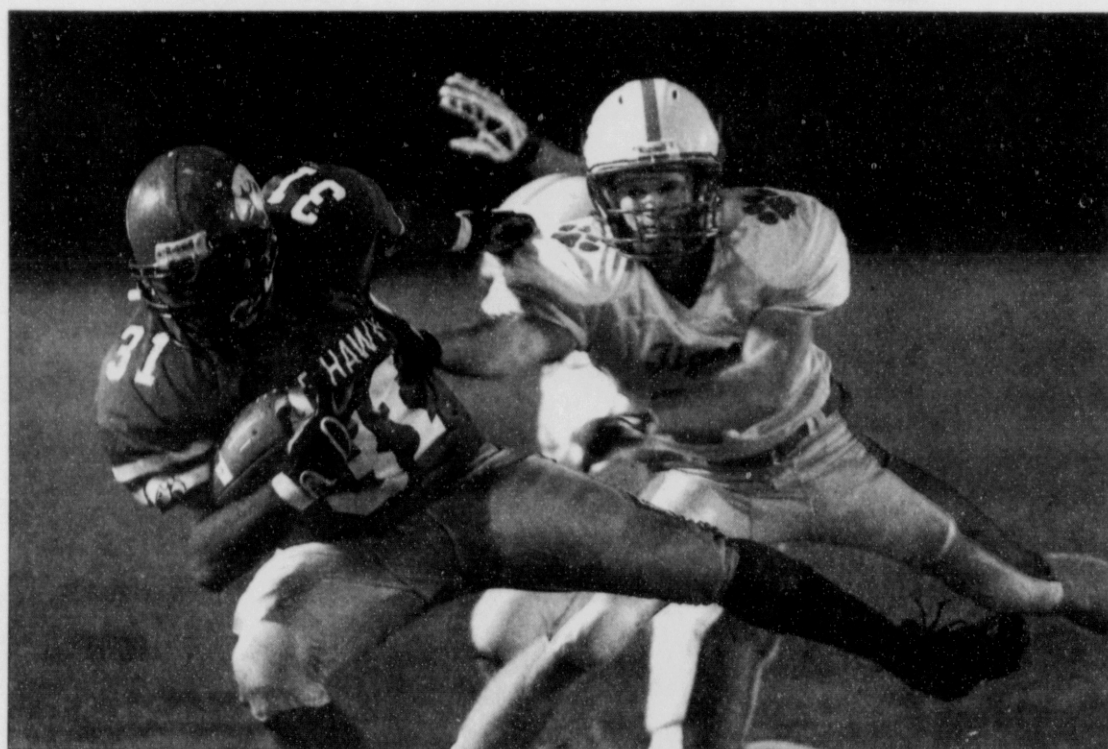
Although 30 minutes remained, Iowa City High's players were impacted negatively by the score.

"The seniors, a lot of us knew we were in for the ride," said Morelock, who also plays cornerback and wide receiver.

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West tops Linn-Mar in OT

MARION — They tried to ice him with a timeout. Then another one. And another.

But Iowa City West never needed to worry. Their kicker was Otto-matic.

That's Austin Otto, who nailed a 27-yarder in the second overtime to give West a 24-21 win over Linn-Mar in the battle of the winless last night.

"I knew they were doing that for strategy, to try and make me freak out a little bit," Otto said. "But I stayed calm. I knew I could make the kick because I've done it a thousand times."

Otto got his chance to be the hero after West's defense stopped Linn-Mar on three plays to begin the second OT. Lions kicker Grant Mahoney came on for a 22-yard field goal but missed right.

West's Aaron Martin ran the ball, placing it in the middle of the field after second down. Otto came on and booted his winner.

"Once I saw it head toward the uprights, I thought, 'It's in,'" said Otto, who hit all three of his extra points and missed a 45-yard field-goal attempt left. "Right when I hit it, I knew it was in."

West (1-7) won for the first time this season and increased Linn-Mar's losing skid to 21 straight. You have to feel for the Lions (0-8), who rallied from a 14-0 halftime hole to tie the game on a 4-yard Mitch Digmann touchdown run and a Will Roth two-point pass to Nate Brummer with 2:09 remaining.

West converted a 3rd-and-17 in the first overtime, when quarterback Kyle Mason rolled to his right and lofted a touchdown pass in the corner of the end zone to tight end Blake Stahlecker.

West scored in the first quarter on a 42-yard interception return by Gavin Smith. Daniel Mysnyk ran a dive play 82 yards for a second-quarter TD and a 14-0 lead.

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Prairie upsets Hempstead

CEDAR RAPIDS — Ryan Harrelson had never scored a touchdown. Not in peewee football, not in middle school and not in high school.

He picked a good time for his first.

Harrelson recovered a fumble in the end zone for a touchdown last night to help Cedar Rapids Prairie upset Dubuque Hempstead, 17-14, in a Mississippi Valley Conference game at John Wall Field.

Harrelson is an offensive lineman and defensive tackle, so he doesn't get too many chances to score points. His eyes got real big when Sam Elsner sacked Hempstead quarterback Mike Hoerner and the ball rolled loose into the end zone.

"It was so exciting. It was nice," said Harrelson, a 207-pound junior. "I loved it. It was my chance to score and I took it."

Prairie (4-4) had no chance to make the Class 4A playoffs and had little to play for last night, except for pride, a winning record and a chance to knock Hempstead (5-3) out of playoff contention.

"Coach just told us to have a smile on our face and go out and play some hard defense," said Preston West, linebacker and fullback. "I thought we came out and did what Coach said."

The Hawks held Hempstead to 241 yards, and 75 of those came on a final drive by Hempstead that resulted in a

meaningless 15-yard touchdown pass with no time left on the clock.

"It was a heck of a defensive effort," said Prairie Coach Craig Jelinek. "I thought the kids played excellent tonight."

"It's just a matter of self-respect and love for the game. And they're going to play hard."

Prairie led 3-0 at halftime on a 38-yard field goal by Cal Beatty. The Hawks made it 10-0 in the third quarter when Harrelson recovered the fumble in the end zone.

The Mustangs pulled within 10-7 on a 5-yard touchdown pass from Hoerner to Cody Hayes. Prairie responded with a 14-play, 63-yard drive that took nearly 7 minutes off the clock and resulted in a 3-yard touchdown smash by Derek Tharp.

"We had nothing to lose," Elsner said. "We wanted to walk away with a win in our last game at the high school, and so that's what we did."

Prairie will finish the season with a road trip Thursday night to Dubuque Wahlert, hoping to finish 5-4.

The Hawks finished with only 162 yards of total offense, but excelled on defense and played well on special teams. Tharp led the attack with 28 carries for 95 yards, including 45 yards on the final drive.
