Marion explodes for 51 in win

The Marion Indians scored 36 points and collected 296 yards of total offense last night.

Not impressed? Well, consider this. That was just in the second quarter of their high school football game at Thomas Park.

The No. 3 Indians rode that explosion to an easy 51-8 victory over Clear Creek Amana to march into the Class 3A playoffs with an 8-1 regularseason mark.

"I think if we play like we did in the second quarter we can go all the way," said Marion tailback Broc Dobling, who carried the ball 18 times for 206 yards and four touchdowns.

Marion grabbed an 8-0 lead in the first quarter on a 6-vard touchdown by Dobling, but Coach Tony Perkins said his club was a little flat and listless during the opening 12 minutes.

That all changed, dramatically, in the second period.

'If we play like we did in the second quarter, we're a pretty good football team,' Perkins said. "If we play the way we did in the first quarter, we're just an average football team.'

The Indians have had an excellent season, but a 17-13 loss to DeWitt Central two weeks ago at home cost them the District 5 title. They'll enter the Class 3A playoffs as the district runner-up.

"The regular season is important, but it really starts when you get to the playoffs,' said Marion quarterback Matt Barnd, who completed 8 of 13 passes for 158 yards and two touchdowns. "That's what we've been striving for all year long."

Dobling scored on runs of 11 and 3 yards in the first half as the Indians rolled to a

44-0 lead at intermission, igniting the continuous clock for the entire second half.

Dobling began the second half in style, racing 55 yards for his fourth touchdown to make it 50-0. That touchdown gave Dobling a total of 1,035 yards and 17 touchdowns in nine games this season.

"I'm so happy, because my line has played amazing all this year," he said. "They're the only reason that I got it."

Perkins pulled all of his top players after Dobling reached 1,000 yards. He was glad to see his 5-foot-7, 190-pound senior reach the milestone at

"He's a great athlete," said Perkins. "He runs so low to the ground and has such strong legs that it just propels him through blocks. He's had a great year, but that comes from your offensive line, too.'

Michael D'Hooge caught both of Barnd's touchdown passes on plays covering 36 and 34 yards. D'Hooge also caught a two-point conversion pass and intercepted a Clear Creek Amana pass in the end

Marion finished with 486 vards and 25 first downs, despite playing the entire second half with a continuous

The Indians are disappointed they did not win the district title, but Barnd said they learned an important lesson in the four-point loss to De-Witt Central.

"We learned that you have to come out focused for every game; you have to prepare for every game like it's your last," he said. "We can't have any regrets after that. We have to play four quarters and come out ready to go.'

Chargers will play Texans as scheduled

TEMPE, Ariz. (AP) -Chased from their homes and practice fields by deadly wildfires, the San Diego Chargers headed home Friday night and will play the Houston Texans at Qualcomm Stadium on Sunday as scheduled.

"That's the best news I've heard since this happened," running back LaDainian Tomlinson said. "I never thought I'd feel so good just going home."

The team worked out for a final time at the Arizona Cardinals' facility Friday afternoon, then boarded buses to the airport for the flight to San Diego.

"It was like a relief," tight end Antonio Gates said, "to be able to go home and play in front of our home crowd, considering all the trials and tribulations that are going on in San Diego.'

The game's date and time had been in doubt because Qualcomm was used as a major evacuation center during the wildfires that swept San Diego County. The stadium closed as an evacuation

center at noon Friday.

"Early Friday morning the Chargers informed me that the NFL has decided to play Sunday's game as scheduled at Qualcomm Stadium," San Diego mayor Jerry Sanders said in a press release. "The City will be able to provide sufficient public safety personnel to manage a professional football game without impeding ongoing wildfire recovery efforts.'

Several players and coach Norv Turner said they expect an emotional scene Sunday.

"Just thinking about it I get goosebumps," Tomlinson said. "I think it's going to be emotional, and I wouldn't be surprised if there were a lot of tears in that stadium."

The Chargers, who had a bye last week, canceled practice Monday, then flew to Phoenix for workouts at the Cardinals' facility Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.
