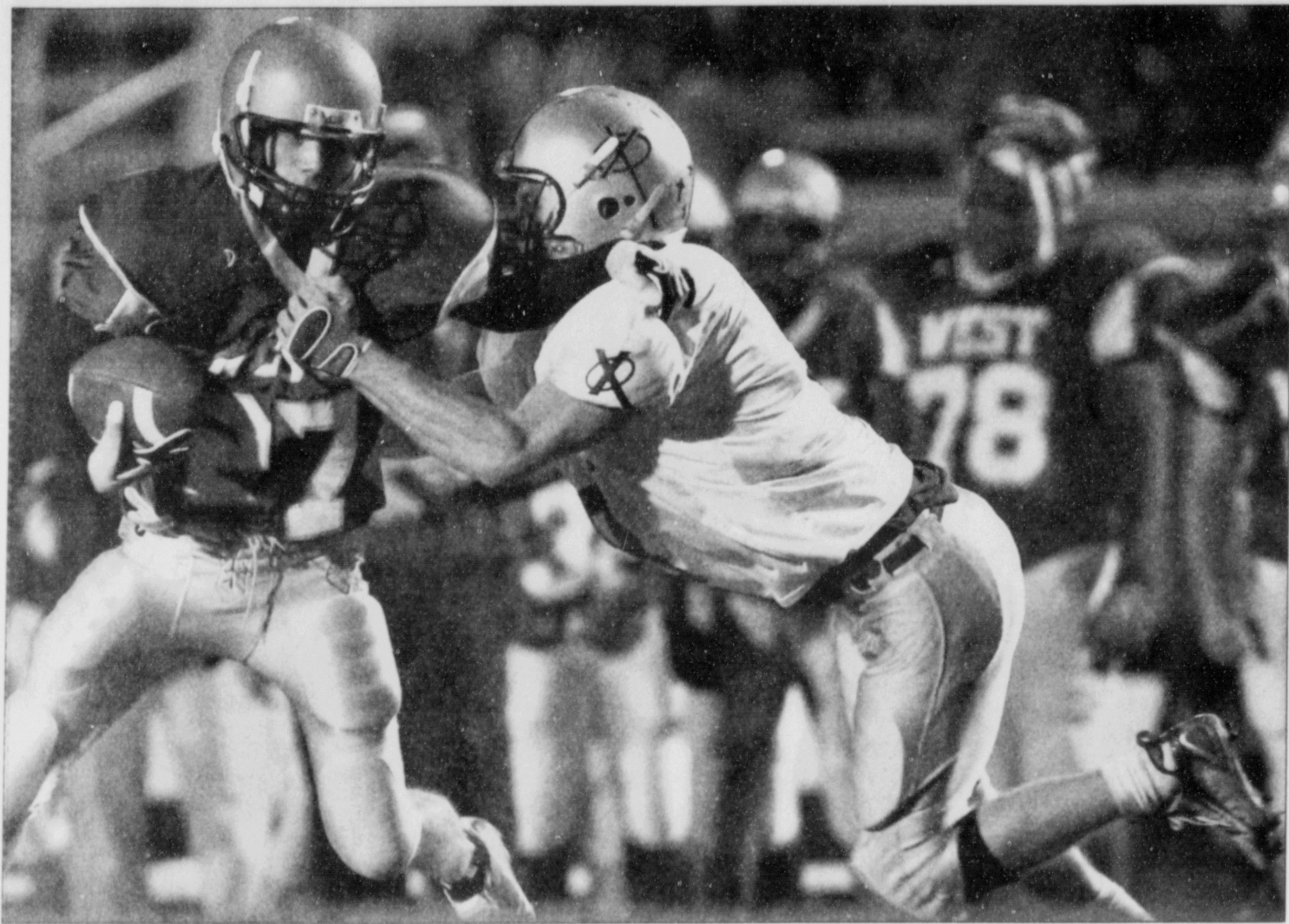

The Saints marched 68 yards on their first possession, with Andries scoring on an 8-yard run with 6 minutes, 43 seconds left in the first quarter.

The Trojans answered three plays later when Josh DeBoer hauled in a 41-yard touchdown pass from quarterback Kyle Mason with 5:56 remaining.

The game was tied for only 12 seconds.

On the first play of the next

possession, senior quarterback Dan Schmall found Bryce Colston down the sideline for an 80-yard TD and a 14-7 lead.

"They had some good athletes make some good plays, but coach always tells us there's going to be adversity in a game," Schmall said. "It's how you deal with that adversity that is going to make you who you are. We had to come back right at them. We were able to make a couple plays and it turned out well for us."

Xavier didn't let West back in the game, scoring on five of six drives in the second and third quarters to take a commanding 44-7 lead.

Schmall, who rushed for 107 yards on 11 carries and passed for 208 yards, scored on runs of 13 and 40 yards in the third quarter.

Andries, who was filling in at running back for the injured Corey Reed, finished the scoring for the Saints on a 51-yard run with 46 seconds left in the third. Andries finished with a game-high 145

yards rushing on 14 carries.

"My teammates around me really pushed me to go hard," Andries said.

"The line opened up big holes today and all I had to do was run through them."

West scored two fourth-quarter touchdowns on a 1-yard run by Mason and a 4-yard run by running back Aaron Martin.

Kennedy takes down Waterloo East

WATERLOO — In its final game of the season, Waterloo East laid it all on the line.

But Cedar Rapids Kennedy needed a win to secure a playoff berth and kept the Trojans from getting much past the line in a 44-13 win.

"They are a very good football team," said East Coach Antonio Mays. "They do a lot of different things on their defense that causes a lot of confusion."

Kennedy's Guy Martino entered the game with a Mississippi Valley Conference re-

cord 2,537 yards and extended his record with 336 yards against East. Martino also came into the night with 24 touchdowns passes, and added five more Friday to bring his season total to 29.

For most of the evening, the Cougars ran a spread

formation offense with five wide receivers.

"Anytime you run that type of offense, it is tough to defend," Mays said. "You have to tip your hat to them. When it (the spread offense) is ran as well as they run it, it is tough to defend against."

Marion explodes for 51 in win

MARION — The Marion Indians scored 36 points and collected 296 yards of total offense last night.

Not impressed? Well, consider this. That was just in the second quarter of their high school football game at Thomas Park.

The No. 3 Indians rode that explosion to an easy 51-8 victory over Clear Creek Amana to march into the Class 3A playoffs with an 8-1 regular-season mark.

"I think if we play like we did in the second quarter we can go all the way," said Marion tailback Broc Doblin, who carried the ball 18 times for 206 yards and four touchdowns.

Marion grabbed an 8-0 lead in the first quarter on a 6-yard touchdown by Doblin, but Coach Tony Perkins said his club was a little flat and listless during the opening 12 minutes.

That all changed, dramatically, in the second period.

"If we play like we did in the second quarter, we're a pretty good football team," Perkins said. "If we play the way we did in the first quarter, we're just an average football team."

The Indians have had an excellent season, but a 17-13 loss to DeWitt Central two weeks ago at home cost them the District 5 title. They'll enter the Class 3A playoffs as the district runner-up.

"The regular season is important, but it really starts when you get to the playoffs," said Marion quarterback Matt Barnd, who completed 8 of 13 passes for 158 yards and two touchdowns. "That's what we've been striving for all year long."

Doblin scored on runs of 6, 11 and 3 yards in the first half as the Indians rolled to a

44-0 lead at intermission, igniting the continuous clock for the entire second half.

Doblin began the second half in style, racing 55 yards for his fourth touchdown to make it 50-0. That touchdown gave Doblin a total of 1,035 yards and 17 touchdowns in nine games this season.

"I'm so happy, because my line has played amazing all this year," he said. "They're the only reason that I got it."

Perkins pulled all of his top players after Doblin reached 1,000 yards. He was glad to see his 5-foot-7, 190-pound senior reach the milestone at home.

"He's a great athlete," said Perkins. "He runs so low to the ground and has such strong legs that it just propels him through blocks. He's had a great year, but that comes from your offensive line, too."

Michael D'Hooge caught both of Barnd's touchdown passes on plays covering 36 and 34 yards. D'Hooge also caught a two-point conversion pass and intercepted a Clear Creek Amana pass in the end zone.

Marion finished with 486 yards and 25 first downs, despite playing the entire second half with a continuous clock.

The Indians are disappointed they did not win the district title, but Barnd said they learned an important lesson in the four-point loss to DeWitt Central.

"We learned that you have to come out focused for every game; you have to prepare for every game like it's your last," he said. "We can't have any regrets after that. We have to play four quarters and come out ready to go."

Chargers will play Texans as scheduled

TEMPE, Ariz. (AP) — Chased from their homes and practice fields by deadly wildfires, the San Diego Chargers headed home Friday night and will play the Houston Texans at Qualcomm Stadium on Sunday as scheduled.

"That's the best news I've heard since this happened," running back LaDainian Tomlinson said. "I never thought I'd feel so good just going home."

The team worked out for a final time at the Arizona Cardinals' facility Friday afternoon, then boarded buses to the airport for the flight to San Diego.

"It was like a relief," tight end Antonio Gates said, "to be able to go home and play in front of our home crowd, considering all the trials and tribulations that are going on in San Diego."

The game's date and time had been in doubt because Qualcomm was used as a major evacuation center during the wildfires that swept the San Diego County. The stadium closed as an evacuation

center at noon Friday.

"Early Friday morning the Chargers informed me that the NFL has decided to play Sunday's game as scheduled at Qualcomm Stadium," San Diego mayor Jerry Sanders said in a press release. "The City will be able to provide sufficient public safety personnel to manage a professional football game without impeding ongoing wildfire recovery efforts."

Several players and coach Norv Turner said they expect an emotional scene Sunday.

"Just thinking about it I get goosebumps," Tomlinson said. "I think it's going to be very emotional, and I wouldn't be surprised if there were a lot of tears in that stadium."

The Chargers, who had a bye last week, canceled practice Monday, then flew to Phoenix for workouts at the Cardinals' facility Wednesday, Thursday and Friday.
