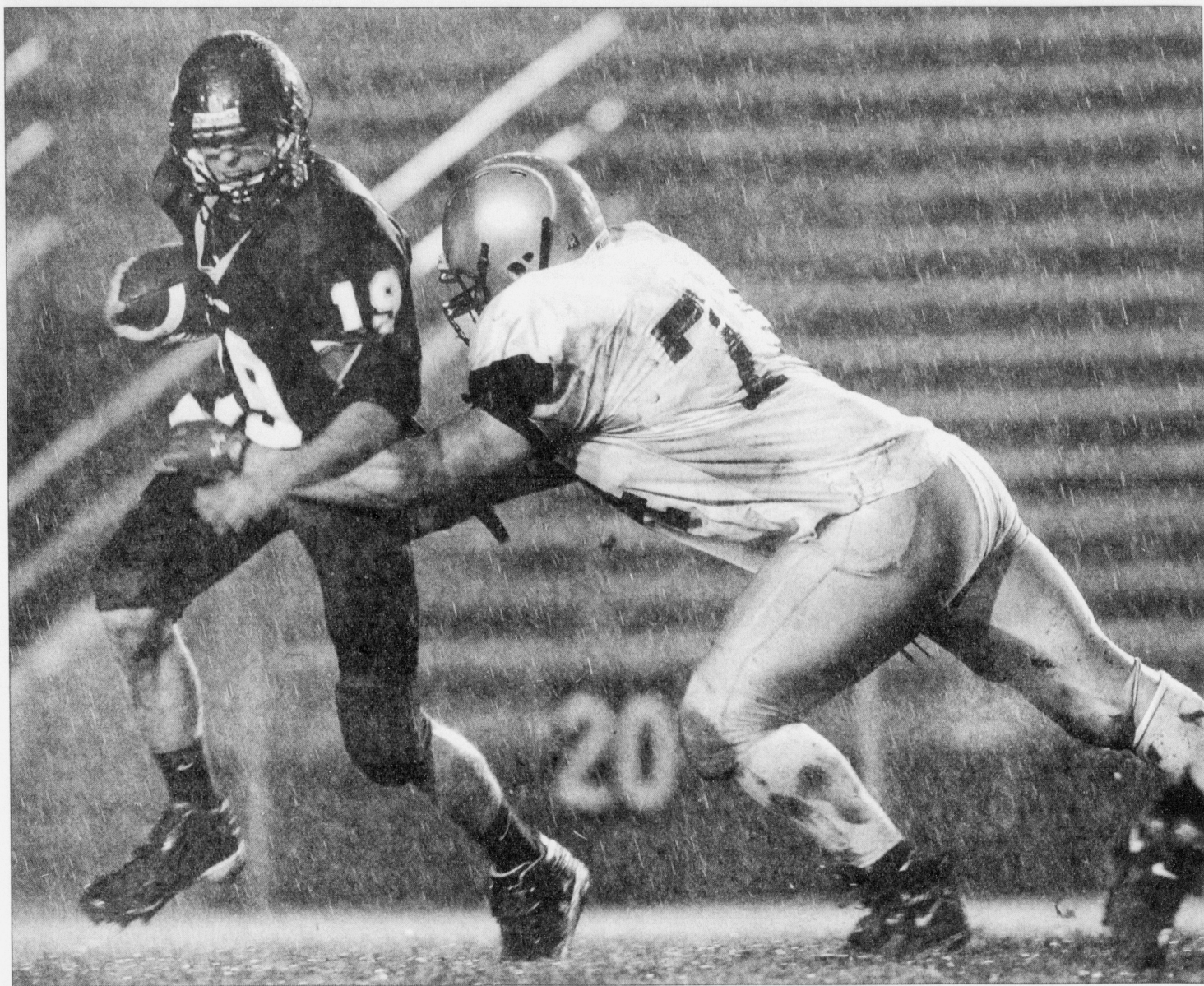

Kennedy soaks I.C. West

CEDAR RAPIDS — The early schedule set up nicely for the Cedar Rapids Kennedy football team.

The Cougars' opponents the first three weeks have struggled in recent years, allowing Kennedy to put some things together, gain some confidence and find out what kind of team it has. It appears to be a pretty good team.

"I think we've improved each week," Coach Tim Lewis said after Kennedy gave Iowa City West a 31-0 soaking at muddy Kingston Stadium. "I think that's everybody's goal ... You know what, I like our team. We like where we're at."

Where Kennedy is at is 3-0 heading into its annual 42nd Street slugfest next week against Cedar Rapids Xavier. The Cougars outscored West, Linn-Mar and Cedar Rapids Jefferson by a combined 96-7, including shutouts of West and Jefferson.

The Cougar defense stifled West to the tune of 42 yards of total offense, including negative-23 rushing. Keep in mind the weather was absolutely awful, especially for a team that employs the spread. But also keep in mind West went off offensively last week for over 500 yards against Waterloo West.

"Coach has been on us, getting us pumped all season," said Kennedy linebacker Bond Harman. "I think every game we get a shutout or hold the opponent to a low score, that just gets us pumped even more. Everyone in the Mississippi Valley Conference, they're all good teams, whoever you play. So to get a shutout, especially two weeks in a row, is a really big deal."

West quarterback Tayler Bontrager set a school record with 392 passing yards last week but was held to 8-of-15 passing for 65 yards. Receiver Dan Mysnyk had an MVC-record 281 yards receiving last

week but had all of two catches for seven yards last night.

The Cougars were able to get pressure upfront on Bontrager. They picked him off twice, including an interception by Jake Hughes late in the third quarter that was returned 41 yards for a touchdown and a 17-0 lead.

"The weather was definitely to our advantage," Lewis said. "They are a team that relies on the pass to open up their run game, and you just couldn't throw tonight."

West (0-3) refused to use the weather as an excuse for its offensive struggles.

"Both of us played on the same field," said mudcaked West linebacker Drew Peterson.

"We just made more mistakes."

Kennedy was able to get enough of a push from its line to grind out 152 rushing yards: 68 and a touchdown from 6-foot-6 running back Max Martino and 56 and two

scores from quarterback Derek Thomas. After a Grant Brenneman interception deep in West territory, Thomas scored on a 2-yard keeper with 25.7 seconds left in the half for a 10-0 Kennedy lead.

Thomas had a 7-yard TD run early in the fourth quarter to make it 24-0, then Martino scored from 2 yards out just 24 seconds later for the final margin, after the officials errantly ruled a pass that slipped out of Bontrager's hands a fumble. And don't forget kicker Tyler Sievertsen, who nailed a 48-yard field goal late in the first quarter despite the poor conditions.

"We did a good job not having any turnovers tonight," Thomas said. "Our run game was pretty good tonight. Our o-line was getting pushes at times. We just kept moving the ball, and doing the things we needed to do to put some points on the board."

Dan Marshall passed for three touchdowns and rushed for another as West Delaware opened Class 3A District 3 play last night with a 34-7 prep football victory at Waukon.

The Hawks (1-0, 2-1) led 7-0 after the first quarter and were up 28-0 at halftime after Marshall connected with Seth Engelken and Pat Soppe from 60 and 36 yards out and Jake Wall rushed 8 yards for a score. Marshall added a 20-yard touchdown pass to Ben Lechtenberg in the fourth.

Marshall finished 15 of 20 for 243 yards with no interceptions. Wall rushed 15 times for 11 yards.

Waukon (0-1, 1-2) scored in the fourth on a 6-yard run by Brendan Leiran.

Regina blanks Camanche

IOWA CITY — Regina got its offensive weapons back on track, a shutout by its defense and plenty of time for its reserves to gain experience in a 41-0 Class 2A District 5 football victory against Camanche last night.

All in all, some very good signs for the first district game.

Last week, the Regals (3-0) had to hold on for a hard-fought, 28-14, win at home against Mount Vernon. But they had no trouble dispatching Camanche (0-3) early. And they did it by clicking on all cylinders.

All-purpose back Marcus Kloos got rolling by scoring the game's first three touchdowns on two receptions and a run, then he earned a rest for the remainder of the game.

"He's off to just an incredible senior year," said Regina Coach Marv Cook. "Probably the one thing he hasn't done

for us is catch the ball, and to see him come out and catch the ball in this environment was just great."

And Regina's three quarterbacks were perfect in the first half. Jack Verducci threw his first two passes for touchdowns, then gave way to Nick Lyon, who then handed the reins to Joe Donovan.

"We feel like we're blessed at that position," Cook said.

Donovan led the Regals for the rest of the game, and Regina got a good sign when its reserves picked up where the starters left off to preserve the shutout.

"We told them at halftime, our expectations don't change," Cook said. "Whatever the score is, you're on the field, we expect you to perform and perform like a starter."

Camanche struggled holding onto the ball all night on the slick field, fumbling 10 times. Regina kept its mitts dry for the most part and limited its turnovers to two fumbles.

Solon hammers Wilton, 41-7

WILTON — Soggy conditions and another ranked opponent couldn't slow James Morris and the Solon offense.

The top-ranked Spartans cruised to a 41-7 win over No. 7 Wilton behind a 200-yard game and three touchdowns from Morris and a stingy defense that allowed just two first downs in a Class 2A District 5 prep football game last night.

Solon (1-0, 3-0) turned four Beaver turnovers into 21 points, including a pair of scores in the first quarter.

"That was key," Solon Coach Kevin Miller said. "Those two turnovers early set the stage. We had a short field and we capitalized."

Wilton (2-1) fumbled on the second plays of its second drive, setting up a 20-yard touchdown run by Kyler Stahle four plays later for a 14-0 lead. The Beavers fumbled the ensuing kickoff and Morris scored on a 3-yard run to go up by three scores with 5:48 left in the first quarter.

Morris rushed for 210 yards on 17 carries. The junior had just two touches in the second half, but totaled three runs for more than 50 yards in the

first — including a couple for scores.

"The offensive line did a great job getting an initial push," Morris said.

With Solon up 21-7 late in the second quarter, Morris broke off a nice 55-yard touchdown run with 4:40 remaining before half. A couple minutes later, the future Iowa Hawkeye ran for a 66-yard score, breaking through a couple tackles at the line of scrimmage and squeaking by the last defender down the sideline.

"These are favorable conditions for James," Miller said. "He's a strong runner and ran through a lot of arm tackles. He was a workhorse tonight."

Solon quarterback Matt Morrison ran for 63 yards and two touchdowns. His longest run was a 22-yarder, set up on a play to Morris.

Wilton held a moment of silence before the game for all-state running back and 2006 graduate Nic Peterson, who died Aug. 30 in a motorcycle accident in Arizona.

Peterson was on the Beaver football team that qualified for the Class 2A playoffs for the first time in 2006.

Solon hosts Tipton on Friday.

Cascade sneaks by Beckman, 10-7

CASCADE — The Cascade Cougars are beginning to find out who they are.

Who they are appears to be a pretty good football team.

Evan Ressler scored on a bruising 6-yard run with 34 seconds left, and Cascade moved to 3-0 with a 10-7 victory over rival Dyersville Beckman last night in a rainy, muddy Iowa Class 2A District 4 opener.

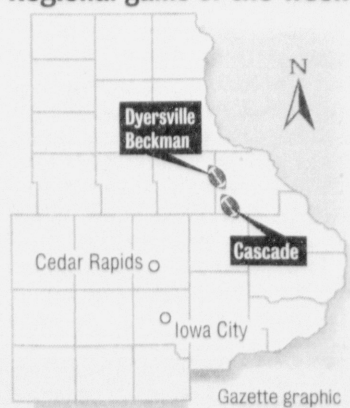
The Cougars, who graduated several key players from last year's 7-3 team, beat North-Linn and Class 3A Anamosa the first two weeks. Last night, they added to their victims a Beckman team coming off a victory over highly regarded Class 3A West Delaware.

Cascade hopes the victory propels it on the way toward the school's first playoff berth since 1990.

"This gives us motivation," said Cougars senior running back/linebacker Matt McCullough, who rushed for 147 yards on 30 carries. "We came in the first two weeks not really knowing where we stood, but I think this shows we can do things if we put it together."

Despite trouble with the hold in the wet conditions, Cascade's Nate Trumm converted a 32-yard field goal on the game's first drive.

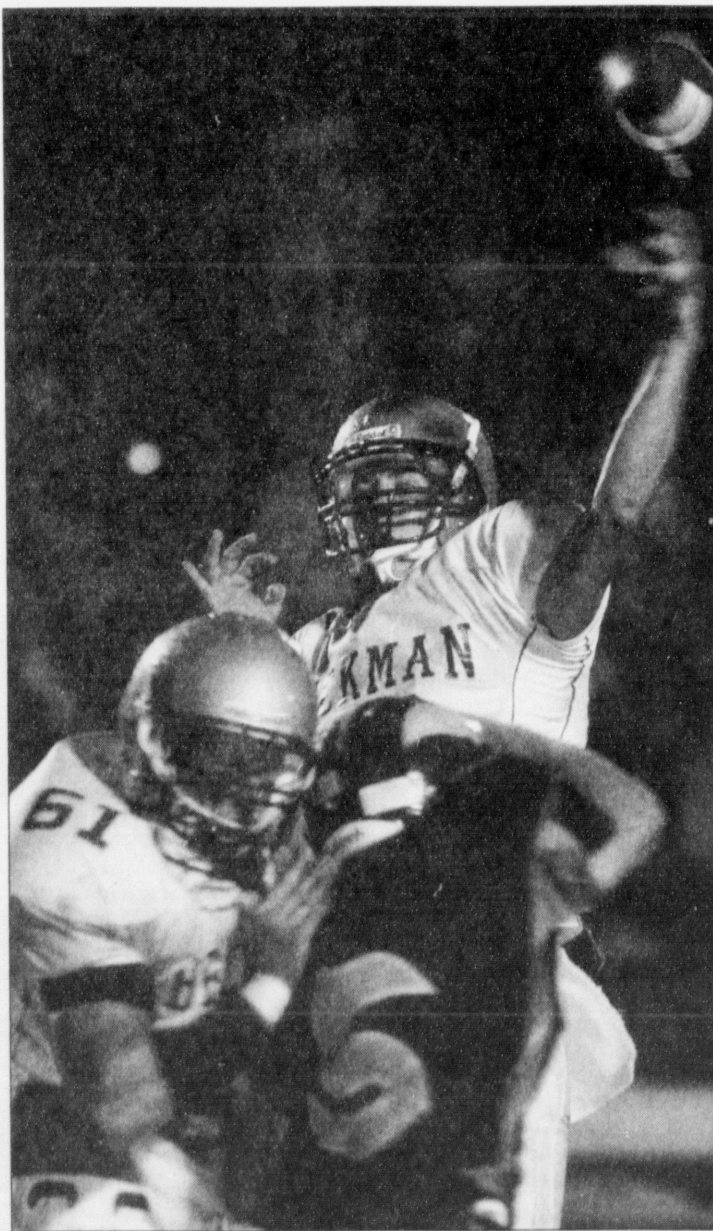

The score stayed there until Beckman quarterback Daniel Thole scored on a 16-yard scamper late in the third period.

Each team committed a turnover in the fourth quarter before ground-oriented Cascade's winning drive, on which quarterback Connor Redmond completed crucial passes to Trumm and McCullough to set up Ressler's winning run.

Beckman, which fell to 1-2, 0-1, was unable to capitalize on three first-half miscues by the Cougars — a fumble, a failed fake punt and a bad snap on fourth down.

The Trailblazers also saw a touchdown pass slip away on fourth-and-7 from the Cascade 7 midway through the third quarter.
