Bell, who missed the Cougars' opening five games for academic reasons, rolled up 152 yards in the final half. He raced 67 yards for a touchdown on Kennedy's first possession of the third quarter, and talned the final six-pointer of the night on a 1-yard plunge.

"Royce is something special," said Kennedy head coach Tim Lewis. "He just works real hard. ... He came out tonight and he was patient.

Despite Bell's big run, Kennedy (4-3) held just a 16-14 lead. Then Harman intervened. Stepping in front of a Jud Wienke pass, the Cougar linebacker rumbled 63 yards for the touchdown that built the Cougar edge to nine.

"I really think that was the turning point," Lewis said of Harman's pick. "We were struggling a little bit.

Kennedy took an early lead on a safety and built it to 9-0 on a 1-yard run by quarterback Derek Thomas. West countered late in the second quar9-7 even though the Cougars owned an 196-87 edge in total yards at the break.

Thomas also contributed 15 completions in 22 attempts for 140 yards to the Kennedy at-

CEDAR RAPIDS - You can throw all these fancy, shmancy sentences together to describe how Cedar Rapids Xavier was able to win its football game last night. But all you really need are these two numbers:

About midway through the second quarter at Saints Field, Xavier had 162 total yards and Hempstead had, you guessed it, 0. That dominating performance allowed the Saints to build a 23-0 halftime lead en route to a 23-6 victory.

"Xavier played great in the first half and put us away," said Hempstead Coach Mark Ehlers, whose team dropped to 4-3. "They're a very good football team, and we've got to get better. It's as simple as that."

Yeah, sometimes football isn't too complicated. The team that wins the battle upfront, the war in the trenches, however you want to say it, has a better chance to win.

Xavier (5-2) won the yardage battle by a 327-177 count and outrushed the Mississippi Valley Conference's top rushing team by a 270-105 advantage.
