News correspondent IOWA CITY — Cedar Rapids Kennedy and Iowa City West missed chance after chance to put the other away. The Cougars just held their ground longer

Kennedy's Royce Bell ran for a 4-yard touchdown in overtime and Kennedy defeated West. 23-17, last night at Trojan

Bell gained 143 of his 176 yards in the second half and ran for a pair of touchdowns as the Cougars pulled out a victory after West blocked a would-be game-winning field goal to end regula-

"He carried them tonight," Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis said of Bell. "It all starts up front.

The Cougars (2-1) drove 60 yards in the final 1:25 of the fourth quarter to set up a 37-yard field goal for Erik Boyer, but the Trojans blocked the

Kennedy had blocked West kicker Alex Troester's 40-yard attempt before starting that possession.

Both kickers had missed field goals in the second half, and the Cougars also fumbled the ball away on West High's 6-yard line early in the fourth quarter.

The Trojans (1-2)

missed a 24-yard field goal team's kicking games in the first possession of overtime.

"Tonight it was there for the taking," West High Coach Brian Sauser said. We just didn't finish."

Kennedy jumped to an early 10-0 lead in the first quarter but trailed 17-10 at halftime. Bell's first touchdown tied it in the third quarter before both struggled in the final five minutes.

Kennedy's Joshua Simmons, who rushed for 125 yards on just 11 carries, ran for a 74-yard touchdown on the game's second play, and the Trojans fumbled twice and were intercepted in three of their first four plays to give the Cougars two

quick scores.

West scored on touchdown runs by quarterback Charles Rogers and running back Jamal Thompson and converted a late fumble into a 41yard field goal from Troester to end the first half.

Thompson finished with 162 rushing yards and Rogers added 101
