

## Thompson shines on long night at West

City High back rambles for 284 yards in a 41-21 victory

IOWA CITY — Ronald Thompson almost singlehandedly won the Battle for the Boot for Iowa City

Thompson, a 6-foot, 202-pound junior running back, rushed for 284 yards and scored five touchdowns to lift the Little Hawks to a 41-21 win against crosstown rival Iowa City West last night at West High Field.

No. 3-ranked Iowa City High (3-0) has won seven

straight in the series. Iowa City West's record dipped to 1-2.

Thompson rushed for 194 yards and four scores on 17 carries in the first half to carry the Little Hawks to a 28-7 halftime lead. He scored on runs of 1, 9, 25 and 6 yards. Only four of his first-half rushing attempts were less than 9 yards.

The game started two hours late after lightning forced fans and players off the field. The game didn't end until 11:45.


West opened the second half by stopping the Little Hawks and forcing a punt. The Trojans then rolled down the field in

six plays, converted a fourth-and-3 and finished the drive with a 21-yard TD pass from quarterback Charles Rogers to dondre Alexander to cut Iowa City High's lead to 14 points.

But one possession later, Iowa City High quarterback Andrew McNulty rushed 72 yards untouched for a score to put the Little Hawks back
