Kennedy winless no more

CEDAR RAPIDS — The start of the prep football season has come with a bit of frustration for Cedar Rapids Kennedy.

The Cougars were winless entering the fourth week but worked out those frustrations, better yet pounded out those frustrations on Dubuque Senior.

The Cougars suffocated the Rams' offense and battering them on both sides of the ball for a lopsided 46-0 Mississippi Valley Conference victory last night at Kingston Stadium.

The Cougars' (1-3) first three opponents entered last night with a combined 9-0 record. They proved they weren't a typical 0-3 team, pounding out nearly 400 rushing yards and holding Senior

to 20 yards of offense.

"We knew we were a good team," Kennedy junior Trevor Heitland said. "We didn't think we needed to prove anything, but it's nice to get the win. We knew we were better than what we were playing lately."

The Cougars didn't allow a single first down, holding the Rams to minus-4 yards on the ground and minus-2 total at half-time. Senior (0-4) rushed 19 times but managed only 18 yards.

"We knew we had to play to our ability and not theirs," Cougars linebacker Justin Sanford said. "That's what we did and felt pretty proud about it. Just play physical football. Play harder and stronger, tougher and faster than them up front. Just try to play more superior than they were."

The Cougars' worst starting field position was their own 44, except for a

touchback on the opening kickoff of the second half, starting in Senior territory five times.

Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis said he saw improvement the last week that resulted in a close loss to Cedar Rapids Washington, which actually served as a bit of a springboard, especially defensively.

"A shutout and no first downs. It's pretty hard to beat that," Lewis said.

Kennedy wasted little time, taking the opening drive 55 yards capped by quarterback Jed Haycraft's sneak from a yard out for a 7-0 lead. Two possessions later, running back R.J. Adams ran around the left end, breaking a couple tackles on a 17-yard run to put the Cougars up, 14-0

Indians roll past Anamosa, 44-0

ANAMOSA — It had been a week of celebration leading up to a homecoming clash with Marion for the Anamosa football players and fans. But when it came down to celebrating on the field, that belonged to the visiting Indians with a convincing 44-0 romp over the Raiders.

"It took us a while before we had our heads in this game though," said Marion Coach Tony Perkins. "Anamosa did a lot of nice things defensively and we just seemed out of sync pretty much the whole first half."

The first quarter went without a touchdown as the only points came on a Curran Lippsett 25-yard field goal with just 7.6 seconds remaining for the Indians.

Marion began warming up the offense a bit in the second quarter when Colton Storla and Jake McDonald had touchdown runs that

handed the visitors an 18-0 halftime advantage.

"We were playing with some passion on the defensive side and making plays," said Raider Coach Derek Roberts. "Being down 18-0 still had us right in this game, but then things just got completely out of hand in the third quarter."

The Indians received a wake-up call from Perkins at the half and came out with a renewed fire, scoring 26 points in the frame to blow the game wide open.

"We had a little talk at the half with the kids and made some adjustments, and it seemed to work," Perkins said. "We knew we had to come here and bring our A game. Anamosa always plays tough and Coach Roberts had his team ready."

Marion's defense was dominant, holding Anamosa to just 64 yards. The Indians rolled up 394.

Regina rips Tipton with first-quarter onslaught

IOWA CITY — Forget about grabbing popcorn. Blink and you could miss a touchdown.

Class 2A top-ranked Iowa City Regina jumped all over Tipton with a 35-point first quarter and then coasted to a 58-0 win last night at Regina Stadium. Regina's Zach Pechous returned yet another punt for a touchdown and the Regals produced four scores in drives of three plays or less.

"We thought if we came in and took care of business we'd be all right," Regina Coach Marv Cook said. "We did that tonight."

Regina (4-0, 2-0 2A-5) simply had too much speed for Tipton, which gained only 41 yards in the first half and struggled on defense to contain plays from bouncing outside.

The highlight of the night came from Pechous — but it wasn't the return. Midway through the

first quarter, the senior caught a pass from Jack Verducci near Tipton's 35-yard line, came to a complete stop to bypass a defender and then looped around to the near sideline for a 57-yard touchdown.

Pechous' 53-yard punt return came in the final minute of the first quarter. He's returned two punts and one kickoff for scores this season.

After grinding out the first touchdown, Regina scored on drives of three, one, two and three plays.

"Ultimately with the players we have, hopefully we can keep that up," Cook said.

Running back Anthony Halsch rushed for 129 yards and two TDs. Verducci, who played less than a quarter and a half, threw for 79 yards on only five attempts, including a 9-yard touchdown on a wide receiver screen pass to Daniel Larew.

Tipton (1-3, 0-2) lost two fumbles and threw two interceptions.
