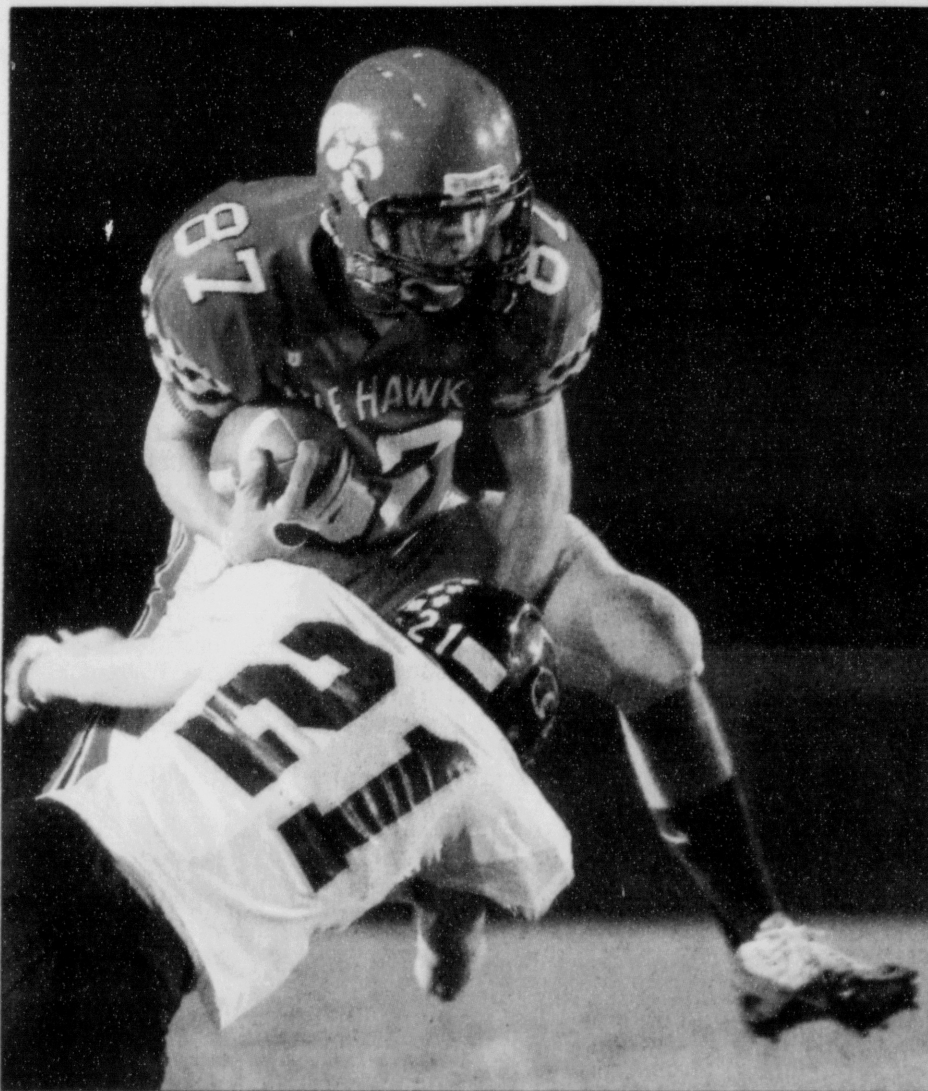

City wary of Kennedy but makes it 5 straight

IOWA CITY — Last night could have been a potential letdown for the Iowa City High football team.

It welcomed Cedar Rapids Kennedy one week after toppling an undefeated ranked foe and one week before another showdown with an unbeaten opponent in Class 4A's top 10.

The third-ranked Little Hawks weren't caught off guard at all, handling the Cougars, 21-0, in a Mississippi Valley Conference football game at Bates Field.

City High improved to 5-0 and extended its winning streak to 19 games.

"I was very concerned because Kennedy has a very good ballclub," City High Coach Dan Sabers said. "They played a brutal schedule so far. We know they have good people out there."

Senior quarterback Andrew McNulty said the Cougars are always tough to play, especially between and Xavier last week and Cedar Rapids Washington next Thursday at Kingston Stadium.

"Next week we have a big one," McNulty said. "Last week was obviously a huge game, but this

game was nothing look over."

The Little Hawks pounced on a pair of Kennedy miscues in the first half to take control. After Kennedy stopped City High's first two drives with a Jacob Losch interception in the red zone and a punt, the Little Hawks recovered a fumble by Kennedy quarterback Jed Haycraft on the Kennedy 13. Ronald Thompson ran in from 3 yards out four plays later to put City High up 7-0.

"We came out with a lot of intensity and we came out ready to go," McNulty said. "Our defense did a great job

tonight."

Kennedy missed a 39-yard field goal that was followed by a 16-play, 80-yard drive to make it 14-0. Bobby Millard rushed for the last 22 yards, including a 3-yard TD run off right tackle when he shed a tackler and skipped into the end zone.

McNulty was 3-for-6 passing for 37 yards and rushed for 40 yards, reaching the end zone on a 13-yard run. McNulty finished with 117 yards passing and 109 yards on the ground.

Thompson added 81 rushing yards.

West quarterback displays his skills in stroll past Jeff

IOWA CITY — Some plays, Iowa City West quarterback Charles Rogers looks raw and unpolished, floating an interception under little pressure or taking two third-down sacks.

On others, the junior dazzles — completing six-straight passes and putting incredible touch on a pass in the back of the end zone — and demonstrates why big-time college football programs are showing interest.

Rogers racked up 291 total yards and three touchdowns in a 45-16 win over Cedar Rapids Jefferson last night at Trojan Field.

"My expectations are so high for him," West coach Brian Sauser said. "I believe in his abilities. When he gets out on those sprint outs, he throws the ball really well."

Rogers' first pass attempt was picked off and he was sacked three times in the first half, but he completed 13 of 19 passes for 233 yards.

The most impressive throw came in the fourth quarter. After a pump fake, Rogers stayed calm in the pocket to wait for an open receiver then lofted a 23-yard pass to Brady Carter at the back of the end zone.

"I didn't throw the

ball well tonight," Rogers said. "I came out a little sloppy and bounced back."

Recruiting analysts believe Rogers, who has an offer from Iowa State, could translate to wide receiver or defensive back at the next level. But don't rule out his current position, either.

"He's a better passer than I think people give him credit for being," said Tom Kakert, a publisher in the Rivals.com recruiting network. "And he can certainly make a lot of plays with his speed and quickness."

If Rogers hits the camp and combine circuit and performs well in front of coaches and evaluators during the offseason, his stock could surge — similar to Cedar Rapids Kennedy's Christian French, Kakert said.

West (3-2) intercepted four passes, including a 37-yard return from Ian McBrearty and 24-yard yard return from Ryan Stewart for touchdowns.

Jefferson (0-5) converted an interception into a 32-yard field goal for a 3-0 lead late in the first quarter. The J-Hawks then pinned West down to its own 1-yard line on ensuing drive, but the Trojans were in the end zone three plays later to start a string of 45 unanswered points.

of an attempted wide-receiver screen from Xavier quarterback Andy Didio and running the interception back 32 yards for a first-quarter score. That was the first of four interceptions and two lost fumbles.

On the first play after a long second-quarter punt return gave Xavier first down at the CF 37, leading rusher Pat Chizek was met immediately after taking a pitch by CF line-backer Ben Chailgren and fumbled. Just one of those nights.

Chizek finished with only 56 yards rushing on 22 carries. Xavier trav-

eled deep into CF territory twice in the second half but had a 27-yard field-goal attempt blocked and a fourth-down fumble on a quarterback sack.

Hill added insult to injury on CF's first possession of the second half, taking the second play from scrimmage 55 yards up the middle and to the house. Xavier turned to the pass a lot after half-time, with Didio completing 14 of 22 throws for 170 yards.

Xavier averted the shutout with two minutes to go when Didio hooked up with wide receiver James Stabile for a 35-yard touchdown pass.
