

Gatens, Iowa's leading scorer a year ago, tore a tendon in his left, non-shooting hand and will have surgery today.





Turnovers key in Cougars' 11-7 upset of No. 8 Xavier

The Gazette CEDAR RAPIDS - Turns out, Tim Lewis was right.

It really is a different team. Trevor Heitland scored on a 4-yard touchdown run with 1:11 remaining, and Cedar Rapids Kennedy collected six takeaways in an 11-7 upset of No. 8 Cedar Rapids Xavier in a Class 4A firstround playoff football game last

night at Saints Field. We played unbelievable defense," said Lewis, the Cougars' head coach, after departing from

a jubilant visitor's locker room. "We got to this point, and we knew defense was going to win for us. We just wanted to score enough points to win the game."

Kennedy (6-4) won its fifth consecutive game and advanced to face North Scott (9-1) Monday at Eldridge. The Cougars advanced by avenging a 35-7 loss in Week 1 to the Saints.

'The difference between that team and this team is the way we hustle defensively," Lewis said.

Surge in 2nd half for City

IOWA CITY — Dan Sabers didn't make a big speech at halftime. The way it worked out, he

certainly didn't need to. Leading by just a point at the break, No. 2 lowa City High exploded with a 28-point third quarter behind three forced turnovers and another potent rushing effort in a 49-13 win over Davenport Central last night in a first-round playoff game at Bates Field.

"We knew we had to come out with fire," quarterback Andrew McNulty said of the second half.

The Class 4A defending state champion Little Hawks (10-0) will face Linn-Mar in the second round next Monday.

Leading 14-13 to start the third quarter, City High made a defensive stop, intercepted a pass and recovered two fumbles before nine minutes went off the clock. The one-point lead turned into a 42-13 advantage before the fourth quarter and extended the school's winning streak to 24 games.

"I feel like we made some plays, but obviously they helped us," Sabers said.

The Little Hawks stopped Central's opening drive of the second half on downs — a key for Sabers, who thought his team had a chance to really turn the momentum there. City High's Cedric Raedus ran for a 4-vard touchdown




