Xavier's win one for the books

CEDAR RAPIDS — Duane Schulte scripted the first play: Get the ball to the new guy.
“We wanted to give Brendan (Miller) the ball, and get that first hit out of the way,” Schulte said.
There was a catch: Miller didn't get hit.
Miller took his first carry as a starter 64 yards for a touchdown, triggering an offensive performance for the record books as Class 4A seventh-ranked Cedar Rapids Xavier trounced Dubuque Wahlert, 53-14, in a Mississippi Valley

Conference Valley Division football game last night at Saints Field.
The Saints (4-0 overall, 2-0 division) set a school record for points, and another for yards (589). Everything the Saints did, turned to gold. Or silver, if you will.
Miller, who became the featured back after Cal Stovie suffered a torn ACL in last week's win over Cedar Rapids Prairie, rushed for 226 yards on 17 carries.
“I feel bad for Cal,” Miller said. “He's been helping me a lot this week, telling me some secrets on being a good

running back.”
Reggie Schulte completed 11 of 14 passes for 242 yards — including six balls to Corbin Woods for 172 yards.
Big numbers. Big, big numbers.
Xavier accumulated 419 yards in the first half alone before taking the foot off the proverbial gas somewhat after intermission.
After forcing Wahlert (1-3, 0-1) into a three-and-out on the first possession of the game, the Saints took over a their own 36 yard line.
Miller took a handoff, made a move, and was

gone. It was that kind of night.
Xavier scored on its first six drives of the game and led, 43-14, at halftime.
Miller broke loose on Xavier's first play from scrimmage, and Reggie Schulte connected with Woods on an 85-yard bomb down the middle of the field on the second.
“We did a lot of good things, but there's still a lot of room for improvement,” Reggie Schulte said. “We left some plays on the field.”
But not much.

Lavela's punishing runs put Jeff in loss column

CEDAR RAPIDS — Iowa City High wasn't about to let Cedar Rapids Jefferson build on its success of last week.
The J-Hawks ended a 24-game losing streak with a 12-7 win in Week 3 at Dubuque Hempstead, but they weren't able to put up much resistance against the Little Hawks and punishing tailback Amos Lavela. City High moved to 3-1 overall (2-0 Mississippi Division) with a convincing 38-0 win last night at Kingston Stadium.

Jefferson (1-3, 1-1) was able to slow Lavela at times, but when the 5-foot-8, 202-pound senior needed a big run to keep drives alive, he was able to break away from J-Hawk defenders. He broke three tackles en route to a 57-yard score early in the first quarter.
His 3-yard run midway through the second quarter capped a City High drive that was over seven minutes in duration. The Little Hawks converted twice on fourth-and-short situations to keep the drive going.
Lavela capped his sterling first half with a punishing 21-yard run with

14-0 lead. The Trojans got the ball back less than two minutes later. This time Reiners threw a 60-yard touchdown pass to Morgan.
Reiners' best effort came in the second half. Reiners rushed for 123 yards in the half, including a dazzling 43-yard touchdown scamper where he ran through at least five tacklers and somehow managed to stay on his feet.
The Trojans are known for the flashy passes and outside speed. Reiners adds a new element.
“We're working our butts off not to be a finesse team,” Sausser said.
Prairie (2-2) mustered only 52 yards and three

first downs in the first half before tallying four scores in the second half.
DeMetrius Harper returned the opening kickoff of the second half 94 yards for a touchdown to put the Hawks on the board.
Prairie quarterback Jace Hanna did not play after missing most of the second half last week against Cedar Rapids Xavier because of an ailing left ankle. Trey Beckmann and Dylan Kuchemann split snaps for the Hawks.
Prairie's Jarred Edmonds caught touchdown passes for 24 and 74 yards. Harper added a 68-yard touchdown reception in the fourth.

Washington/Warriors return opening kick

JoJo McBride had an electrifying 97-yard return for touchdown on the opening kickoff for Washington, but Linn-Mar responded with a 70-yard drive to tie it up at 7-7. Receiver Matt Meier made the two biggest plays of the nine-play march, a 22-yard catch of a Davis pass on 3rd-and-5 at the Linn-Mar 35 and a 31-yard reverse run that took the ball inside the Washington 5.
Davis fittingly hit Meier on a slot-out pattern for the TD.
Linn-Mar's defense held Washington without a first down in the initial quarter, taking running back Mitch Bredeson out

of the game and harassing Blades with a plethora of blitzes.
The Warriors were mistake prone (a season-long pattern), committing six first-half penalties for 59 yards, and having a high center snap disrupting a 43-yard Ajram field-goal attempt in the second quarter.
Linn-Mar took the lead early in the second after pinning down Wash at its own 3 and forcing a punt. A 26-yard halfback pass from Lembeck to Meier took the ball to the Washington 2, where Davis sneaked over for the score.
Davis ran for 57 yards and threw for 94.
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Physical Senior keeps Cougars winless

While Dubuque Senior took a big step toward securing just the second playoff berth in school history, the Rams' physical play dealt a blow to Cedar Rapids Kennedy's hopes.
Senior quarterback Austin Clemens completed 18 of 25 passes for 227 yards and running back Parker Hammel rushed for 79 yards and two touchdowns in place of injured starter Alex Duster, and the Rams got past the Cougars, 21-14, last night at the University of Dubuque's Chalmers Field.
Kennedy Coach Tim Lewis said Senior's physical play was a big reason for the victory. Alex

Hillyer ran for 87 yards on 21 carries and scored a third-quarter touchdown, but the Cougars fell to 0-4 overall, 0-1 in the MVC Mississippi Division.
“A lack of physicality,” Lewis said.
“They were a lot more physical than I thought they were just from watching video. The kids didn't step up to it.”
SPRINGVILLE 49, LANSING KEE 48 (OT) — Elias Nissen totaled 56 yards on 11 carries and caught six passes for 85 yards and a total of three touchdowns for the Orioles (4-0, 3-0 8-Player District 4) in an overtime win at Lansing. Sam Scriver threw for 138 yards and three

touchdowns and ran for another.
NORTH-LINN 18, POSTVILLE 8 — Kyler Burkey rushed for 118 yards on 15 carries and Brendan Schott picked up 107 yards on 22 carries to lead host North-Linn (2-2) over Postville (1-3) at Troy Mills.
Jon Wolff kicked two 35-yard field goals and added a 60-yard interception return for a touchdown for the Lynx.
CLAYTON RIDGE 10, ALBURNETT 0 — Colten Rastetter connected on a 15-yard field goal and Kris Ihde added a 3-yard touchdown run for Clayton Ridge (2-2) at Guttenberg.
