It was Ram senior running back Alex Duster, who did the cleaning, as he picked up 114 yards on 34 carries and two scores. Parker Hammel also scored, going in from 24 yards out late in the game.

Cougars find victory column in a big way

Kennedy gets first win with rout of Jefferson

CEDAR RAPIDS — You all can relax now, Cedar Rapids Kennedy football fans. Your boys have won a game.

Actually, your boys and coaching staff can take a deep breath, too, after a 44-0 shellacking last night of Cedar Rapids Jefferson at Kingston Stadium.

No one, whether you're a fan of the green and gold or not, envisioned the Cougars (1-5) going winless until Week 6. But a tough schedule and simply not playing well enough combined for this unexpected oh-fer.

Jefferson (1-5) was unfortunate enough to be on the receiving end of a season's worth of Cougar frustration. And, make no mistake, this was a severe beatdown.

Kennedy held a 24-0 lead at halftime, outgaining the J-Hawks 233-1 in the first half. Jefferson didn't get its initial first down until there was a little more than five minutes left in the third quarter on a 12-yard pass from quarterback Layne Sullivan to Peter Watson.

Naturally, Watson got injured on the play.

Alex Hillyer had 163 yards rushing and three touchdowns for Kennedy, including 115 and two, respectively, in the first half. Wide receiver Patrick Martin, who didn't go out until three weeks ago, had a 45-yard TD reception from quarterback Riley Fergus.

Fergus threw a pair of touchdown passes, including a 10-yarder early in the fourth to Miles Moa that got a continuous clock rolling. Then there

Senior's junior quarterback Austin Clemens, who was firing on all cylinders, completing 11 of 14 passes for 103 yards.

Turnovers plagued the Little Hawks, who fell to 4-2, as they prepare for rival Iowa City West, in the Battle for the Boot next week. Quarterback Tyler Stika was picked off three times. Three lost fumbles also hurt their effort.

"That's too many," City High Coach Dan Sabers said. "You can't win a game with six turn-

overs, just can't do it."

Amos Lavela led the Little Hawks with 104 yards on 25 carries. Stika finished the game 3 of 11 for 18 yards with the three interceptions.

The early going was all City High, which controlled the ball for more than seven minutes in the first quarter, driving to the Senior 17-yard line before fumbling.

That was a huge momentum-changer, according to Sabers.

"We were playing pret-

ty well to that point. That fumble took the wind out of our sails, and it really built up the Senior kids. It was a shot in the arm for them."

In the second quarter Duster got his first score on a 1-yard plunge, which came after a short City High punt. His second came in the third quarter when he scampered 23 yards on a fourth down-and-1.

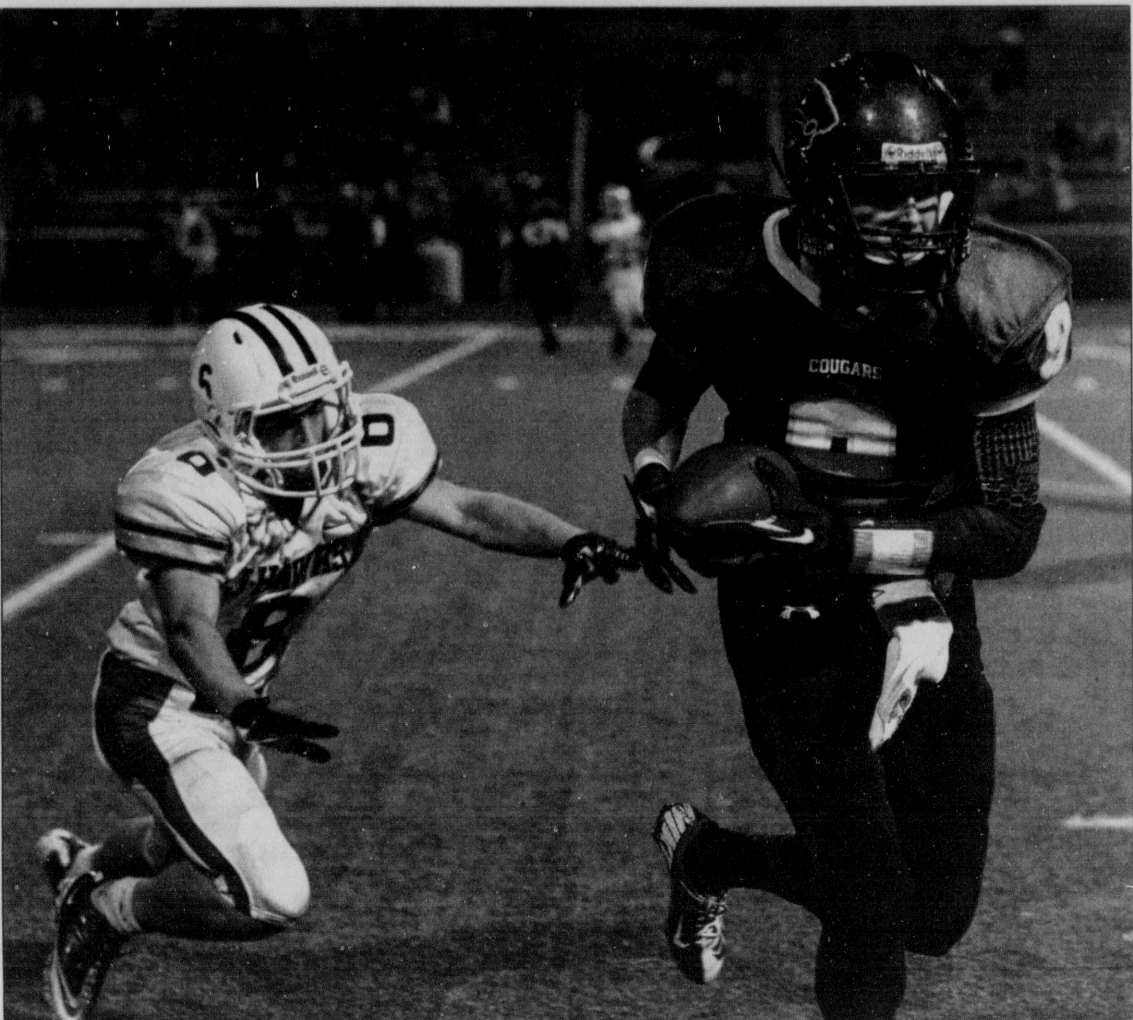
"He is a nice back and did a great job for them," Sabers said. "I'm sure

with the amount of carries he had, he will be sore tomorrow."

Sabers said this is one of the best teams that Senior has had in some time.

"They are a good football team. They played hard, were very physical and hitting all over the place. Tonight the better team won, they deserved it. You have to give them credit for playing a great game."

With the win, Senior moves to 5-1.

He concluded a drive with 2-yard scoring keeper to put Prairie in front, then unloaded a 93-yard bomb to Jarred Edmonds. His 7-yard TD pass to Demetrius Harper with 19 seconds left made it 28-7.

The fourth TD was made possible when Edmonds converted fourth-and-1 by sprinting 2 yards on a fake punt.
