

Pitcher Lance Lynn's toss on a possible force out deflected off the second-base bag, paving the way for the Giants' four-run fourth.


Pablo Sandoval homered for the second straight night and Zito made an extremely rare offensive contribution with a perfectly executed bunt for an RBI single.

The Giants have never won a postseason series when down 3-1.



IOWA CITY — Cedar Rapids Kennedy continues to surge. Iowa City High continues to slump.


Kennedy capitalized on two early turnovers and rolled past City High, 40-14, in a Mississippi Vallev Conference Mississippi Division football game last night
