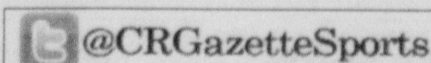
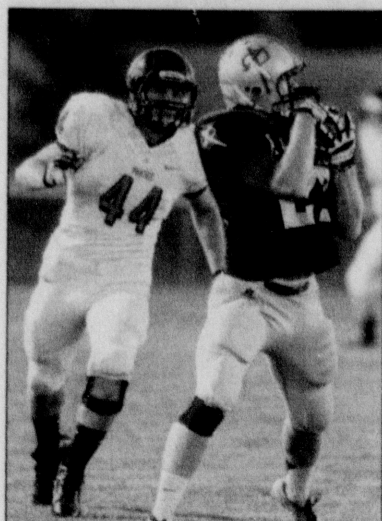

## Lickety-split, Regina takes charge

IOWA CITY — Less than a second.

Iowa City Regina didn't even use a full tick on the game clock to break open a tight contest.

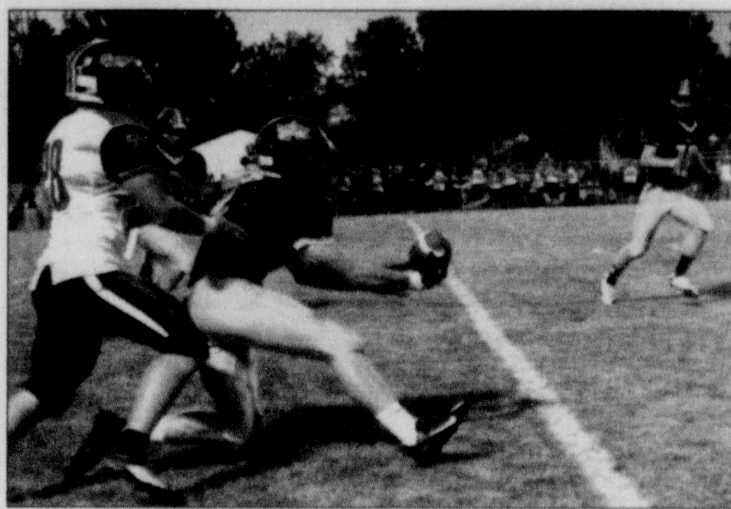
The top-ranked Regals scored two touchdowns with 0.7 seconds remaining in the first quarter and ran away with a 41-16 win over No. 9 West Branch in the Class 1A district opener last night at Regina. The Regals extended their win streak to 45 games, surpassing Ankeny (1932-38) for the state's fifth-longest.

Regina (3-0) clung to a 7-0 lead with less than a minute to play when Riley

Dixon capped a five-play, 80-yard drive with a 40-yard touchdown run. He slipped through a hole on the right side, broke a tackle and split two defenders, crossing the goal line with less than a second left in the quarter.

West Branch (2-1) fielded the ensuing kickoff and returned it about 15 yards. The ball was stripped and popped right into the arms of Regina's Adam Ries, who turned and ran 22 yards for the score with no time left.

Ries witnessed teammate Michael Adam holding up the West Branch returner



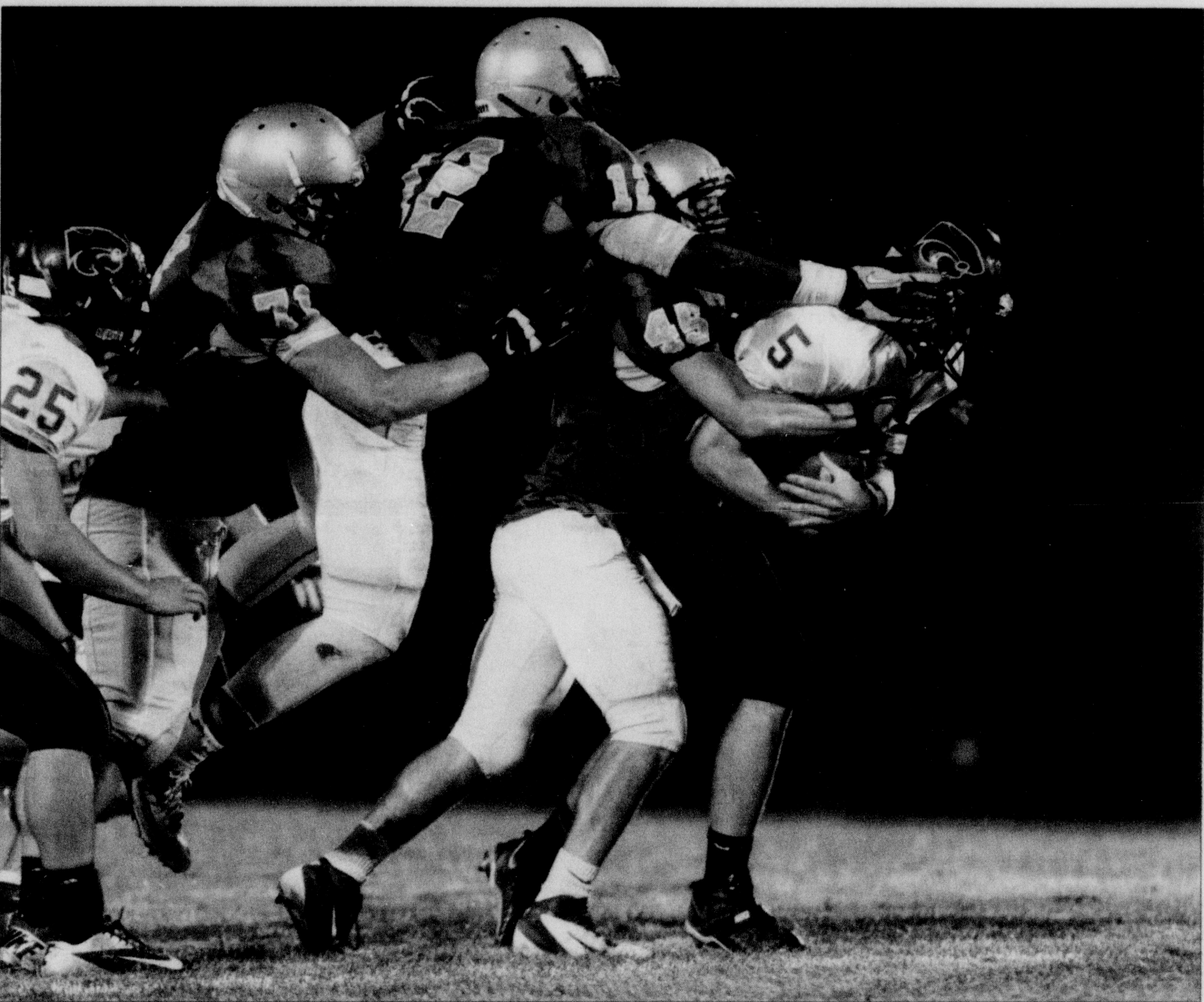

Trojans' Boland runs for 115 yards, 4 TDs in a rout of C.R. Kennedy

IOWA CITY — Ask Iowa City West quarterback Nate Boland if he prefers to throw the ball or run it and he can't help but crack a smile.

"It depends," Boland said.

"If it's open on the pass I'd like a passing touchdown, and if it's open on the run I'll certainly run it."

That's an understatement. Boland rushed for 115 yards and four touchdowns to propel the Class 4A No. 3 Trojans to a 41-14 win over Cedar Rapids Kennedy last night in a Mississippi Valley Conference football game at Trojan Field.

West (3-0) lost a fumble on

its opening drive and then nearly allowed a score on the ensuing drive. Instead, the Trojans racked up 28 unanswered points and finished with 469 yards of offense.

Kennedy (2-1) rallied from behind for wins in its first two weeks, but five turnovers and stalled drives were costly against West.

Boland, a senior with a 4.0 grade-point average, threw for 160 yards, but most of his

damage came on the ground.

Boland ripped off a 16-yard touchdown run to complete a 71-yard drive that lasted only 60 seconds to give the Trojans an early 7-0 lead.

Boland is a big reason why West's read-option attack is so tough to stop. West coach Brian Sausser said he's never had a player that was so in sync with his approach

## Jefferson's woes continue at Kingston

CEDAR RAPIDS — If Cedar Rapids Jefferson's football program is going to make any major strides, it's going to have to learn to win games on its own field. It can start with one.

Matt Zenner ran for 272 yards and two touchdowns as Dubuque Hempstead gave Jefferson yet another loss at Kingston Stadium, 21-12, last night.

Believe it or not, the J-Hawks have not won a game on this field since October 2008 against Linn-Mar.

Friday made it 24 consecutive losses at the unfriendly Kingston confines.

Zenner put this game away with a 68-yard touchdown run on third down with two minutes to go and Jefferson selling out for a needed stop. He finished with 30 carries, helping Hempstead (2-1) avenge a home loss last season that ended an overall 24-game losing streak for Jefferson (0-3).

The J-Hawks trailed late, 14-6, but got a huge interception and return from Brandon Wiederin (his second of

the game) that set them up at the Hempstead 38. A drag pass pattern from quarterback Layne Sullivan to Benjamin Koering converted a fourth down and accounted for 25 yards that took the ball to the Mustangs 8.

On third-and-goal, Sullivan took a shotgun snap and rambled over from the 2 for the TD. His two-point attempt came up short, making it 14-12.

Jefferson left several costly points on the scoreboard in the first half. The J-Hawks took the opening kickoff and drove to the

Hempstead 19, only to have Koering fumble the football away after a 6-yard gain.

The first of Wiederin interceptions stymied a Hempstead drive, then back Michael Moncivais broke loose from a pack of players in the middle of the line for a 63-yard run that gave Jeff a first-and-goal at the Mustangs 10. But three runs by Sullivan netted only six yards, and Nicholas Rocha was forced to come on for a 21-yard field goal late for the game's first points.

and ripping at the football.

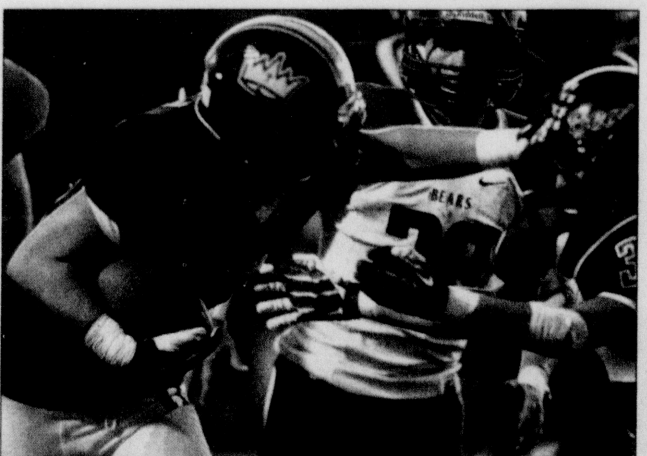
"He finally got it loose and he gave me a gift right in my lap," Ries said. "I saw nothing but green in front of me. It was just a great feeling."

Less than one second in clock time. Two scores. Three-touchdown lead.

"That sudden change is something we try to work on in practice and try to overcome," Regina Coach Marv Cook said.

A West Branch miscue began the scoring outburst 5:25 earlier. The Bears, who moved the ball well in their first and third drives only to settle for a punt and missed field goal, fumbled inside their own 30 on their second drive. Regals linebacker Justin Hunter picked up the ball and rumbled 17 yards for the first touchdown.

fun part is it's done by a group of 11 guys working together," Cook said. "That's what makes it really exciting."

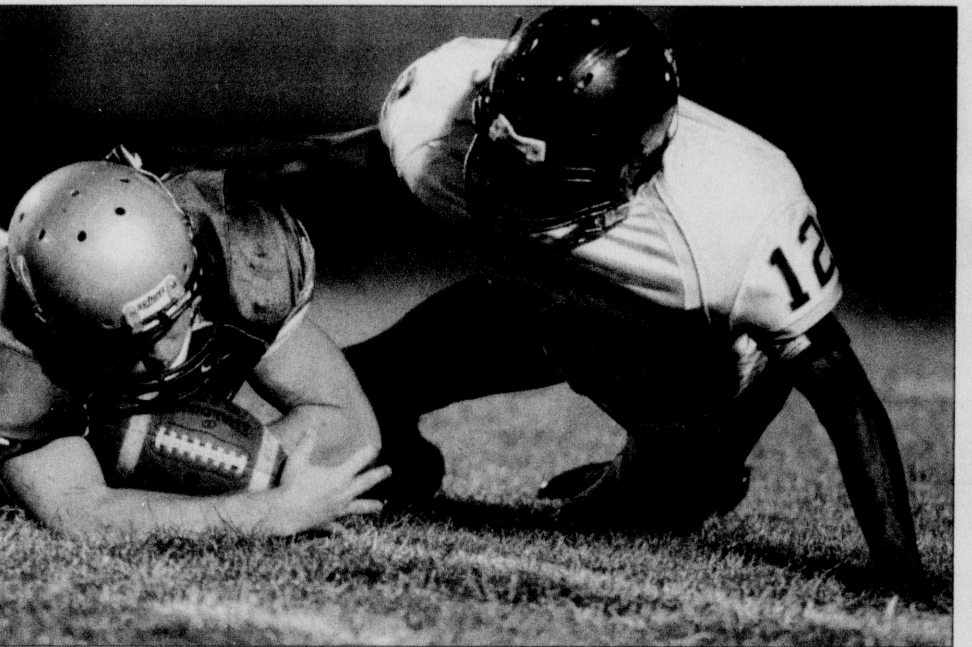

and reading opposing defenses in real-time.

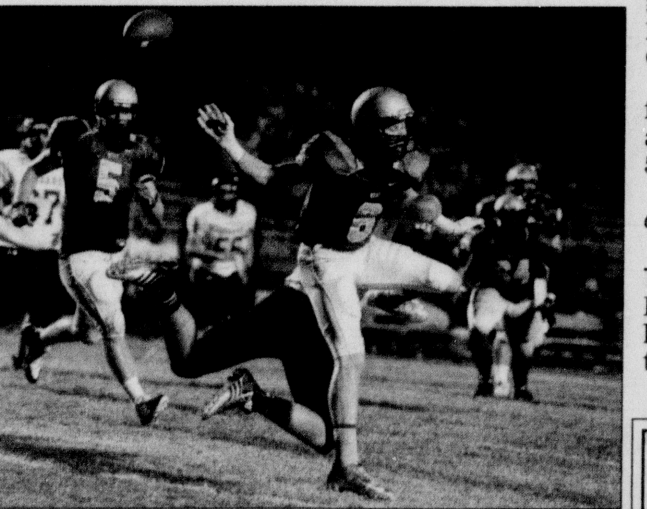
"I don't have any reservation about saying he's the best quarterback in the state of Iowa," Sauser said. "He's an underrated kid. He really understands what's going on. He's as much involved in the game plan as anyone else."

Sauser described Boland, who also added touchdown runs of 5, 26 and 1 yards, "sneaky fast" before stopping to correct himself.

"I think he's just fast," Sauser said.

Kennedy put together two impressive drives in the first half, but didn't have anything to show for it.

The Cougars turned a fumble recovery into a 72-yard drive to the West 13-yard line. But a third-and-short turned into a fourth-and-19 after false start and holding penal-

# Linn-Mar offense gets untracked in rout of West

Schmidt passes for 313 yards as Lions score 59 points in win

MARION — The Linn-Mar football team did its best Oregon impression last night, running past Waterloo West, 59-35, at Linn-Mar Stadium.

Linn-Mar (1-2) moved the football almost at will throughout the game, with the connection between quarterback Ryan Schmidt and receiver Griffin Brennecke being the most lethal.

Schmidt hit Brennecke four times for 136 yards and two scores.

Schmidt's passes weren't exclusive to Brennecke. The junior finished the game 19 of 28 for 313 yards, three touchdowns and one interception. Andrew Gassman grabbed the other touchdown pass on a 28-yard strike.

Linn-Mar's hurry-up offense frustrated the West (1-2) defense throughout the game, balancing quick passes from Schmidt and shifty runs from senior Ross Lembeck, who finished the game with 134 yards on 12 carries and four touchdowns.

West did all it could to stay in the hunt in the second half, riding running back Alexander Young to the tune of 25 carries for 235 yards, 120 of which came in the first half, and four touchdowns.

West got the score as close as 49-27 in the third quarter, but the Lions answered, effectively putting the game away on a 47-yard touchdown from Lembeck.
